## AN ACT

12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. The act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as
15	the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended by adding an article to

20	NATURAL GAS DRILLING TAX
21	Section 1101-E. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 2 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 "Account." The Natural Gas Drilling Tax Restricted Account.
- 5 <u>"Association." A partnership, limited partnership or any</u>
- 6 other form of unincorporated enterprise owned or conducted by
- 7 <u>two or more persons.</u>
- 8 <u>"Barrel." Forty-two United States gallons at an atmospheric</u>
- 9 pressure of 231 cubic inches of liquid at a standard temperature
- 10 of 60 degrees Fahrenheit.
- "Coal bed methane." Gas which is produced from coal beds,
- 12 <u>coal seams</u>, <u>mined-out areas or gob wells</u>.
- 13 "Corporation." A corporation, joint stock association,
- 14 <u>limited liability company, business trust or any other</u>
- 15 incorporated enterprise organized under the laws of the United
- 16 States, this Commonwealth or any other state, territory or
- 17 foreign country or dependency.
- 18 "Department." The Department of Revenue of the Commonwealth.
- "Dry natural gas." Hydrocarbon gases, consisting mostly of
- 20 methane, that remain after the natural gas liquid portion of the
- 21 natural gas stream has been removed and any volume of
- 22 nonhydrocarbon gases have been removed in sufficient quantity to
- 23 <u>render the gas marketable. The term includes consumer-grade</u>
- 24 natural gas or pipeline-quality natural gas.
- 25 "Gross proceeds." The value, whether in money or other
- 26 property, actually proceeding from the sale of property, without
- 27 a deduction for the cost of property sold or expenses of any
- 28 kind.
- 29 "Gross value." The gross proceeds received or receivable for
- 30 property transferred, except as follows:

- 1 (1) In a transaction involving related parties, gross
- 2 proceeds of the property transferred may not be less than the
- 3 <u>fair market value of similar grade and quality property.</u>
- 4 (2) In the absence of a sale, gross proceeds of the
- 5 property transferred may not be less than the fair market
- 6 <u>value of similar grade and quality property.</u>
- 7 (3) In a transaction where property is transferred for
- 8 <u>the purpose of processing and resale, gross proceeds of the</u>
- 9 property transferred may not be less than the fair market
- 10 <u>value of similar grade and quality property.</u>
- 11 <u>"Meter." A device to measure the passage of volumes of gases</u>
- 12 <u>or liquids past a certain point.</u>
- 13 "Natural gas." A fossil fuel consisting of a mixture of
- 14 hydrocarbon gases, including methane, ethane, propane, butane,
- 15 carbon dioxide, oxygen, nitrogen and hydrogen sulfide and other
- 16 gas species. The term includes natural gas from oil fields known
- 17 as associated gas or casing head gas, natural gas fields known
- 18 as nonassociated gas, coal beds, shale beds and other
- 19 formations. The term does not include coal bed methane.
- 20 "Natural gas liquids." Hydrocarbons including ethane,
- 21 propane, butane, isobutane and pentane that are separated from
- 22 natural gas as liquids through the process of absorption,
- 23 condensation, adsorption, cooling in gas separators or gas
- 24 processing of cycling plants.
- 25 "Person." Includes a corporation, partnership, limited
- 26 liability company, business trust, other association, a
- 27 government entity other than the Commonwealth, estate, trust,
- 28 foundation or natural person.
- 29 <u>"Producer." A person who engages or continues within this</u>
- 30 Commonwealth in the business of severing natural gas from

