AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in general powers and
- duties of the Department of Public Welfare, providing for
- 5 COVID-19 mental health public awareness campaign.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 9 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 10 read:
- 11 <u>Section 217. COVID-19 Mental Health Public Awareness</u>
- 12 <u>Campaign.--The secretary shall establish a public awareness</u>
- 13 campaign to provide information to the general public concerning
- 14 the programs and services available for first responders, health
- 15 <u>care workers</u>, other frontline workers and their families
- 16 experiencing mental health issues related to the COVID-19
- 17 pandemic, including, but not limited to, post-traumatic stress
- 18 disorder, anxiety, depression and substance use disorder.

- 1 (b) The secretary, in establishing the public awareness
- 2 campaign, shall develop outreach efforts and provide information
- 3 to the general public on:
- 4 (1) the link between mental health issues and the COVID-19
- 5 pandemic, including, but not limited to, post-traumatic stress
- 6 <u>disorder</u>, anxiety, depression and substance use disorder;
- 7 (2) resources for first responders, health care workers,
- 8 other frontline workers and their families experiencing mental
- 9 health issues related to the COVID-19 pandemic, including, but
- 10 not limited to, post-traumatic stress disorder, anxiety,
- 11 <u>depression and substance use disorder, including the programs</u>
- 12 provided by the department and other Federal, State and local
- 13 <u>social services and mental health agencies during the COVID-19</u>
- 14 pandemic;
- 15 (3) any telephone helpline established by the department for
- 16 first responders and health care workers experiencing mental
- 17 health issues due to their work during the COVID-19 pandemic,
- 18 including, but not limited to, post-traumatic stress disorder,
- 19 anxiety, depression and substance use disorder; and
- 20 (4) anxiety-reducing strategies and other methods to manage
- 21 stress, depression and other symptoms of post-traumatic stress
- 22 disorder during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 23 (c) The following shall apply:
- 24 (1) The public awareness campaign shall target the general
- 25 public and first responders, health care workers, other
- 26 frontline workers and their families through a variety of media,
- 27 <u>including television</u>, radio, print and on the department's
- 28 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 29 (2) The secretary shall provide for the development of
- 30 advertisements by signs, billboards, placards, posters and

- 1 <u>displays</u>, in English and Spanish, on the public awareness
- 2 <u>campaign</u>.
- 3 (d) As used in this section, the term "COVID-19 pandemic"
- 4 <u>shall mean the novel coronavirus as identified in the</u>
- 5 proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
- 6 March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
- 7 any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
