8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 3 § 5901. Scope of chapter.
- 4 This chapter relates to the promotion of a healthy
- 5 <u>environment that protects the public from the risks of toxic</u>
- 6 herbicides by prohibiting their use on public grounds.
- 7 § 5902. Findings and declarations.
- 8 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 9 (1) As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and in an
- 10 <u>effort to avoid spreading the virus as individuals shelter in</u>
- 11 place, unprecedented numbers of residents of all ages are
- 12 <u>seeking exercise</u>, recreation and access to natural beauty in
- the public grounds throughout this Commonwealth.
- 14 (2) It is imperative that public grounds be free of
- 15 toxic substances, which have been shown in scientific studies
- to cause disease and compromise immune systems.
- 17 (3) Healthy, sustainably and organically managed soils
- increase organic nutrients and soil microorganisms, allowing
- 19 grasses and other desirable plants to out-compete other plant
- 20 species over time, ultimately resulting in a reduction of
- 21 weeds and pests.
- 22 (4) Implementation of organic land management practices
- 23 <u>affirms the right of all residents to have access to healthy</u>
- food and clean water, in addition to green space and healthy
- 25 waterways.
- 26 (5) Currently, some municipalities use synthetic
- 27 <u>herbicides throughout their public grounds.</u>
- 28 (6) Scientific studies conducted by the World Health
- 29 Organization, the National Academies of Sciences,
- 30 Engineering, and Medicine and the National Research Council

- of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and
- 2 Medicine, among others, have linked exposure to certain toxic
- 3 chemicals with asthma, cancer, developmental and learning
- 4 <u>disabilities, nerve and immune system damage, liver and</u>
- 5 kidney damage, reproductive impairment, birth defects and
- 6 <u>disruption of the endocrine system and the microbiome.</u>
- 7 § 5903. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 9 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Advisory committee." The Advisory Committee on Healthy
- 12 Outdoor Public Grounds established under section 5912 (relating
- 13 to advisory committee).
- "Commonwealth agency." As defined in 62 Pa.C.S. § 103
- 15 (relating to definitions).
- 16 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 17 "Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town,
- 18 township, home rule municipality, optional plan municipality,
- 19 optional charter municipality or similar general purpose unit of
- 20 government that may be created or authorized by statute.
- 21 "Organic land management." A problem-solving strategy that:
- 22 (1) Prioritizes the following:
- (i) A natural and organic approach to turfgrass and
- 24 landscape management.
- 25 (ii) The care of trees and shrubs without the use of
- pesticides.
- 27 (2) Mandates the use of natural and organic practices
- that promote healthy soil and plant life as a preventative
- 29 <u>measure against the onset of turf and landscape pest</u>
- 30 problems.

1	"Pesticide." As follows:
2	(1) A substance or mixture of substances intended for
3	preventing, destroying, repelling or mitigating a plant,
4	insect or fungal pest.
5	(2) The term includes a herbicide, insecticide or
6	fungicide.
7	"Public grounds." As follows:
8	(1) Publicly owned land of this Commonwealth or a
9	municipality, including any of the following:
10	(i) A park.
11	(ii) A trail.
12	(iii) Open space.
13	(iv) A lawn.
14	(v) A recreation center.
15	(vi) A playground.
16	(vii) A sports or athletic field.
17	(viii) A golf course.
18	(ix) Other real property.
19	(2) The term does not include the following:
20	(i) The interior spaces of a building.
21	(ii) A parking lot.
22	(iii) Land or other real estate that is not open for
23	use by the general public.
24	"Synthetic herbicide." As follows:
25	(1) A herbicide containing a synthetic substance,
26	including any material or agent containing a synthetic
27	substance that harms, adversely affects or kills a plant.
28	(2) The term does not include a synthetic herbicide that
29	is allowed on the National List of Allowed Substances under 7
30	U.S.C. § 6501 et seq. (Organic Foods Production Act of 1990),

- 1 <u>as published by the National Organic Standards Board in</u>
- 2 <u>accordance with 7 CFR 205.601 (relating to synthetic</u>
- 3 <u>substances allowed for use in organic crop production).</u>
- 4 <u>"Synthetic substance."</u> As follows:
- 5 (1) A substance that is formulated or manufactured by a
- 6 <u>chemical process or by a process that chemically changes a</u>
- 7 <u>substance extracted from naturally occurring plant</u>, animal or
- 8 <u>mineral sources.</u>
- 9 <u>(2) The term shall not apply to a substance created by</u>
- 10 <u>naturally occurring biological processes.</u>
- 11 SUBCHAPTER B

- 21 § 5911. Administration.
- 22 The department, in consultation and coordination with the
- 23 Department of Agriculture, the Department of Environmental
- 24 Protection and other relevant Commonwealth agencies, shall
- 25 administer the provisions of this chapter.
- 26 § 5912. Advisory committee.
- 27 <u>(a) Establishment.--The department shall establish the</u>
- 28 Advisory Committee on Healthy Outdoor Public Grounds.
- 29 (b) Composition.--The advisory committee shall consist of
- 30 individuals with knowledge and expertise in matters involving