- 1 <u>unconventional formations for sale, profit or commercial use.</u>
- 2 <u>"Producing site." A point of severance, including a well and</u>
- 3 its associated zones and multilateral well bores, that is
- 4 <u>capable of producing natural gas from an unconventional</u>
- 5 formation.
- 6 <u>"Related parties." Two or more people, organizations or</u>
- 7 <u>businesses</u> owned or controlled directly or indirectly by the
- 8 same interests. Control exists if a contract or lease, either
- 9 written or oral, is entered into where one party severs or
- 10 processes natural gas owned or held by another party and the
- 11 owner or lessor participates in the severing, processing or
- 12 marketing of the natural gas or receives any value other than an
- 13 <u>arm's-length passive royalty interest.</u>
- 14 "Reporting period." A calendar month in which natural gas is
- 15 severed.
- 16 <u>"Sales meter." A meter at the point where natural gas is</u>
- 17 sold or transported to a purchaser or the market.
- 18 "Sever." The extraction or other removal of natural gas from
- 19 an unconventional formation in this Commonwealth.
- 20 "Storage field." A natural formation or other site that is
- 21 used to store natural gas that did not originate from and has
- 22 been transplanted into such formation or site.
- "Stripper well." A producing site that produced an average
- 24 of less than 50 units of natural gas per day during the calendar
- 25 year immediately preceding a reporting period.
- 26 <u>"Tax." The tax imposed under this article.</u>
- 27 <u>"Taxpayer." A person subject to the tax imposed by this</u>
- 28 article.
- 29 "Unconventional formation." A geological shale formation
- 30 existing below the base of the Elk Sandstone or its geologic

- 1 equivalent stratigraphic interval where natural gas generally
- 2 cannot be produced at economic flow rates or in economic volumes
- 3 except by vertical or horizontal well bores stimulated by
- 4 <u>hydraulic fracture treatments or using multilateral well bores</u>
- 5 or other techniques to expose more of the formation to the well\_
- 6 bore.
- 7 "Unit." A thousand cubic feet (Mcf) of natural gas at a
- 8 temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit and an absolute pressure of
- 9 14.73 pounds per square inch, in accordance with American Gas
- 10 Association (AGA) standards and according to Boyle's law for the
- 11 measurement of gas under varying pressures with deviations
- 12 therefrom as follows:
- 13 (1) The average absolute atmospheric pressure shall be
- 14 <u>assumed to be 14.4 pounds to the square inch, regardless of</u>
- 15 <u>actual elevation or location of point of delivery above sea</u>
- 16 <u>level or variations in such atmospheric pressure from time to</u>
- 17 time.
- 18 (2) The temperature of the gas passing the meters shall
- 19 be determined by the continuous use of a recording
- thermometer installed so that the thermometer may properly
- 21 record the temperature of the gas flowing through the meters.
- 22 The arithmetic average of the temperature recorded each 24-
- 23 hour day shall be used in computing gas volumes. If a
- recording thermometer is not installed, or if installed and
- 25 not operating properly, an average flowing temperature of 60
- degrees Fahrenheit shall be used in computing gas volume.
- 27 (3) The specific gravity of the gas shall be determined
- 28 by tests made by the use of an Edwards or Acme gravity
- 29 <u>balance</u>, annually, or at intervals as are found necessary in
- 30 practice. Specific gravity shall be used in computing gas

- 1 volumes.
- 2 (4) The deviation of the natural gas from Boyle's law
- 3 shall be determined by tests annually or at other shorter
- 4 <u>intervals as are found necessary in practice. The apparatus</u>
- 5 and the method to be used in making the tests shall be in
- 6 accordance with recommendations of the Natural Bureau of
- 7 <u>Standards of the Department of Commerce, or Report No. 3 of</u>
- 8 the Gas Measurement Committee of the American Gas
- 9 Association, or any amendments thereof. The results of the
- 10 tests shall be used in computing the volume of gas delivered.
- 11 <u>"Wellhead meter." A meter placed at a producing site to</u>
- 12 measure the actual volume of natural gas severed.
- 13 <u>Section 1102-E. Imposition of tax.</u>
- 14 (a) Imposition. -- There is hereby levied a privilege tax on
- 15 <u>every producer</u>.
- 16 (b) Rate. -- The tax imposed under subsection (a) shall be the
- 17 following:
- 18 (1) Three and two-tenths percent of the gross value of
- 19 <u>the dry natural gas derived from the natural gas severed as</u>
- shown by the gross proceeds derived from the sale by the
- 21 producer.
- 22 (2) Three and two-tenths percent of the gross value of
- 23 the natural gas liquids derived from the natural gas severed
- as shown by the gross proceeds derived from the sale by the
- 25 producer.
- 26 (c) Exemptions. -- The tax imposed under subsection (a) shall
- 27 <u>not be imposed upon the following:</u>
- 28 (1) Natural gas, dry natural gas or natural gas liquids
- 29 severed under a natural gas lease and provided to a lessor
- for no consideration for the lessor's own use.

