AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, in licensing of drivers, further providing for
- 3 learner's permits.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1505(e) introductory paragraph of Title
- 7 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the
- 8 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 9 § 1505. Learners' permits.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (e) Authorization to test for driver's license and junior
- 12 driver's license.--A person with a learner's permit is
- 13 authorized to take the examination for a regular or junior
- 14 driver's license for the class of vehicle for which a permit is
- 15 held. [Before] Except as provided under subsection (e.1), before
- 16 a person under the age of 18 years may take the examination for
- 17 a junior driver's license, including a Class M license to

- 1 operate a motorcycle, the minor must:
- 2 * * *
- 3 (e.1) Military exception for learner's permits.--For
- 4 purposes of determining compliance with subsection (e)(1) and
- 5 (2), the department shall credit the time period during which a
- 6 <u>learner's permit from another state is held and the number of</u>
- 7 hours completed of practical driving experience by a minor in
- 8 the other state, if:
- 9 (1) The minor is a family member of an active duty
- service member in the military, including a reserve component
- or National Guard.
- 12 (2) The minor resides in this Commonwealth with the
- 13 active duty service member.
- 14 (3) The minor has a valid learner's permit issued by
- another state.
- 16 (4) The department has issued a learner's permit to the
- 17 individual.

- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