- 1 public health, agriculture, environmental protection and
- 2 recreation.
- 3 (c) Powers and duties. -- The advisory committee shall:
- 4 (1) Consult with and provide technical assistance for
- 5 <u>Commonwealth agencies and municipalities regarding the</u>
- 6 <u>administration of this chapter.</u>
- 7 (2) Evaluate and make recommendations to the department
- 8 regarding waivers requested under section 5913(b) (relating
- 9 <u>to prohibited use of synthetic herbicides).</u>
- 10 § 5913. Prohibited use of synthetic herbicides.
- 11 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection (b), a
- 12 person may not use or apply synthetic herbicides on public
- 13 grounds.
- 14 (b) Exception. -- Upon request for a waiver by an applicant,
- 15 the department may authorize the use or application of a
- 16 synthetic herbicide on public grounds after receiving a
- 17 recommendation from the advisory committee, if the department
- 18 determines the following criteria are met regarding the use or
- 19 application:
- 20 (1) The use or application is appropriate to address an
- 21 emergency that:
- 22 (i) threatens the public health, safety or welfare
- of persons; or
- 24 (ii) involves an invasive species that threatens the
- 25 overall health of the ecosystem and is necessary after
- 26 <u>organic methods prove insufficient.</u>
- 27 (2) The applicant has carefully evaluated all
- alternative methods and materials, including nonherbicide
- 29 management tactics and nonsynthetic herbicides, and is
- 30 requesting to use the minimum amount of the least toxic and

- 1 most effective herbicide necessary.
- 2 (3) The person using or applying the synthetic herbicide
- 3 will, to the greatest extent practical, minimize the impact
- 4 <u>of the application on abutting properties.</u>
- 5 (4) The authorized use or application of the synthetic
- 6 <u>herbicide will not be detrimental to the public's health,</u>
- 7 <u>safety or welfare.</u>
- 8 (c) Application process.--
- 9 (1) The department shall develop an application process
- for a waiver under subsection (b) that addresses the criteria
- specified under subsection (b) (1), (2), (3) and (4).
- 12 (2) The application shall be posted on the publicly
- 13 <u>accessible Internet website of the department.</u>
- 14 § 5914. Advance posting of notice of anticipated pesticide use.
- 15 Each Commonwealth agency and municipality shall post signs
- 16 prominently providing notice in advance of the application of
- 17 pesticides. The following apply:
- 18 <u>(1) The notice must include:</u>
- 19 <u>(i) The date that the pesticide application will be</u>
- 20 occurring.
- 21 (ii) A contact number for questions.
- 22 (2) The signage must be posted 48 hours prior to the
- 23 pesticide application and remain for 72 hours after the
- 24 pesticide application.
- 25 § 5915. Organic land management.
- 26 (a) Development.--The Department of Environmental
- 27 Protection, in consultation with the Department of Agriculture,
- 28 shall develop an organic land management plan for the
- 29 Commonwealth, which shall be used by Commonwealth agencies and
- 30 municipalities as the method of choice to understand, prevent

- 1 and control actual and potential plants considered to be noxious
- 2 weeds.
- 3 (b) Components. -- The essential practices of organic land
- 4 management shall include:
- 5 <u>(1) Regular soil testing.</u>
- 6 (2) The addition of approved soil amendments as
- 7 necessitated by soil test results, following recommendations
- 8 by appropriate farming and agricultural associations, as
- 9 <u>determined by the Department of Environmental Protection in</u>
- 10 consultation with the Department of Agriculture.
- 11 (3) The selection of plantings using criteria of:
- 12 <u>(i) Hardiness and suitability to native conditions.</u>
- 13 <u>(ii) Drought, disease and pest resistance.</u>
- 14 <u>(iii) Ease of maintenance.</u>
- 15 (4) Modification of outdoor management practices to
- 16 comply with organic horticultural science, including
- 17 scouting, monitoring, watering, mowing, pruning, proper
- 18 spacing and mulching.
- 19 (5) The use of physical controls, including hand-weeding
- and over-seeding.
- 21 (6) The use of biological controls, including the
- 22 introduction of natural predators, and enhancement of the
- environment of a pest's natural enemies.
- 24 (7) Through observation, determining the most effective
- 25 treatment time based on pest biology and other variables,
- such as weather and local conditions.
- 27 (8) Eliminating pest habitats and conditions supportive
- of pest population increases.
- 29 § 5916. Reports on pesticide usage.
- 30 (a) Required notice. -- Beginning six months after the

- 1 effective date of this subsection, each Commonwealth agency and
- 2 municipality shall:
- 3 (1) Report and update information regarding the usage of
- 4 <u>any kind of pesticide to the department.</u>
- 5 (2) Post the information under paragraph (1) on the
- 6 publicly accessible Internet website of the Commonwealth
- 7 agency or municipality.
- 8 (b) Contents. -- Each required report and update under
- 9 <u>subsection (a) must include the following information:</u>
- 10 (1) The common name of the pesticide.
- 11 (2) The trade name of the pesticide.
- 12 (3) The registration number designated by the United
- 13 <u>States Environmental Protection Agency.</u>
- 14 (4) The amount of pesticide applied.
- 15 (5) The method of application.
- 16 (6) The location where the pesticide was applied.
- 17 (7) The square footage of area where the pesticide was
- 18 applied.
- 19 (8) The name of the person applying the pesticide.
- 20 (9) The name of the entity employing or directing the
- 21 person applying the pesticide.
- 22 (10) Whether the person applying the pesticide posted
- any notices informing the public that the pesticide was
- 24 applied.
- 25 § 5917. Rules and regulations.
- The department shall promulgate or adopt any rules or
- 27 regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this
- 28 chapter.
- 29 Section 2. The prohibition under 35 Pa.C.S. § 5913(a) shall
- 30 apply as follows:

- 1 (1) For public grounds in the nature of a golf course or 2 a sports or athletic field, the prohibition shall apply on or 3 after 36 months after the effective date of this paragraph.
 - (2) For public grounds other than a golf course or a sports or athletic field, the prohibition shall apply on or after 18 months after the effective date of this paragraph.

 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
