- 3 determines that a vehicle was essentially involved.

- 4 § 3303. OVERTAKING VEHICLE ON THE LEFT.
- 5 (A) GENERAL RULE. -- THE FOLLOWING RULES SHALL GOVERN THE
- 6 OVERTAKING AND PASSING OF VEHICLES PROCEEDING IN THE SAME
- 7 DIRECTION, SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS, EXCEPTIONS AND SPECIAL
- 8 RULES STATED IN THIS CHAPTER:

- 10 (3) THE DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE OVERTAKING A
- 11 [PEDALCYCLE] <u>VULNERABLE HIGHWAY USER</u>, OTHER THAN A

- 17 SECTION 3. TITLE 75 IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ:
- 18 § 3303.1. VEHICLES PASSING PEDESTRIANS ON A HIGHWAY.
- 19 (A) GENERAL RULE. -- THE FOLLOWING RULES SHALL GOVERN THE
- 20 PASSING OF PEDESTRIANS ON A HIGHWAY WHEN VEHICLES ARE PROCEEDING
- 21 IN THE SAME OR OPPOSITE DIRECTION:
- 22 (1) IF A PEDESTRIAN IS WALKING ON A HIGHWAY OR ON A
- 23 SHOULDER ADJACENT TO A HIGHWAY, THE DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE
- 24 SHALL SAFELY PASS A PEDESTRIAN ON THE PEDESTRIAN'S LEFT SIDE
- 25 WITHIN NOT LESS THAN FOUR FEET, BUT THE DRIVER IS NOT
- 26 REQUIRED TO EXIT THE LANED ROADWAY OR YIELD TO THE PEDESTRIAN
- 27 TO ACHIEVE THE FOUR-FOOT REQUIREMENT.
- 28 (2) IF A PEDESTRIAN IS WALKING ON A HIGHWAY OR ON A
- 29 SHOULDER ADJACENT TO A HIGHWAY AND THE ONLY OPTION FOR THE
- 30 DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE TO SAFELY PASS A PEDESTRIAN IS ON

- 1 THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE PEDESTRIAN, THE DRIVER OF A MOTOR
- 2 VEHICLE SHALL SAFELY PASS ON THE PEDESTRIAN'S RIGHT SIDE
- 3 WITHIN NOT LESS THAN FOUR FEET, BUT THE DRIVER IS NOT
- 4 REQUIRED TO EXIT THE LANED ROADWAY OR YIELD TO THE PEDESTRIAN

- 8 3542 (RELATING TO RIGHT-OF-WAY OF PEDESTRIANS IN CROSSWALKS),
- 9 <u>3543 (RELATING TO PEDESTRIANS CROSSING AT OTHER THAN CROSSWALKS)</u>
- 10 OR 3544 (RELATING TO PEDESTRIANS WALKING ALONG OR ON HIGHWAY).

- 13 § 3502. Penalty for violation of subchapter.
- Any person violating any provision of this subchapter is
- 15 quilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
- 16 sentenced to pay a fine of [\$10] \$25.
- 17 § 3714. Careless driving.
- 18 (a) General rule. -- Any person who drives a vehicle in
- 19 careless disregard for the safety of persons or property is
- 20 quilty of careless driving, a summary offense.
- 21 (b) Unintentional death.--[If] Except as provided in
- 22 <u>subsection (b.1), if</u> the person who violates this section
- 23 unintentionally causes the death of another person as a result
- 24 of the violation, the person shall, upon conviction, be
- 25 sentenced to pay a fine of \$500.
- 26 (b.1) Death involving a vulnerable highway user.--If the
- 27 person who violates this section unintentionally causes the
- 28 <u>death of a vulnerable highway user as a result of the violation,</u>
- 29 the person shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of
- 30 not less than \$500 and not more than \$5,000.

- 1 (c) Serious bodily injury.--[If] Except as provided in
- 2 <u>subsection (c.1), if</u> the person who violates this section
- 3 unintentionally causes the serious bodily injury of another
- 4 person as a result of the violation, the person shall, upon
- 5 conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$250.
- 6 (c.1) Serious bodily injury to a vulnerable highway user.--
- 7 If the person who violates this section unintentionally causes
- 8 the serious bodily injury of a vulnerable highway user as a
- 9 result of the violation, the person shall, upon conviction, be
- 10 sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$250 and not more than
- 11 \$2,500.
- 12 (c.2) Bodily injury to a vulnerable highway user. -- If a
- 13 person who violates this section unintentionally causes the
- 14 bodily injury of a vulnerable highway user as a result of the
- 15 violation, the person shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to
