AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled 1 "An act relating to the finances of the State government; 2 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for 3 ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint 4 Underwriting Association, for entertainment business 5 financial management firms, for private dam financial 6 assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for 7 the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, 8 bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the 9 10 collection and recovery of fees and other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 11 including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, 12 the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds 13 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the 14 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the 15 Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the 16 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and 17 18 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting 19 20 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 21 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes 22 23 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 24 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 25 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 26 department, board, commission, and officer of the State 27 government, every political subdivision of the State, and 28 29 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or 30 31 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 32 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 33 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the 34

1 2	Commonwealth," in emergency COVID-19 response, establishing the COVID-19 Nonprofit Hazard Pay Grant Program.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby enacts as follows:
5	Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known
6	as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding a section to read:
7	Section 135-C. COVID-19 Nonprofit Hazard Pay Grant Program.
8	(a) Use of fundsThe sum of \$100,000,000 is appropriated
9	from Federal funds in the account received by the Commonwealth
10	under section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021
11	(Public Law 117-2, 135 Stat.223) to the department for the
12	purpose of making grants under this section.
13	(b) Establishment of programThe COVID-19 Nonprofit Hazard
14	Pay Grant Program is established within the department to
15	provide hazard pay to employees of a nonprofit corporation that
16	<u>serves a charitable purpose.</u>
17	(c) Eligibility
18	(1) The following shall be eligible to apply for grants
19	under the program:
20	(i) A nonprofit corporation serving a charitable
21	purpose.
22	(ii) A purely public charity serving a charitable
23	purpose.
24	(iii) A nonprofit health care organization.
25	(iv) A frontline employee whose eligible employer
26	has not applied for a grant under the program on behalf
27	of the frontline employee.
28	(2) In order to be eligible to receive a grant under the
29	program, a nonprofit corporation serving a charitable purpose
30	or a purely public charity serving a charitable purpose shall
31	be located within this Commonwealth and operate or conduct

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1	any of the following:
2	(i) Care or assistance organization for individuals
3	with disabilities.
4	<u>(ii) A food bank.</u>
5	<u>(iii) A homeless shelter.</u>
6	(iv) Any other nonprofit corporation providing human
7	services to benefit those impacted by COVID-19 or other
8	<u>vital human services.</u>
9	(3) In order to be eligible to receive a grant under the
10	program, a health care provider shall be located within this
11	Commonwealth and operate or conduct any of the following:
12	(i) Health care or social assistance.
13	(ii) A nursing or residential care facility.
14	(iii) Residential care for individuals with physical
15	<u>disabilities.</u>
16	(iv) A mental health or substance abuse facility.
17	(v) A mental health, psychiatric or substance abuse
18	hospital or other facility.
19	(vi) A general medical or surgical hospital.
20	(vii) A psychiatric or substance abuse hospital.
21	(viii) Ambulatory health care services.
22	<u>(ix) A physician's office.</u>
23	(x) A dentist's office.
24	(xi) Any other office of a health practitioner.
25	(xii) An outpatient care center.
26	(xiii) A medical or diagnostic laboratory.
27	(xiv) Home health care services.
28	(xv) A pharmacy.
29	(xvi) Any other health care services.
30	(d) Application process

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1	(1) In order to apply for a grant under the program, an
2	employer shall submit the department's electronic single
3	application for assistance and provide all of the following
4	in the application:
5	(i) A project narrative, including all of the
6	<u>following:</u>
7	(A) Industry category.
8	(B) A brief description of the charitable
9	purpose the employer provides to the public.
10	(C) The employer's location in this
11	Commonwealth.
12	(ii) Changes to the operations and hours of the
13	employer due to the COVID-19 disaster emergency.
14	(iii) How the employer has adjusted operations to
15	meet the safety requirements of the Centers for Disease
16	Control and Prevention and the Department of Health
17	regarding COVID-19 and limited contact with the public
18	when possible.
19	(iv) The number of employees not working due to
20	testing positive for COVID-19, caring for a family member
21	with COVID-19 or lack of child care.
22	(v) Whether the employer is currently providing
23	hazard pay for the employer's employees.
24	(vi) The amount of the grant request.
25	(vii) A brief description of how the grant funds
26	will be used to increase hazard pay, including the
27	following information:
28	(A) The number of the employer's full-time
29	equivalent frontline employees eligible for hazard
30	pay.

