AN ACT

- Amending Title 62 (Procurement) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
 Statutes, in procurement organization, further providing for
 powers and duties of Department of General Services and
 providing for limited contract adjustment due to construction
 material price escalation.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

 hereby enacts as follows:

 Section 1. Section 321 of Title 62 of the Pennsylvania
- 9 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 10 § 321. Powers and duties.
- 11 Except as otherwise specifically provided in this part, the
- 12 department shall have the following powers and duties:
- 13 (1) Procure or supervise the procurement of all
- 14 supplies, services and construction needed by executive
- 15 agencies and those independent agencies for which the
- department acts as purchasing agency. Procurement authority
- 17 may be delegated in writing by the Secretary of General
- 18 Services.
- 19 (2) Exercise general supervision and control over all

- 1 inventories of supplies belonging to executive agencies.
- 2 (3) Sell, trade or otherwise dispose of surplus supplies 3 belonging to executive or independent agencies.
 - (4) Coordinate programs of executive and independent agencies for the inspection, testing and acceptance of supplies and construction to ensure availability of facilities and to avoid a duplication of functions.
 - (5) Establish and maintain a central office where businesses operating in this Commonwealth may obtain information pertaining to the procurement needs of Commonwealth agencies.
 - (6) Participate in the management and maintenance of a contractor responsibility program in coordination with the Office of the Budget and other agencies as may be directed by the Governor.

 20 Section 2. Title 62 is amended by adding a section to read:

- 23 <u>(a) Conditions authorizing adjustment.--Notwithstanding the</u>
- 24 provisions of section 534 (relating to cost or pricing data),
- 25 whenever the terms and conditions of a contract awarded by a
- 26 Commonwealth agency require a contractor to furnish construction
- 27 materials, the terms and conditions shall be adjusted by the
- 28 <u>department if the department determines that:</u>
- 29 (1) The bid for the contract was submitted no earlier
- 30 <u>than March 15, 2020.</u>

- (3) At the time of the contractor's or subcontractor's application for contract adjustment, the cost of acquisition of construction materials by the contractor, subcontractor or supplier of materials has increased in excess of 5% since the time of the contract award. The determination under this paragraph shall be based upon available evidence, including, but not limited to, a nationally recognized economic index published by the United States Department of Labor. (b) Application process. -- Within 30 days of the effective

- date of this subsection, the department shall establish a 12
- process for applications for contract adjustment to be submitted 13
- 14 by a contractor or subcontractor. The department shall:
- 15 (1) Prescribe the form of the application for a contract adjustment under this section. 16
- 17 (2) Require applications for a contract adjustment under 18 this section to include sufficient documentary evidence, as 19 determined by the department, that the contract conforms to 20 the conditions under subsection (a).
- 21 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
