AN ACT

1 Designating a bridge on State Route 116 in Spring Grove Borough,
2 York County, as the Cameron J. Stambaugh Memorial Bridge.

3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4 hereby enacts as follows:

5 Section 1. Cameron J. Stambaugh Memorial Bridge.

6 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
7 follows:

8 (1) United States Army Specialist Cameron J. Stambaugh,
9 age 20, was killed in action while serving his country in
10 Afghanistan on July 8, 2012.

11 (2) Born on May 28, 1992, in York, Stambaugh was a 2010
12 graduate of Spring Grove Area High School.

13 (3) Stambaugh served in the Army's 978th Military Police
14 Company of Fort Bliss and was stationed in Afghanistan.

15 (4) He is survived by his parents and by his wife,

1 Jackie.

2 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on State Route 116 in
3 Spring Grove Borough, York County, is hereby designated the
4 Cameron J. Stambaugh Memorial Bridge.

5 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
6 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
7 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

8 Section 2. Effective date.

9 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
