## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for the dual credit 5 innovation and equity grant program. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 11 article to read: 12 ARTICLE XV-N 1.3 DUAL CREDIT INNOVATION AND EQUITY GRANT PROGRAM 14 Section 1501-N. Definitions. 15 The following words and phrases shall have the meanings given 16 to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates 17 otherwise: 18 "Department." The Department of Education of the

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Commonwealth.

- 1 "Dual credit." Credit received under an agreement between a
- 2 school entity and an institution of higher education approved to
- 3 operate in the Commonwealth in which a student earns both high
- 4 school and postsecondary credit by taking a single postsecondary
- 5 <u>course</u>.
- 6 "Grant." A grant provided under the program.
- 7 "Program." The Dual Credit Innovation and Equity Grant
- 8 Program established in section 1502-N.
- 9 "Public institution of higher education." An institution of
- 10 the State System of Higher Education established under Article
- 11 XX-A, a community college established under Article XIX-A,
- 12 <u>Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology established under Article</u>
- 13 XIX-B or the rural regional college established under Article
- 14 XIX-G.
- 15 <u>"School entity." A school district, area career and</u>
- 16 technical school, charter school, cyber charter school or
- 17 regional charter school.
- 18 <u>Section 1502-N. Dual Credit Innovation and Equity Grant</u>
- 19 Program.
- 20 (a) Establishment. -- The Dual Credit Innovation and Equity
- 21 Grant Program is established within the department to award
- 22 grants to public institutions of higher education that offer
- 23 dual credit opportunities to high school students enrolled in a
- 24 school entity.
- 25 (b) Use of funds.--Program funds shall be used for the
- 26 purpose of increasing the capacity for public institutions of
- 27 <u>higher education to provide dual credit courses. Funds awarded</u>
- 28 through a grant may be used for the following:
- 29 <u>(1) To operate dual credit courses that are tuition free</u>
- 30 to high school students.

- 1 (2) To support public institutions of higher education
- 2 <u>in seeking external accreditation for their dual credit</u>
- 3 <u>courses.</u>
- 4 (3) To provide a system of wraparound student supports
- 5 <u>to aid students enrolled in dual credit courses to be</u>
- 6 <u>successful in the courses and to successfully transition to</u>
- 7 postsecondary education upon graduation from high school.
- 8 (4) To increase the use of no-cost or low-cost textbooks
- 9 <u>or course materials used in dual credit courses.</u>
- 10 (5) For professional development activities for high
- 11 <u>school teachers to enable them to teach dual credit courses.</u>
- 12 <u>(c) Priority.--The department shall give priority in grant</u>
- 13 <u>funding to public institutions of higher education that expand</u>
- 14 the current offerings of the public institution of higher
- 15 education, with a particular emphasis on providing courses
- 16 aligned with high priority career paths and serving students
- 17 experiencing education instability as defined in section 1331.1,
- 18 students enrolled in career and technical education programs,
- 19 low-income students, historically underserved student groups and
- 20 students in rural areas of the Commonwealth.
- 21 Section 1503-N. Reporting and accountability.
- 22 For the purpose of improving data collection and transparency
- 23 <u>related to the value of dual credit courses to the success of</u>
- 24 <u>students as they graduate high school and transition to</u>
- 25 postsecondary education, the department shall annually collect
- 26 <u>student-level data from grant recipients and post aggregate, de-</u>
- 27 identified information related to all of the following on the
- 28 <u>department's publicly accessible Internet website:</u>
- 29 (1) The demographics of students enrolled in dual credit
- 30 <u>courses.</u>

1	(2) The high school graduation rate of students enrolled
2	in dual credit courses.
3	(3) The percentage of economically disadvantaged
4	students enrolled in dual credit courses and the percentage
5	of students enrolled in dual credit courses who are
6	economically disadvantaged.
7	(4) The percentage of dual credit students who enroll in
8	a regionally accredited postsecondary institution the fall
9	after graduation, within one year and within two years after
10	high school graduation.
11	(5) The number of college credits earned by students
12	enrolled in dual credit courses while in high school.
13	(6) An estimate of the cost savings to the families of
14	students enrolled in dual credit courses.
15	(7) The percentage of dual credit students who enroll in
16	a community college, Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology
17	or the Northern Pennsylvania Regional College following high
18	school graduation and go on to graduate or transfer to a
19	four-year institution within two, three and four years of
20	high school graduation.
21	(8) The percentage of dual credit students who enroll in
22	a State System of Higher Education institution following high
23	school graduation and go on to graduate in four, five or six
24	years.
25	(9) The percentage of dual credit students who attend
26	postsecondary institutions located in Pennsylvania following
27	graduation compared to those who attend out-of-State
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Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
