AN ACT

Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in hunting and furtaking, further providing for 2 trespass on private property while hunting. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 hereby enacts as follows: 5 Section 1. Section 2314 of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 8 § 2314. Trespass on private property while hunting. 9 General rule. -- Any person who while violating any [(a) 10 provision of this title or any regulations promulgated under 11 this title and who in addition is found to be trespassing as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 3503 (relating to criminal trespass) 12 13 shall be in violation of this section. 14 (b) Penalty. -- A violation of this section: 15 (1) A violation of this section is a summary offense of 16 the fifth degree.

A second or subsequent violation of this section

- 1 within a seven-year period is a summary offense of the fifth
- degree and may result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt
- or take game or wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth
- for a period of one year.]
- 5 (a) General rule. -- A person, while engaged in hunting or
- 6 <u>furtaking</u>, <u>commits an offense if</u>, <u>knowing that the person is not</u>
- 7 <u>licensed or privileged to do so, the person:</u>
- 8 (1) enters or remains on any land of another without
- 9 <u>authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner</u>
- prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the
- person's attention or is fenced or enclosed in a manner
- manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or
- 13 (2) enters or remains on any land of another without
- 14 authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave
- that has been personally communicated to the person by the
- owner of the land or other authorized person.
- 17 (b) Penalty. -- An offense under this section shall be graded
- 18 as follows:
- 19 (1) A person who violates subsection (a)(1) commits a
- 20 summary offense of the third degree.
- 21 (2) A person who violates subsection (a) (2) commits a
- 22 misdemeanor.
- 23 (3) A person who commits a second or subsequent
- violation of this section within a seven-year period commits
- 25 <u>a misdemeanor, and the second or subsequent violation shall</u>
- result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt or take game or
- 27 <u>wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth for a period of</u>
- one year.
- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
