AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school health services, providing for student mental health awareness. 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10 11 section to read: 12 Section 1426. Student Mental Health Awareness. -- (a) Within <--13 one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this section, the THE State Board of Education shall review the 14 <--15 existing State standards for health, safety and physical 16 education at 22 Pa. Code Ch. 4 (relating to academic standards 17 and assessment) and revise the standards as necessary to address 18 student mental health awareness.
 - (b) The Department of Education and the Department of Health

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- 1 shall jointly develop or identify a model curriculum and a list
- 2 of education materials which a school entity or nonpublic school
- 3 <u>may use in order to provide mental health awareness education.</u>
- 4 Existing model curriculum materials and education materials may
- 5 <u>be updated if necessary to comply with this subsection. The</u>
- 6 Department of Education and the Department of Health shall
- 7 update the model curriculum and education materials within one
- 8 (1) year of the date of revision of the State standards under
- 9 <u>subsection (a). The Department of Education shall post the model</u>
- 10 curriculum and list of education materials required under this
- 11 subsection on the department's publicly accessible Internet
- 12 <u>website.</u>
- 13 (c) A school entity shall notify its students, their parents
- 14 or guardians, athletic staff and extracurricular advisors twice
- 15 <u>each school year of mental health services available within the</u>
- 16 school entity or within the community in which the school entity
- 17 is located and how students and their parents or quardians may
- 18 access the services.
- 19 (d) If a student's participation in a school sponsored <--
- 20 athletic or extracurricular activity is interrupted, IF A <--
- 21 STUDENT IS INJURED OR SUDDENLY STOPS ATTENDING A SCHOOL-
- 22 SPONSORED ATHLETIC OR EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY, the school
- 23 entity's student assistance program shall be notified, subject
- 24 to the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy
- 25 Act of 1974 (Public Law 90-247, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g). Upon
- 26 notification, the school entity's student assistance program
- 27 <u>shall, at a minimum, provide the student's parents or guardians</u>
- 28 with information on mental health services identified under
- 29 <u>subsection (c). The Department of Education may set rules for</u>
- 30 the length of time of interruption that may trigger the

- 1 notification to the student assistance program.
- 2 (e) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this
- 3 section, the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association
- 4 shall review the existing coaching education requirements for
- 5 coaches engaged at a member school and revise the required
- 6 educational courses for training of coaches to include student
- 7 mental health awareness beginning in the 2025-2026 school year.

- 9 THE TRAINING UNDER THIS SUBSECTION:
- 10 (1) SHALL, AT A MINIMUM, INCORPORATE THE TRAINING STANDARDS
- 11 ADOPTED BY THE SCHOOL SAFETY AND SECURITY COMMITTEE UNDER
- 12 <u>SECTION 1310-B RELATING TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AWARENESS, SUICIDE</u>
- 13 AND BULLYING AWARENESS AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE AWARENESS.
- 14 (2) MAY BE CREDITED TOWARD A professional educator's
- 15 continuing professional education requirements under section
- 16 <u>1205.2</u> and a school or system leader's continuing professional
- 17 education requirement under section 1205.5.
- 18 (f) A student's parent or quardian, or an emancipated
- 19 student, shall complete all parts of the report of examination
- 20 form required under section 1407 that are designated to be
- 21 completed by a student's parent or quardian prior to presenting
- 22 the form to a health care provider. A health care provider shall
- 23 not complete or sign the report of examination form unless the
- 24 student's parent or quardian, or the emancipated student, has
- 25 completed all parts of the form that are designated for
- 26 completion by a student's parent or quardian.
- 27 (g) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this
- 28 section, the Secretary of Health shall review the report of
- 29 <u>examination form required under section 1407</u>, update the form as
- 30 necessary and post the updated form on the department's publicly

- 1 accessible Internet website. In reviewing and updating the form,
- 2 the Secretary of Health shall consider whether the form requires
- 3 parents and quardians to provide additional information on a
- 4 student's mental health.
- 5 (h) The following words and phrases when used in this
- 6 section shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection
- 7 <u>unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 "School entity." A school district, charter school, regional
- 9 <u>charter school</u>, <u>cyber charter school</u>, <u>intermediate unit or area</u>
- 10 career and technical school.
- 11 <u>"Student assistance program." As defined in 22 Pa. Code §</u>
- 12 12.16 (relating to definitions).
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
