## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled "An act relating to the finances of the State government; 2 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint Underwriting Association, for entertainment business 5 financial management firms, for private dam financial 6 assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for 7 the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the 9 collection and recovery of fees and other money or property 10 due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 11 including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, 12 the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds 13 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the 14 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the 15 Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the 16 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the 17 Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and 18 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting 19 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 20 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 21 22 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of 23 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 24 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 25 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 26 department, board, commission, and officer of the State 27 government, every political subdivision of the State, and 28 29 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or 30 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 31 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 32

- every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the 2
- Commonwealth, "in Local Government Capital Project Loan Fund, 3

- further providing for definitions, for assistance to municipalities and for powers and duties of department. 5
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 7
- Section 1. The definition of "municipality" in section 1602-8
- D of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The 9
- Fiscal Code, is amended to read: 10
- 11 Section 1602-D. Definitions .-- As used in this article--
- \* \* \* 12
- "Municipality" shall mean any borough, town, first class 13
- township, second class township, third class city or county, 14
- provided that the term shall not include any boroughs, towns, 15
- 16 townships, cities or counties which have a population in excess
- of [12,000] <u>15,000</u>. 17
- Section 2. Sections 1603-D(a) and (b) and 1605-D of the act 18
- 19 are amended to read:
- 20 Section 1603-D. Assistance to Municipalities.--(a) The
- 21 department is hereby authorized, upon application of a
- municipality, to make loans to the municipality for the 22
- following purposes and in the following amounts: 23
- 24 1. Purchasing equipment. The amount of a loan made for
- purchasing equipment shall not exceed [fifty thousand dollars 25
- 26 (\$50,000)] one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) TWO\_
- HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000) for any single piece of 27
- 28 equipment or fifty per centum of the total cost of the piece of
- equipment, whichever is less. 29
- Purchasing, constructing, renovating or rehabilitating 30
- 31 facilities. The amount of a loan made for purchasing,
- constructing, renovating or rehabilitating facilities shall not 32

- 1 exceed [one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000)] two hundred and <--
- 2 fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS <--
- 3 <u>(\$500,000)</u> for any single facility or fifty per centum of the
- 4 total cost for purchasing, constructing, renovating or
- 5 rehabilitating the facility, whichever is less.
- 6 (b) Loans made by the department for the purchase of
- 7 equipment shall be for a period not to exceed the useful life of
- 8 the equipment, and loans made for the purchase, construction,
- 9 renovation or rehabilitation of facilities shall be for a period
- 10 of not more than fifteen years. Loans shall be subject to the
- 11 payment of interest at [two per centum per annum and] a rate set
- 12 <u>at the ten-year United States Treasury rate rounded to the</u>
- 13 closest quarter point, not to exceed two per centum per annum.
- 14 Loan applications shall be subject to the interest rate in
- 15 <u>effect at the time a complete application is submitted to the</u>
- 16 department, which shall be the fixed rate for the full term of
- 17 the loan. Loans shall be subject to such security as shall be
- 18 determined by the department. The total amount of interest
- 19 earned by the investment or reinvestment of all or any part of
- 20 the principal of any loan shall be returned to the department
- 21 and transferred to the fund and shall not be credited as payment
- 22 of principal or interest on the loan. The minimum amount of any
- 23 loan shall be one thousand dollars (\$1,000). The municipality
- 24 shall comply with the approval requirements of 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 80
- 25 Subch. C (relating to procedure for securing approval of
- 26 electors).

- 28 Section 1605-D. Powers and Duties of Department.--In
- 29 addition to the powers and duties conferred upon the department
- 30 under other provisions of law, the department shall have the

- 1 power and duty to:
- 2 1. Lend money for the purposes authorized by this article
- 3 over a term of years, but in no case in excess of [ten] <u>fifteen</u>
- 4 years.
- 5 2. Accept grants from the Federal Government and any other
- 6 individual, agency or government for use in the fund.
- 7 3. Prescribe the form of the application for a loan pursuant
- 8 to this article.
- 9 4. Advise a municipality regarding the financial ability of
- 10 the municipality to purchase equipment or to purchase,
- 11 construct, renovate or rehabilitate facilities.
- 12 5. Assist a municipality in taking advantage of joint
- 13 purchasing arrangements and of opportunities to purchase surplus
- 14 equipment from the Commonwealth or other political subdivisions.
- 15 6. Require security for a loan, if determined to be
- 16 necessary.
- 7. Specify priority of liens against any facilities or
- 18 equipment purchased by a municipality using funds loaned
- 19 pursuant to this article, if determined to be necessary.
- 20 8. Establish a schedule which provides at least an annual
- 21 opportunity for municipalities to apply for and receive loans.
- 22 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