- 1 (2) Natural gas, dry natural gas or natural gas liquids
- 2 <u>severed from a stripper well.</u>
- 3 (3) Natural gas, dry natural gas or natural gas liquids
- 4 <u>severed from a storage field.</u>
- 5 <u>Section 1103-E. Calculation and publication of average market</u>
- 6 price.
- 7 The department shall calculate the average market price per
- 8 <u>unit of natural gas for each calendar quarter. The average</u>
- 9 <u>market price shall be the weighted average price per unit for</u>
- 10 all major Commonwealth distribution hubs on the interstate
- 11 <u>natural gas pipeline system for the three months prior to the</u>
- 12 <u>calendar quarter. The department shall publish a notice of the</u>
- 13 <u>average market price for each calendar quarter in the</u>
- 14 Pennsylvania Bulletin not later than within 30 days of the
- 15 <u>beginning of each calendar quarter</u>.
- 16 <u>Section 1104-E. Prohibition.</u>
- 17 A producer may not make the tax imposed under section 1102-E
- 18 on natural gas severed under a natural gas lease, an obligation,
- 19 indebtedness or liability of a landowner, leaseholder or other
- 20 person in possession of real property upon which the removal or
- 21 <u>extraction occurs and shall not otherwise require the landowner</u>
- 22 to pay or reimburse the producer for the amount of the tax.
- 23 Section 1104.1-E. Existing agreements.
- 24 A provision of an agreement, which is in existence prior to
- 25 the effective date of this section, which violates section 1104-
- 26 <u>E is declared to be illegal, contrary to public policy and null</u>
- 27 and void.
- 28 <u>Section 1104.2-E. Future agreements.</u>
- 29 On or after the effective date of this section, a provision
- 30 of an agreement in violation of section 1104-E is declared to be

- 1 <u>illegal</u>, contrary to public policy and null and void.
- 2 <u>Section 1105-E. Return and payment.</u>
- 3 (a) Return.--Each producer is required to file a return with
- 4 the department, on a form to be prescribed by the department,
- 5 reporting all severed natural gas per reporting period and the
- 6 tax due as imposed under section 1102-E.
- 7 (b) Filing. -- The return required by subsection (a) must be
- 8 <u>filed with the department on or before the 20th day of the</u>
- 9 <u>fourth calendar month after a reporting period</u>.
- 10 (c) Due date. -- The tax imposed under section 1102-E is due
- 11 on the day the return is required to be filed and becomes
- 12 <u>delinquent if not remitted to the department by that date.</u>
- 13 <u>Section 1106-E. Natural gas severance tax licensing.</u>
- 14 (a) License required. -- Each producer subject to tax under
- 15 this part must apply to the department for a severance tax
- 16 <u>license before severing natural gas from this Commonwealth.</u>
- 17 Producers who have been severing natural gas from this
- 18 Commonwealth prior to the effective date of this part must
- 19 obtain a license from the department within six months from the
- 20 <u>effective date of this part. All other producers must obtain a</u>
- 21 license before severing natural gas from this Commonwealth. A
- 22 producer is liable for the tax imposed by this article without
- 23 regard to whether the producer obtains or is required to obtain
- 24 <u>a license.</u>
- 25 (b) Fee.--The department may charge an application fee to
- 26 cover the administrative costs associated with the application
- 27 and licensing process. If the department charges an application
- 28 fee, the department may not issue a license until the producer
- 29 has paid the application fee.
- 30 (c) Declaration. -- As part of the application for a license,

