5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Section 4107(a)(1) and (b) introductory paragraph
8	of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are
9	amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to

12	(a) Violation of vehicle equipment standards
13	(1) [It] <u>Except as otherwise provided, it</u> is unlawful
14	for any person to sell, offer for sale, lease, install or
15	replace, either separately or as part of the equipment of a
16	vehicle, any item of vehicle equipment affecting the
17	operation of the vehicle which does not comply with this
18	title or regulations promulgated thereunder, or which does
19	not comply with an applicable Federal motor vehicle safety

1	standard adopted by regulation by the department.

3	(b) Other violations[It] <u>Except as otherwise provided, it</u>
4	is unlawful for any person to do any of the following:

6	(b.2) Vehicle doorsIf a vehicle is registered under
7	section 1301 (relating to registration and certificate of title
8	required) and equipped from the original manufacturer with
9	manufacturer-designed and manufacturer-installed removable doors
10	with the intention to allow removal and reinstallation by the
11	vehicle owner, that vehicle may be operated on the roadways of
12	this Commonwealth with the doors removed. When the manufacturer-
13	designed and manufacturer-installed doors are removed, the
14	vehicle shall have side mirrors, including the original
15	manufacturer side mirrors, or installed side mirrors attached by
16	the vehicle owner. This subsection shall not limit or otherwise
17	impact section 4534 (relating to rearview mirrors) or 4581
18	(relating to restraint systems). To comply with section 4702
19	(relating to requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles), a
20	vehicle under this subsection shall be inspected with the doors
21	attached.
