## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An 1 act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 2 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and 3 changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and 17 brewed beverages, further providing for sale of malt or 18 19 brewed beverages by liquor licensees, for wine expanded permits and for retail dispensers' restrictions on purchases 20 21 and sales. 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: 24 Section 1. Sections 407(a)(2), 415(a)(9) and (10) and 442(a) 25 (1)(ii) of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as 26 the Liquor Code, are amended to read:

Section 407. Sale of Malt or Brewed Beverages by Liquor

- 1 Licensees.--(a) \* \* \*
- 2 (2) If a restaurant liquor license holder has an interior
- 3 connection to another business that it operates, the restaurant
- 4 liquor license holder may use one or more of the registers in
- 5 the other business to sell malt or brewed beverages for off-
- 6 premises consumption under the following conditions:
- 7 [(i) the building is eleven thousand square feet or less;]
- 8 (ii) the registers are located in the same building as the
- 9 licensed premises;
- 10 (iii) the registers comply with the signage, staffing,
- 11 training, carding, scanning and prohibition on the sharing of
- 12 data provisions of section 415(a)(8) and (9); and
- 13 (iv) the board has been provided notice of compliance with
- 14 this paragraph by the restaurant liquor license holder,
- 15 including [square footage of the building and] the location of
- 16 the specific registers to be used prior to their use.
- 17 \* \* \*
- 18 Section 415. Wine Expanded Permits.--(a) \* \* \*
- 19 (9) A sale of wine by a wine expanded permit holder shall be
- 20 made through a register[, which malt or brewed beverages and
- 21 restaurant foods sales are made] <u>located</u> on the licensed
- 22 premises, which is well designated with signage[, which is
- 23 staffed at all times when patrons are on the licensed premises].
- 24 The actual sale shall be conducted by a sales clerk who is at
- 25 least eighteen years of age [and], has been trained under
- 26 section 471.1 and [which] utilizes a transaction scan device for
- 27 the sale as set forth in paragraph (8). A sales clerk who is
- 28 <u>under eighteen years of age may operate a register if the sales</u>
- 29 clerk is presented with wine or malt or brewed beverages to be
- 30 purchased by a customer and obtains the assistance of an

- 1 employee who is at least eighteen years of age and the sale
- 2 otherwise conforms to the requirements under this section. The
- 3 sale of wine may not occur at a point of sale where the customer
- 4 scans the customer's own purchases. Sales of wine must occur on
- 5 the licensed premises. A wine expanded permit holder may use a
- 6 register that is not located on the licensed portion of the
- 7 premises but is located within the same building as the licensed
- 8 premises so long as the sale otherwise conforms to the
- 9 requirements provided under this subsection.
- 10 (10) If a wine expanded permit holder has an interior
- 11 connection to another business that it operates, the wine
- 12 expanded permit holder may use one or more of the registers in
- 13 the other business to sell wine for off-premises consumption
- 14 under the following conditions:
- 15 [(i) the building is eleven thousand (11,000) square feet or
- 16 less;]
- 17 (ii) the registers are located in the same building as the
- 18 licensed premises;
- 19 (iii) the registers comply with the signage, staffing,
- 20 training, carding, scanning and prohibition on the sharing of
- 21 data provisions of paragraphs (8) and (9); and
- 22 (iv) the board has been provided notice of compliance with
- 23 this paragraph by the wine expanded permit holder, including
- 24 [square footage of the building and] the location of the
- 25 specific registers to be used prior to their use.

- 27 Section 442. Retail Dispensers' Restrictions on Purchases
- 28 and Sales.--(a) (1) \* \* \*
- 29 (ii) If a retail dispenser license holder has an interior
- 30 connection to another business that it operates, the retail

- 1 dispenser license holder may use one or more of the registers in
- 2 the other business to sell malt or brewed beverages for off-
- 3 premises consumption under the following conditions:
- 4 [(A) the building is eleven thousand square feet or less;]
- 5 (B) the registers are located in the same building as the
- 6 licensed premises;
- 7 (C) the registers comply with the signage, staffing,
- 8 training, carding, scanning and prohibition on the sharing of
- 9 data provisions of section 415(a)(8) and (9); and
- 10 (D) the board has been provided notice of compliance with
- 11 this subparagraph by the retail dispenser license holder,
- 12 including [square footage of the building and] the location of
- 13 the specific registers to be used prior to their use.

- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