- 1 the producer shall provide a declaration of all sites in this
- 2 <u>Commonwealth used by the producer for the severance of natural</u>
- 3 gas. The declaration shall include all producing sites and sites
- 4 which are stripper wells. The producer shall update the
- 5 <u>declaration when the producer adds or removes a producing site</u>
- 6 in this Commonwealth or when there is a change in the status of
- 7 <u>a producing site. The producer shall update the declaration</u>
- 8 <u>within 30 days after any calendar month in which a change to the</u>
- 9 declaration occurs.
- 10 (d) Department duties. -- The department shall, after the
- 11 receipt of an application, issue the license applied for under
- 12 <u>subsection (a), if the applicant filed all required State tax</u>
- 13 reports and paid any State taxes not subject to a timely
- 14 perfected administrative or judicial appeal or subject to a duly
- 15 <u>authorized deferred payment plan. The license shall be</u>
- 16 <u>nonassignable</u>. Each producer shall be required to renew the
- 17 license on a staggered renewal system established by the
- 18 department. After the initial staggered period, a license issued
- 19 shall be valid for a period of five years.
- 20 (e) State taxes.--If an applicant for a license or a person
- 21 holding a license has not filed all required State tax reports
- 22 and paid any State taxes not subject to a timely perfected
- 23 <u>administrative or judicial appeal or subject to a duly</u>
- 24 authorized deferred payment plan, the department may refuse to
- 25 issue, suspend or revoke the license. The department shall
- 26 notify the applicant or registrant of a refusal, suspension or
- 27 <u>revocation. The notice shall contain a statement that the</u>
- 28 refusal, suspension or revocation may be made public. The notice
- 29 <u>shall be made by first class mail. An applicant or licensee</u>
- 30 aggrieved by the determination of the department may file an

- 1 appeal of the determination in the same manner as provided for
- 2 reassessments of tax under section 1108-E. In the case of a
- 3 suspension or revocation which is appealed, the license shall
- 4 remain valid pending a final outcome of the appeal.
- 5 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, if
- 6 <u>no appeal is taken or if an appeal is taken and denied at the</u>
- 7 conclusion of the appeal process, the department may disclose,
- 8 by publication or otherwise, the identity of a person and
- 9 <u>evidence that the person's license has been refused, suspended</u>
- 10 or revoked under this subsection. Disclosure may include the
- 11 <u>basis for refusal, suspension or revocation.</u>
- 12 <u>(f) Severing without a license.--A person that severs</u>
- 13 <u>natural gas in this Commonwealth without holding a valid license</u>
- 14 <u>under this section shall be guilty of a summary offense and,</u>
- 15 upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less
- 16 than \$300 nor more than \$1,500 and, in default thereof, to
- 17 undergo imprisonment of not less than five days nor more than 30
- 18 days. The penalties imposed by this subsection shall be in
- 19 addition to any other penalties imposed by law. For purposes of
- 20 this subsection, the severing of natural gas during any calendar
- 21 day shall constitute a separate violation. The Secretary of
- 22 Revenue may designate employees of the department to enforce the
- 23 provisions of this subsection. The employees shall exhibit proof
- 24 of and be within the scope of the designation when instituting
- 25 proceedings as provided by the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal
- 26 Procedure.
- 27 (g) Liability. -- Failure to obtain a license does not relieve
- 28 a person from liability for the tax imposed by this part.
- 29 (h) Civil penalty.--In addition to any tax, interest or
- 30 other penalty due under this article, the department shall

