7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	Section 121.1. Excusal from State Assessments(a) A
13	parent or guardian may submit to the school a written request to
14	excuse the parent's or guardian's child from any or all parts of
15	an assessment based on a parent's or guardian's objection on
16	religious or philosophical grounds or due to health concerns for
17	the child. The health concerns may include stress and anxiety in
18	preparation for the assessment. A parent's or guardian's
19	objection on religious grounds shall follow the process under 22
20	Pa. Code § 4.4(d) (relating to general policies).

1	Notwithstanding any provision of law, a parent's or guardian's
2	written request to school officials to excuse the parent's or
3	guardian's child from any or all parts of the assessments
4	administered under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 4 (relating to standards and
5	assessment) shall be granted. A public school entity shall not
6	be penalized because of a parent's or guardian's exercise of
7	this section.
8	(b) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
9	shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
10	the context clearly indicates otherwise:
11	"Assessment." The Pennsylvania System of School Assessment
12	test, the Keystone Exam, an equivalent local assessment or
13	another test established or approved by the State Board of
14	Education or the General Assembly to meet the requirements of
15	section 2603-B(d)(10)(i) and which is required under the Every
16	Student Succeeds Act (Public Law 114-95, 129 Stat. 1802) or its
17	successor statute.
18	"Public school entity." A school district, intermediate
19	unit, joint school, area vocational-technical school, charter
20	<u>school or cyber charter school.</u>

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
