17	Authorizing political subdivisions, municipality authorities and

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7 Section [1] <u>1.1</u>. Nonreceipt of bids.

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(A) PURCHASE OF GOODS. --WHEN A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, 9 10 MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY ADVERTISES FOR BIDS ON AN ITEM AND NO BIDS ARE RECEIVED, THE POLITICAL 11 12 SUBDIVISION, MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY 13 SHALL REBID THE ITEM. IF [AGAIN SUCH BIDS ARE NOT RECEIVED] NO 14 BIDS ARE RECEIVED FROM SUPPLIERS OF THE ITEM WITHIN 15 DAYS OF THE SECOND ADVERTISEMENT, THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, 15 MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MAY PURCHASE 16 17 OR ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF [ANY] THE ITEM 18 [WHERE NO BIDS ARE RECEIVED FROM SUPPLIERS FOR THE ITEM WITHIN 19 45 DAYS OF THE DATE OF SECOND ADVERTISEMENT THEREFOR]. 20 (B) SALE OF PROPERTY.--WHEN A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY IS REQUIRED 21 22 TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS IN ORDER TO SELL REAL OR PERSONAL PROPERTY 23 AND NO BIDS ARE RECEIVED, THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, 24 MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MAY PROCEED 25 AS FOLLOWS:

(1) THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR
 TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MAY ADVERTISE FOR BIDS A SECOND
 TIME.

(2) IF NO BIDS ARE RECEIVED WITHIN 15 DAYS OF THE SECOND
 ADVERTISEMENT, THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, MUNICIPALITY

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1 AUTHORITY OR TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MAY INITIATE

2 NEGOTIATIONS FOR A PRIVATE SALE OF THE PROPERTY, TAKING INTO3 CONSIDERATION ITS FAIR MARKET VALUE.

4 (3) THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR
5 TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MUST PUBLICLY ANNOUNCE THE IDENTITY
6 OF THE PARTIES, THE SALE PRICE AND A SUMMARY OF THE OTHER
7 TERMS AND CONDITIONS RELATING TO ANY PROPOSED PRIVATE SALE AT
8 A REGULAR OR SPECIAL MEETING OF ITS GOVERNING BODY.

9 (4) AFTER THE PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE SALE IS MADE IN 10 ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (3), AT LEAST 30 DAYS MUST ELAPSE 11 BEFORE A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, MUNICIPALITY AUTHORITY OR 12 TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MAY AUTHORIZE THE PRIVATE SALE IN 13 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION.

14 (c) Contracts for services.--When a political subdivision, 15 municipality authority or transportation authority is required 16 to advertise for bids in order to enter into a contract for 17 services and no bids are received, the political subdivision, 18 municipality authority or transportation authority may proceed 19 as follows:

20 (1) The political subdivision, municipality authority or
 21 transportation authority may advertise for bids a second
 22 time.

23 (2) If no bids are received within 15 days of the second
 24 advertisement, the political subdivision, municipality

25 authority or transportation authority may initiate

26 negotiations for a contract to obtain the services previously

27 <u>advertised</u>, with any provider not otherwise disqualified by

28 law or an enactment or policy of the governing body.

29 (3) Prior to executing the contract, the political

30 <u>subdivision, municipality authority or transportation</u>

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1	authority, at a regular or special meeting of its governing
2	body, must publicly announce the identity of the parties, the
3	proposed contract price and a summary of the other terms and
4	conditions relating to any proposed contract in order to
5	demonstrate that the services to be procured are consistent
6	with those previously advertised.
7	(d) EvasionThe penalties, civil or criminal, surcharges
8	and other liability set forth in law, regulation or ordinance
9	for evading an advertising requirement for bids shall apply to a
10	member of the governing body of a political subdivision,
11	municipality authority or transportation authority who votes for
12	a transaction under this section with the intent to evade the
13	advertising requirement of the applicable law, regulation or
14	ordinance.
15	(e) DefinitionAs used in this section, the term
16	"services" means the furnishing of labor, time or effort by a
17	contractor not involving the delivery of a specific end product
18	other than drawings, specifications or reports which are merely
19	incidental to the required performance. The term includes the
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20	routine operation or maintenance of existing structures,
20	routine operation or maintenance of existing structures, buildings or real property, the repair or rehabilitation of
21	buildings or real property, the repair or rehabilitation of
21 22	buildings or real property, the repair or rehabilitation of existing infrastructure and utility services, or those services
21 22 23	buildings or real property, the repair or rehabilitation of existing infrastructure and utility services, or those services formerly provided by public utilities, such as electrical,

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