- 1 impose a civil penalty of 10¢ per unit severed during the period
- 2 a producer is required to and does not have a license. The
- 3 penalty shall be assessed and collected under this part.
- 4 <u>Section 1107-E. Meters.</u>
- 5 <u>A producer shall provide for and maintain discrete wellhead</u>
- 6 and sales meters. A producer shall ensure that all meters are
- 7 <u>maintained according to industry standards.</u>
- 8 Section 1108-E. Administration of tax.
- 9 Unless otherwise noted to the contrary, Article II, Part VI,
- 10 Chapters IV-VIII shall apply to this act.
- 11 Section 1109-E. Records.
- 12 A producer shall maintain the following records:
- 13 (1) Wellhead and sales meter charts for each reporting
- 14 <u>period and the meter calibration and maintenance records. If</u>
- turbine meters are in use, the maintenance records will be
- 16 <u>made available to the department upon request.</u>
- 17 (2) All records, statements, and other instruments
- furnished to a producer by any person to whom the producer
- 19 delivers for sale, transport or other delivery of any natural
- 20 gas.
- 21 (3) Records, statements and other instruments as the
- department may prescribe by regulation.
- 23 Section 1110-E. Enforcement of article.
- The department and the Department of Environmental Protection
- 25 shall have the ability to inspect records and locations to
- 26 ensure compliance with this article.
- 27 PART II
- 28 <u>IMPACT FEE</u>
- 29 Section 1121-E. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this part shall

- 1 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 2 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 3 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.
- 4 <u>"Department." The Department of Revenue of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 5 <u>"Fund." The Unconventional Gas Well Fund established under</u>
- 6 <u>58 Pa.C.S. § 2314 (relating to distribution of fee).</u>
- 7 <a href=""">"Highway mileage."</a> The number of miles of public roads and
- 8 streets most recently certified by the Department of
- 9 Transportation as eligible for distribution of liquid fuels
- 10 funds under the act of June 1, 1956 (1955 P.L.1944, No.655),
- 11 referred to as the Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law.
- 12 "Municipality." A borough, city, town or township.
- 13 "Number of spud unconventional gas wells." The most recent
- 14 <u>numerical count of spud unconventional gas wells on the</u>
- 15 <u>inventory maintained and provided to the commission by the</u>
- 16 Department of Environmental Protection as of the last day of
- 17 each month.
- "Population." As follows:
- 19 (1) Population of this Commonwealth and population of a
- 20 county shall be determined using the United States Census
- 21 Bureau's most recently released Annual Estimates of the
- 22 Resident Population for Counties of Pennsylvania.
- 23 (2) Population of a municipality shall be determined
- using the United States Census Bureau's most recently
- 25 <u>released Annual Estimates for the Resident Population for</u>
- 26 Incorporated Places in Pennsylvania.
- 27 (3) Population of municipalities not included in the
- 28 report referenced under paragraph (2) shall be determined
- 29 using the United States Census Bureau's most recently
- 30 released Annual Estimates of the Resident Population for

- 1 <u>Minor Civil Divisions in Pennsylvania.</u>
- 2 "Spud." The actual start of drilling an unconventional gas
- 3 well.
- 4 "Unconventional gas well." A bore hole drilled or being
- 5 drilled for the purpose of or to be used for the production of
- 6 <u>natural gas from an unconventional formation.</u>
- 7 Section 1122-E. Powers of commission.
- 8 The commission may make inquiries and determinations
- 9 <u>necessary to make distributions under this part.</u>
- 10 Section 1123-E. Well information.
- 11 (a) List of wells. -- The Department of Environmental
- 12 Protection shall provide the commission and, upon request, a
- 13 county with a list of all spud unconventional gas wells for
- 14 which the department has issued permits. The Department of
- 15 Environmental Protection shall update the list and provide it to
- 16 the commission on a monthly basis.
- 17 (b) Notification to commission. -- A producer shall notify the
- 18 commission of the following within 30 days after a calendar
- 19 month in which the change occurs:
- 20 (1) The spudding of an unconventional gas well.
- 21 (2) The initiation of production at an unconventional
- 22 gas well.
- 23 (3) The removal of an unconventional gas well from
- 24 production.
- 25 (c) Notification to department. -- The commission shall notify
- 26 the department each month of the information collected under
- 27 <u>subsection (b).</u>
- 28 <u>Section 1124-E. Unconventional Gas Well Fund.</u>
- 29 <u>(a) Expiration of fee.--Notwithstanding provisions of 58</u>
- 30 Pa.C.S. § 2318 (relating to expiration) and except as provided

