AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of October 31, 2006 (P.L.1210, No.133),
- entitled "An act prohibiting price gouging; and imposing
- penalties," further providing for definitions and prohibiting
- 4 petroleum product price gouging.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 3 of the act of October 31, 2006
- 8 (P.L.1210, No.133), known as the Price Gouging Act, is amended
- 9 by adding definitions to read:
- 10 Section 3. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 * * *
- 15 "Market emergency." An abnormal disruption of a market for
- 16 petroleum products, including an actual or threatened shortage
- 17 in the supply of petroleum products or an actual or threatened

- 1 <u>increase in the price of petroleum products resulting from</u>
- 2 <u>severe weather</u>, convulsion of nature, supply manipulation,
- 3 failure or shortage of electric power or other source of energy,
- 4 strike, civil disorder, act of war, terrorist attack, national
- 5 or local emergency or other extraordinary adverse circumstances.
- 6 <u>"Petroleum product." A motor fuel, liquefied petroleum gas</u>
- 7 or fuel oil.
- 8 <u>"Petroleum-related business." A producer, supplier,</u>
- 9 wholesaler, distributor or retail seller of a petroleum product.
- 10 * * *
- 11 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 4.1. Petroleum product price gouging.</u>
- 13 <u>(a) Prohibition.--It shall be a violation of this act for a</u>
- 14 petroleum-related business to alter the price of a petroleum
- 15 product or derivatives of a petroleum product more than once
- 16 within a 24-hour period.
- 17 (b) Market emergency. -- A market emergency may be declared by
- 18 the Governor and shall continue for 30 days or until terminated
- 19 by the Governor. The Governor may extend the market emergency
- 20 for additional 30-day periods.
- 21 (c) Violation of market emergency. -- It shall be an unfair
- 22 and deceptive act and practice in commerce and a violation of
- 23 this act for a petroleum-related business, during a market
- 24 <u>emergency or seven days prior to a market emergency, to sell or</u>
- 25 offer to sell a petroleum product or heating fuel product for an
- 26 amount that represents an unconscionably excessive price. For
- 27 the purposes of this subsection, an unconscionably excessive
- 28 price includes the price at which the same or similar petroleum
- 29 product is readily obtainable by the buyer and other buyers in
- 30 the trade area in which the petroleum-related business markets

- 1 the product and the disparity is not substantially attributable
- 2 to increased prices charged by the petroleum product suppliers
- 3 or increased costs due to a market emergency.
- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
