9	Section 1. Section 9(b) of the act of October 27, 2014
10	(P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by
11	Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, is amended
12	by adding a paragraph to read:
13	Section 9. Access to prescription information.

15	(b) Authorized usersThe following individuals may query
16	the system according to procedures determined by the board and
17	with the following limitations:

19	(12) A Medicaid managed care organization, as defined

1	under section 1903(m)(1)(A) of the Social Security Act (49
2	Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396b(m)(1)(A)), that is a party to a
3	Medicaid managed care contract with the Department of Human
4	Services. The following shall apply:
5	(i) The Medicaid managed care organization may query
6	the system to review the requested dispensing or
7	prescribing of a controlled substance under this act to
8	an individual to whom the organization provides services
9	under the State's plan for medical assistance under Title
10	XIX of the Social Security Act.
11	(ii) The Medicaid managed care organization shall
12	notify the Department of Human Services and the
13	appropriate law enforcement agency if the organization
14	has reason to believe that a controlled substance
15	prescribed or dispensed to an enrollee under the State's
16	plan for medical assistance under Title XIX of the Social
17	<u>Security Act is fraudulent.</u>