- 1 in subsection (b), the provisions of 58 Pa.C.S. Ch. 23 (relating
- 2 to unconventional gas well fee) shall continue in full force and
- 3 effect until the day immediately prior to the effective date of
- 4 this section. The unconventional gas well fee based upon
- 5 activity in calendar year 2015 shall be due and payable by April
- 6 1, 2016, and shall be deposited into the fund.
- 7 (b) Unconventional Gas Well Fund. -- The fund shall continue
- 8 beyond the expiration of the unconventional gas well fee
- 9 provided in subsection (a) and shall continue to be administered
- 10 by the commission. All funds in the fund following the deposit
- 11 provided in subsection (a) shall remain in the fund and be
- 12 <u>distributed as provided in this part.</u>
- 13 <u>Section 1125-E. Distribution to conservation districts and</u>
- 14 <u>State agencies.</u>
- 15 (a) Transfer. -- From revenue collected under this article for
- 16 <u>each calendar year, the department shall transfer to the fund,</u>
- 17 to the extent available, the following amounts which are
- 18 appropriated and shall be distributed by the commission in the
- 19 following order of priority:
- 20 (1) To county conservation districts, \$8,000,000 as
- 21 follows:
- (i) The amount of \$4,000,000 shall be distributed by
- 23 <u>dividing the amount equally among conservation districts</u>
- for uses consistent with the act of May 15, 1945
- 25 (P.L.547, No.217), known as the Conservation District
- 26 Law.
- (ii) The amount of \$4,000,000 shall be distributed
- by the State Conservation Commission in a manner
- 29 consistent with the Conservation District Law and the
- provisions of 25 Pa. Code Ch. 83 Subch. B (relating to

3	(2) To the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission,
4	\$1,200,000 for costs relating to the review of applications
5	for permits to drill unconventional gas wells.
6	(3) To the Department of Environmental Protection,
7	\$6,200,000 for the administration of this article and the
8	enforcement of acts relating to clean air and clean water.
9	(4) To the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency,
10	\$950,000 for emergency response planning, training and
11	coordination related to natural gas production from
12	unconventional gas wells.
13	(5) To the Office of the State Fire Commissioner,
14	\$950,000 for the development, delivery and sustainment of
15	training and grant programs for first responders and the
16	acquisition of specialized equipment for response to
17	emergencies relating to natural gas production from
18	unconventional gas wells.
19	(6) To the Department of Transportation, \$2,000,000 for
20	rail freight assistance.
21	(7) To the commission, \$1,200,000 for costs associated
22	with implementing this chapter.
23	(b) Report An agency or organization that receives money
24	under this section shall, by October 31, 2016, and October 31 of
25	each year thereafter, submit to the Secretary of the Budget and
26	the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the
27	Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives a
28	report itemizing and explaining the use of the money.
29	(c) Distribution Distribution of funds under this section
30	shall be contingent on availability of funds. If sufficient

- 1 funds are not available, the commission shall disburse funds on
- 2 <u>a pro rata basis.</u>
- 3 Section 1126-E. Appropriation and distribution to counties and
- 4 <u>municipalities.</u>
- 5 (a) Transfer. -- Beginning June 1, 2016, after the transfer of
- 6 the amount under section 1125-E from revenue collected under
- 7 this article for each calendar year, the department shall
- 8 transfer to the fund, to the extent available and before any
- 9 other funds from the tax are expended in any fiscal year, the
- 10 funds necessary to satisfy the annual obligations of the
