AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Providing for the establishment of a searchable budget database- driven Internet website detailing certain information concerning taxpayer expenditures and investments by charter school entities.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Short title.
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Charter
9	School Entity Web Accountability and Transparency (CharterWATCH)
10	Act.
11	Section 2. Definitions.
12	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
13	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
14	context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	"Charter school." As defined in section 1703-A of the act of
16	March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code
17	of 1949.
18	"Charter school entity." A charter school, regional charter

1 school or cyber charter school.

"Cyber charter school." As defined in section 1703-A of the 2 act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public 3 School Code of 1949. 4 5 "Department." The Department of Education of the Commonwealth. 6 7 "Entity." Any of the following: 8 (1) An individual, corporation, association, union, 9 limited liability company or limited liability partnership. 10 (2) Any other legal business entity, including a 11 nonprofit, a grantee, a contractor and a sole proprietor. 12 (3) Any political subdivision or other local government 13 entity. 14 "Funding action or expenditure." A payment by a charter 15 school entity to include: 16 (1) A grant. 17 (2) A loan. 18 (3) Reimbursement. 19 (4) Payment made pursuant to the purchase of goods and 20 services, including employee salaries, or to a construction 21 or other contract. 22 (5) Payment of debt service. 23 (6) Payments made pursuant to a formula. 24 (7) Payments to political subdivisions or other local 25 government entities. 26 "Funding source." A charter school entity's general fund or 27 special funds. 28 "Public School Code of 1949." The act of March 10, 1949 29 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949. 30 "Regional charter school." As defined in section 1703-A of

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the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public
 School Code of 1949.

3 Section 3. Searchable database.

4 (a) Development.--By December 31, 2014, the department shall
5 develop, implement and maintain a single, searchable, public
6 Internet website to be called CharterWATCH.

7 (b) Internet website contents.--The Internet website
8 required pursuant to subsection (a) shall provide the following
9 information for each charter school entity:

10 (1) The name and address of the charter school entity.
11 (2) The amount of funding received by the charter school
12 entity from Federal, State, local and private sources and
13 deposited in the charter school entity's general fund or
14 special fund during the previous month.

15 (3) The name and address of the entity receiving a 16 payment from the charter school entity pursuant to a funding 17 action or expenditure.

18 (4) A description and the amount of each funding action19 or expenditure.

20 (5) The funding source for each funding action or21 expenditure.

(6) The expected and achieved performance outcomes fromthe funding action or expenditure, if available.

24 (7) A counter to show the number of times the Internet25 website is accessed.

26 (8) A link to each charter school entity's Internet27 website, where available.

(9) The total number of individuals employed by each
charter school entity as of the 15th day of the previous
month.

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(10) For each individual employed by a charter school
 entity, the following:

(i) Name.

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(ii) Position or title.

5 (iii) Current annual salary, based on the employee's
6 pay schedule and current salary.

7 (iv) Any additional compensation received by the
8 individual and the basis for such compensation,
9 including, but not limited to, duties as a coach or
10 activity advisor.

(v) Compensation, as defined in section 303(a)(1)(i) of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, paid by the charter school entity.

15 (c) Exemption.--Notwithstanding any other provision of this 16 act, records not subject to disclosure under the act of February 17 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, shall 18 not be included on the Internet website.

19 (d) Access.--The Internet website shall allow the public to20 search for and aggregate information at no cost.

(e) Maintenance.--Information for a fiscal year shall remain
on the Internet website for a period of no less than eight years
from the date of posting.

24 Section 4. Administration.

(a) Charter school entity requirements.--Each charter school entity shall cooperate with the department. The following shall apply:

(1) Each charter school entity shall provide the
department with all information regarding Federal, State,
local and private funding received and all funding actions or

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expenditures as required under this act at the time the funding is received or the funding action or expenditure is paid by the charter school entity.

4 (2) Each charter school entity shall provide the
5 department with complement and employment compensation
6 information as required under this act prior to the end of
7 each month.

8 (b) Accuracy.--Each charter school entity is responsible for 9 verifying the accuracy and completeness of information submitted 10 to the department.

11 (c) Format.--Each charter school entity shall establish and 12 maintain the information required to be posted under section 3 13 in a manner prescribed by the department. The department shall 14 consult with charter school entities to develop the format to be 15 utilized.

16 (d) Penalty.--The charter of any charter school entity that 17 fails to comply with the provisions of this act shall not be 18 renewed.

19 Section 5. Report to Governor and General Assembly.

20 The department shall prepare an annual report containing 21 statistical information on the usage and performance of the 22 Internet website. The report shall contain frequency of user 23 access of the Internet website, types of data being accessed and Internet website performance. The report shall be submitted to 24 25 the Governor, the chairman and minority chairman of the 26 Appropriations Committee of the Senate, the chairman and 27 minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House 28 of Representatives, the chairman and minority chairman of the 29 Education Committee of the Senate and the chairman and minority chairman of the Education Committee of the House of 30

- 3 Section 6. Effective date.
- 4 This act shall take effect immediately.