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1	(B) The job types of the employer's full-time
2	equivalent frontline employees eligible for hazard
3	pay and the reason why the employees must remain
4	frontline employees during the COVID-19 disaster
5	emergency.
6	(C) The hourly rate of the employer's employees,
7	excluding fringe benefits.
8	(2) The department shall evaluate an application for a
9	grant under the program using the following criteria:
10	(i) Risk of exposure by industry.
11	(ii) The location and prevalence of COVID-19.
12	(iii) The average hourly wage paid by the employer.
13	(3) The department shall prioritize applications for
14	grants under the program in accordance with the Worker
15	Exposure Risk to COVID-19 released by the Occupational Safety
16	and Health Administration and based on the following:
17	(i) Employees with a high potential for exposure to
18	known or suspected sources of COVID-19 during specific
19	medical, postmortem or laboratory procedures, including
20	employees performing aerosol-generating procedures or
21	collecting or handling specimens from potentially
22	infectious COVID-19 individuals.
23	(ii) Employees with a high potential for exposure to
24	known or suspected sources of COVID-19, including
25	employees that provide health care delivery and support
26	or medical transport to potentially infectious COVID-19
27	individuals.
28	(iii) Employees that are in frequent close contact
29	with individuals who may be infected with COVID-19, but
30	who are not known or suspected individuals with COVID-19.

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1	Employees under this subparagraph shall include employees
2	who may have been in contact with the general public,
3	employees returning from locations with widespread COVID-
4	<u>19 transmission and employees who do not have the ability</u>
5	to socially distance at their place of employment.
6	<u>(iv) Employees that do not require contact with</u>
7	individuals who may be infected with COVID-19, including
8	employees that have minimal occupational contact with the
9	public or other coworkers.
10	(4) The department shall only consider complete
11	applications for grants under the program. An incomplete
12	application shall not be considered by the department and
13	<u>shall be withdrawn.</u>
14	(5) The department shall designate a time for receipt of
15	applications for grants under the program.
16	(6) After the approval of an application by the
17	department, the department shall electronically issue a grant
18	agreement to the applicant explaining the terms and
19	conditions of the grant along with the Federal Funding
20	Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (Public Law 109-
21	282, 120 Stat. 1186) form. The applicant shall electronically
22	sign and return the grant agreement to the department within
23	30 days. If the applicant fails to electronically sign and
24	return the grant agreement to the department within 30 days,
25	the grant agreement may be withdrawn by the department. The
26	applicant shall return the Federal Funding Accountability and
27	Transparency Act of 2006 form under this paragraph with the
28	signed grant agreement to the department. If the applicant
29	fails to return the Federal Funding Accountability and
30	Transparency Act of 2006 form under this paragraph, the

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1	department may not process the grant agreement. The
2	department shall return a fully executed copy of the grant
3	agreement to the applicant with a grant payment request form
4	and instructions for requesting a grant payment. An applicant
5	may submit a grant payment request with support documentation
6	at the end of the eligible period seeking reimbursement for
7	actual hazard pay expenditures by a date established by the
8	department. The support documentation under this paragraph
9	shall include a signed hazard pay report with the names of
10	the employees, pay date, pay period covered, regular pay,
11	hazard pay, proof of payment and a description of duties of
12	the employees.
13	(7) The department shall transmit the guidelines
14	detailing the application process for the program to the
15	Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the
16	Pennsylvania Bulletin and post the guidelines on the
17	department's publicly accessible Internet website.
18	(e) Certification
19	(1) An employer that receives a grant under the program
20	shall certify compliance with all of the following
21	requirements to the department:
22	(i) The employer pays the employer's employees at
23	least the minimum wage under the act of January 17, 1968
24	(P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968.
25	(ii) The employer pays the employer's share of the
26	Federal FICA tax obligations for the hazard pay.
27	(iii) The employer adheres to the Centers for
28	Disease Control and Prevention guidelines and Department
29	of Health regulations and guidelines for reopening under
30	the Governor's phased reopening plan to protect frontline

