## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Schools-to-Work Program; providing for powers
- and duties of the Department of Education; and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Schools-to-
- 8 Work Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Business." An entity authorized to do business in this
- 14 Commonwealth and subject to taxes imposed under Article III, IV,
- 15 VI, VII, VIII, IX, XV or XX of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6,
- 16 No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, or a tax under
- 17 Article XVI of the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known

- 1 as The Insurance Company Law of 1921. The term includes a pass-
- 2 through entity, including a pass-through entity the purpose of
- 3 which is the making of contributions under this article and
- 4 whose shareholders, partners or members are composed of owners
- 5 or employees of other business firms.
- 6 "Career and technical school." A public secondary school
- 7 established under the provisions of Article XVIII of the act of
- 8 March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code
- 9 of 1949.
- 10 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 11 Commonwealth.
- 12 "Program." The Schools-to-Work Program established under
- 13 section 3.
- "School." A public school, including a charter school, cyber
- 15 charter school, intermediate unit or area vocational-technical
- 16 school, operating in a school district in this Commonwealth.
- 17 Section 3. Schools-to-Work Program.
- 18 (a) Establishment.--The Schools-to-Work Program is
- 19 established in the department to distribute grants on a
- 20 competitive basis to schools to support the establishment or
- 21 enhancement of partnerships with local businesses in order to
- 22 fill current and anticipated needs for employees with necessary
- 23 job qualifications and certifications.
- 24 (b) Grant proposals. -- In order to apply for a grant under
- 25 the program, a school must submit a grant proposal to the
- 26 department. The proposal shall include all of the following:
- 27 (1) Participation of at least one local business.
- 28 (2) Work-based learning opportunities for participating
- 29 students, including workplace visits, internships,
- 30 apprenticeships, mentorships or employment opportunities.

- 1 (3) Identification of the qualifications and
- 2 certifications necessary to fill current and anticipated
- 3 employment needs of the participating business.
- 4 (4) Opportunities for students to earn industry-
- 5 recognized qualifications and certification.
- 6 (5) Identification of additional personnel needed, if
- 7 any, in order to matriculate the number of certificate-
- 8 holding and qualified students needed to fill positions
- 9 within participating businesses.
- 10 (6) Description of the relationship between the
- 11 participating business and the school in creating curricula
- that will lead to certification of students, apprenticeships
- and jobs with participants.
- 14 (c) Additional information. -- A grant proposal may include
- 15 all of the following:
- 16 (1) Participation of a local work force investment
- 17 board.
- 18 (2) Opportunity for students to earn college credit.
- 19 (d) Priority of applications. -- The department shall give
- 20 priority to proposals that:
- 21 (1) demonstrate a strong need for career and technical
- 22 instructors;
- 23 (2) provide internships or apprenticeships to students
- from grade nine through graduation; or
- 25 (3) indicate the intent of a participating business to
- hire students in the program upon graduation.
- 27 (e) Grant distribution. -- The department shall award a total
- 28 of eight grants under the program. The department shall consider
- 29 geographic diversity when selecting grant recipients.
- 30 (f) Limitation.--A school may use grant money only for the

- 1 purposes stated in its grant proposal. A school shall return to
- 2 the department any remaining grant money not used for the
- 3 proposal.
- 4 Section 4. Memorandum of understanding.
- 5 A school and a business participating in the program shall
- 6 execute a memorandum of understanding that outlines the
- 7 responsibilities of the participants. The responsibilities shall
- 8 include all of the following:
- 9 (1) Commitment to align high school and post-secondary
- 10 coursework with technical skills and workplace competencies
- 11 as defined by industry.
- 12 (2) Meaningful work-based learning opportunities for
- 13 participating students, including workplace visits,
- internships, apprenticeships and mentorships.
- 15 (3) Commitment to develop a scope and sequence of
- 16 courses, curricula and work-based learning programs that
- 17 ensure students can earn relevant postsecondary credits or
- industry certification.
- 19 (4) Articulation language that ensures any postsecondary
- credits earned in the program are transcripted and
- 21 transferrable.
- 22 Section 5. Reporting requirements.
- 23 A school participating in the program shall be required to
- 24 report to the department data related to the program, including
- 25 all of the following:
- 26 (1) The number of students certified as a result of the
- 27 program.
- 28 (2) The number of students who secured internships or
- apprenticeships with participating businesses.
- 30 (3) The number of students employed as a result of

- 1 participating in the program.
- 2 (4) A detailed description of the use of grant money,
- 3 including an itemized list of expenditures.
- 4 (5) Other data deemed relevant or necessary by the
- 5 department.
- 6 Section 6. Appropriation.
- 7 The sum of \$2,000,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 8 necessary, is annually appropriated from the General Fund to the
- 9 Department of Education for the Schools-to-Work Program for the
- 10 fiscal year July 1, 2017, to June 30, 2018, and July 1, 2018, to
- 11 June 30, 2019.
- 12 Section 7. Expiration.
- This act shall expire June 30, 2020.
- 14 Section 8. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
