AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in special stops required, further providing for 2 obedience to signal indicating approach of train, for 3 vehicles required to stop at railroad crossings and for 4 moving heavy equipment at railroad grade crossings. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. Sections 3341(a), 3342(a) and (g) and 3343(c) and 9 (d) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are 10 amended to read: 11 § 3341. Obedience to signal indicating approach of train. 12 General rule. -- Whenever any person driving a vehicle (a) 13 approaches a railroad grade crossing under any of the circumstances stated in this section, the driver of the vehicle 14 15 shall stop within 50 feet but not less than 15 feet from the 16 nearest rail of the railroad and shall not proceed until it can 17 be done safely. The foregoing requirements shall apply upon the 18 occurrence of any of the following circumstances: 19 (1)A clearly visible electric or mechanical signal 20 device gives warning of the immediate approach of a railroad

1 train <u>or other on-track equipment</u>.

2 (2) A crossing gate is lowered or a flagman gives or
3 continues to give a signal of the approach or passage of a
4 railroad train <u>or other on-track equipment</u>.

5 (3) A railroad train <u>or other on-track equipment</u> 6 approaching within approximately 1,500 feet of the highway 7 crossing emits a signal audible from that distance and the 8 railroad train <u>or other on-track equipment</u>, by reason of its 9 speed or nearness to the crossing, is a hazard.

10 (4) An approaching railroad train <u>or other on-track</u>
 11 <u>equipment</u> is plainly visible and is in hazardous proximity to
 12 the crossing.

14 § 3342. Vehicles required to stop at railroad crossings.

15 (a) General rule.--Except as provided in subsection (c), the 16 driver of any vehicle described in subsection (b), before crossing at grade any track or tracks of a railroad, shall stop 17 18 the vehicle within 50 feet but not less than 15 feet from the 19 nearest rail of the railroad crossing and while so stopped shall 20 listen and look in both directions along the track for any approaching train or other on-track equipment, and for signals 21 indicating the approach of a train or other on-track equipment. 22 23 When it is safe to do so, the driver of the vehicle shall drive 24 the vehicle across the tracks only in such gear of the vehicle 25 that there will be no necessity for manually changing gears 26 while traversing the crossing. The driver shall not manually 27 shift gears while crossing the track or tracks.

(g) Requirement upon approaching tracks.--Upon approachingany track of a railroad, the driver of every commercial motor

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vehicle as defined by section 1603 (relating to definitions)
 other than those listed in subsection (b) shall:

3 (1) reduce the rate of speed of the commercial motor
4 vehicle and check that the tracks are free of approaching
5 trains <u>or other on-track equipment</u>; and

6 (2) stop the vehicle if the tracks are not clear. 7 * * *

8 § 3343. Moving heavy equipment at railroad grade crossings.
9 * * *

(c) Stopping at crossing.--Before making any crossing, the 10 person operating or moving the vehicle or equipment shall first 11 12 stop the vehicle or equipment not less than 15 feet nor more 13 than 50 feet from the nearest rail of the railroad and while so 14 stopped shall listen and look in both directions along the track for any approaching train or other on-track equipment and for 15 16 signals indicating the approach of a train or other on-track 17 equipment, and shall not proceed until the crossing can be made 18 safely.

(d) Movement over crossing.--No crossing shall be made when warning is given by automatic signal or crossing gates or a flagman or otherwise of the immediate approach of a railroad train <u>or other on-track equipment</u> or car. Movement over a crossing shall be under the direction of any flagman provided by the railroad.

25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