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1	employees from contracting COVID-19.
2	(iv) The employer complies with all relevant laws,
3	regulations and orders of this Commonwealth during the
4	period of the COVID-19 disaster emergency, including, but
5	not limited to, orders by the Governor, Secretary of
6	Health or other public officials authorized to take
7	actions to mitigate the COVID-19 disaster emergency.
8	(2) An employer that fails to comply with the
9	requirements under paragraph (1) shall be ineligible for
10	grants under the program and may be required to return all,
11	or a portion, of the grants awarded to the employer under the
12	program.
13	(f) System requirementsIn order to be eligible for a
14	grant under the program, an employer shall have a data universal
15	numbering system number and be registered with the Federal
16	Government's system for award management.
17	(g) Administration of hazard pay
18	(1) An employer that receives a grant under the program
19	shall use the grant money to provide hazard pay to an
20	employee for a 10-week period as designated by the department
21	at a rate of an additional \$3 per hour of the employee's
22	<u>regular pay rate.</u>
23	(2) Hazard pay provided to an employee shall be in
24	addition to any eligible overtime and other benefits,
25	including employer-paid hazard pay. Hazard pay may not
26	supplant the current compensation of an employee or supplant
27	any scheduled increase to the current compensation of an
28	employee.
29	(3) An employer shall provide hazard pay to an employee
30	according to the employee's regular pay schedule. An employer

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1	may not withhold hazard pay from an employee and provide the
2	hazard pay to the employee in a later lump sum.
3	(4) In order to determine the maximum grant request
4	under the program, an employer shall calculate the number of
5	the employer's full-time equivalent employees during a 10-
6	week period who are eligible to receive hazard pay.
7	(5) An employer may apply for a grant under the program
8	to provide hazard pay for no more than 500 eligible full-time
9	equivalent employees per location with a maximum of a
10	<u>\$600,000 grant per location.</u>
11	(6) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
12	receipt of a grant under the program shall not affect an
13	employer's eligibility for a grant or the amount of a grant
14	provided under any other laws of this Commonwealth.
15	(7) Grant funds under the program may be used for hazard
16	pay for full-time equivalent frontline employees, excluding
17	fringe benefits and overtime, during the 10-week period
18	determined by the department.
19	(8) Hazard pay shall only be used for frontline
20	employees facing the hazards of COVID-19 and who have
21	continued working through the Governor's 20200319 TWW COVID-
22	<u>19 Business Closure Order for a life-sustaining business or a</u>
23	business that received a waiver from the Governor's 20200319
24	TWW COVID-19 Business Closure Order by the department.
25	(h) Limitations
26	(1) An employer that submits an application to the
27	department for a grant under the program shall not be
28	eligible for reimbursement for the administrative costs to
29	submit and complete the application.
30	(2) An employer may not provide hazard pay for any hours

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1	worked by an employee in excess of 40 hours in a week.
2	(3) The department may not award a grant under the
3	program in excess of \$1,200 per eligible full-time equivalent
4	employee.
5	(4) An employer may receive more than \$3,000,000 in
6	grant funding under the program. A health care nonprofit
7	organization applicant representing frontline employees may
8	not receive more than \$3,000,000 in grant funding under the
9	program. A health care nonprofit organization that submits an
10	application for a grant under the program on behalf of the
11	organization's employees shall be eligible for grant money to
12	health care employees directly employed by qualified
13	participants in State Medicaid long-term support and services
14	programs.
15	(i) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
16	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
17	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
18	"Charitable purpose." The relief of poverty, providing food
19	to those in need, the prevention and treatment of disease or
20	injury, including mental retardation and mental disorders and
21	any other purpose the accomplishment of which is recognized as
22	important and beneficial to the public by the department during
23	the COVID-19 disaster emergency.
24	"COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious
25	disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
26	2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,
27	China.
28	"COVID-19 disaster emergency." The disaster emergency as
29	described in the proclamation of disaster emergency issued by
30	the Governor on March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March
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1	21, 2020), and any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.
2	"Department." The Department of Community and Economic
3	Development of the Commonwealth.
4	"Employee." An employee actively engaged in a task at the
5	direction of an employer serving a charitable purpose during the
6	COVID-19 disaster emergency. The term does not include an
7	employee on leave for the entire duration of the COVID-19
8	<u>disaster emergency.</u>
9	"Frontline employee." An employee deemed necessary by the
10	employer to report to work during the COVID-19 disaster
11	emergency for a nonprofit corporation serving a charitable
12	purpose.
13	"Hazard pay." Additional pay for performing hazardous duties
14	or work involving physical hardship related to COVID-19.
15	"Health care nonprofit organization." A 501(c)(3) nonprofit
16	organization that provides health care services. The term
17	includes a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides
18	education, development and support for frontline employees who
19	provide health care services.
20	"Program." The COVID-19 Nonprofit Hazard Pay Grant Program.

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
