AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), entitled "An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds 5 associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and 6 fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and 7 supervision of insurance carried by such companies, 9 associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and 10 repealing existing laws," in casualty insurance, providing 11 for infertility care coverage. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known 15 16 as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, is amended by adding a 17 section to read: 18 Section 635.9. Infertility Care Coverage. -- (a) A health 19 insurance policy covered under this section shall include 20 coverage for infertility care and shall waive cost-sharing 21 requirements related to infertility care.
 - (b) Infertility care coverage under this section shall be

- 1 provided to covered individuals, including covered spouses and
- 2 <u>covered nonspouse dependents. Infertility care coverage under</u>
- 3 this section shall be provided without discrimination on the
- 4 basis of age, ancestry, color, disability, domestic partner
- 5 status, gender, gender expression, gender identity, genetic
- 6 <u>information</u>, marital status, national origin, race, religion,
- 7 <u>sex or sexual orientation. Nothing in this subsection shall be</u>
- 8 construed to interfere with the clinical judgment of a
- 9 physician.
- 10 (c) Infertility care coverage under this section shall be
- 11 for the consultation, diagnosis and treatment of infertility,
- 12 <u>including the following:</u>
- 13 (1) Intrauterine insemination.
- (2) Cryopreservation and thawing of eggs, sperm and embryos.
- 15 (3) Cryopreservation of ovarian tissue.
- 16 (4) Cryopreservation of testicular tissue.
- 17 (5) Embryo biopsy.
- 18 (6) Diagnostic testing.
- 19 (7) Fresh and frozen embryo transfers.
- 20 (8) Egg retrievals with unlimited embryo transfers in
- 21 accordance with the quidelines of the American Society for
- 22 Reproductive Medicine, including the use of single embryo
- 23 transfers when recommended and medically appropriate.
- 24 (9) In vitro fertilization, including in vitro fertilization
- 25 through the use of donor eggs, sperm or embryos and in vitro
- 26 fertilization that involves the transfer of embryos to a
- 27 <u>gestational carrier or surrogate.</u>
- 28 (10) Assisted hatching.
- 29 (11) Intracytoplasmic sperm injection.
- 30 (12) Infertility medications.

- 1 (13) Ovulation induction.
- 2 (14) Storage of oocytes, sperm, embryos and tissue.
- 3 (15) Surgery to address disorders of the female reproductive
- 4 tract that impair fertility and to address disorders of sperm
- 5 production or anatomic disorders of the male reproductive tract
- 6 that impair fertility.
- 7 (16) Medical and laboratory services that reduce excess
- 8 <u>embryo creation through egg cryopreservation and thawing.</u>
- 9 (17) Surrogacy, including the costs associated with the
- 10 preparation for reception or introduction of embryos, oocytes or
- 11 <u>donor sperm into a surrogate or gestational carrier.</u>
- 12 <u>(18) Gamete intrafallopian transfers.</u>
- 13 <u>(19) Therapeutic devices.</u>
- 14 (20) Standard fertility preservation services for an
- 15 <u>individual who has a medical condition and is expected to</u>
- 16 <u>undergo medication therapy, surgery, radiation, chemotherapy or</u>
- 17 other medical treatment that is recognized by a medical
- 18 professional to cause a risk of impairment to fertility.
- 19 (21) Any nonexperimental procedure for infertility
- 20 recognized by the American Society for Reproductive Medicine,
- 21 the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists or the
- 22 Society for Assisted Reproductive Technology or by an
- 23 <u>infertility expert identified by the Department of Health.</u>
- 24 (22) Any other services, procedures, medications or devices
- 25 <u>related to the consultation, diagnosis and treatment of</u>
- 26 infertility.
- 27 (d) A health insurance policy covered under this section may
- 28 not:
- 29 (1) contain preexisting condition exclusions, preexisting
- 30 condition waiting periods to access the infertility care

- 1 coverage required under this section;
- 2 (2) use the prior diagnosis of infertility or prior
- 3 treatment for infertility as a basis for excluding, limiting or
- 4 <u>otherwise restricting the availability of infertility care</u>
- 5 coverage required under this section; or
- 6 (3) contain limitations on coverage for infertility benefits
- 7 <u>based solely on arbitrary factors, including the number of</u>
- 8 <u>infertility care attempts or cost of infertility care.</u>
- 9 (e) This section does not include any of the following types
- 10 of health insurance policies:
- 11 (1) Accident only.
- 12 <u>(2) Limited benefit.</u>
- 13 <u>(3) Credit only.</u>
- 14 (4) Long-term care or disability income.
- 15 <u>(5) Specified disease.</u>
- 16 (6) Medicare supplement.
- 17 (7) Tricare, including the Civilian Health and Medical
- 18 Program of the Uniformed Services (CHAMPUS) supplement.
- 19 (8) Fixed indemnity.
- 20 (9) Hospital indemnity.
- 21 (10) Dental only.
- 22 (11) Vision only.
- 23 (12) Workers' compensation.
- 24 (13) An automobile medical payment under 75 Pa.C.S.
- 25 <u>(relating to vehicles).</u>
- 26 (f) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 27 <u>shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless</u>
- 28 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 29 "Cost-sharing." The share of costs covered by the patient,
- 30 including a deductible, coinsurance, copayment or similar

- 1 charge. The term does not include the payment of a health
- 2 insurance policy premium.
- 3 "Health insurance policy." Any individual or group health
- 4 <u>insurance policy</u>, <u>subscriber contract</u>, <u>certificate or plan that</u>
- 5 provides medical or health care coverage by a health care
- 6 <u>facility or licensed health care provider on an expense-incurred</u>
- 7 <u>service or prepaid basis and that is offered by or is governed</u>
- 8 <u>under any of the following:</u>
- 9 (1) This act, including section 630.
- 10 (2) The children's health insurance program under Article
- 11 XXIII-A.
- 12 (3) Subdivision (f) of Article IV of the act of June 13,
- 13 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the "Human Services Code."
- 14 (4) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364), known
- 15 <u>as the "Health Maintenance Organization Act."</u>
- 16 (5) 40 Pa.C.S. Chs. 61 (relating to hospital plan
- 17 corporations) and 63 (relating to professional health services
- 18 plan corporations).
- 19 "Infertility." A disease historically defined by the failure
- 20 to achieve a successful pregnancy after six (6) to twelve (12)
- 21 months or more of regular, unprotected sexual intercourse or due
- 22 to an individual's status and capacity to reproduce as an
- 23 individual or with a partner.
- 24 "Physician." An individual licensed as a medical doctor by
- 25 the State Board of Medicine to practice in this Commonwealth.
- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
