## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing separate and distinct amendments to the Constitution
- of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for
- terms of members and for the Legislative Reapportionment
- 4 Commission.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby resolves as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The following separate and distinct amendments to
- 8 the Constitution of Pennsylvania are proposed in accordance with
- 9 Article XI:
- 10 (1) That section 3 of Article II be amended to read:
- 11 § 3. Terms of members.
- 12 [Senators shall be elected for the term of four years and
- 13 Representatives for the term of two years.]
- 14 (a) Senators shall be elected for the term of six years. No
- 15 person shall hold the office of Senator for a period of longer
- 16 than two successive terms of six years. Terms of Senators shall
- 17 be considered successive unless separated by a period of six or
- 18 more years. Representatives shall be elected for the term of

- 1 four years. No person shall hold the office of Representative
- 2 for a period longer than three successive terms of four years.
- 3 Terms of Representatives shall be considered successive unless
- 4 <u>separated by a period of four or more years.</u>
- 5 (b) In determining the eligibility of an individual to hold
- 6 office in accordance with subsection (a):
- 7 (1) Time spent in office in fulfillment of a term to which
- 8 <u>another person was first elected shall not be considered,</u>
- 9 provided that a period of at least six years for Senators and at
- 10 least four years for Representatives passed between the time, if
- 11 any, the individual previously held that office and the time the
- 12 individual is elected to fulfill the unexpired term.
- 13 (2) A person who is elected to office in a regularly
- 14 scheduled general election and resigns prior to the completion
- 15 of the term for which the person was elected shall be considered
- 16 to have served the full term in that office.
- 17 (c) Senators elected at the general election in 2014 and
- 18 thereafter shall serve a six-year term. Senators now elected and
- 19 those whose terms are unexpired shall represent the districts in
- 20 which they reside until the end of the terms for which they were
- 21 elected.
- 22 (d) Representatives in odd-numbered districts elected at the
- 23 general election in 2014 shall serve a four-year term, and
- 24 Representatives in even-numbered districts elected at the
- 25 general election in 2014 shall serve a two-year term.
- 26 Representatives in even-numbered districts elected at the
- 27 general election in 2016 shall serve a four-year term.
- 28 (2) That section 17(f) of Article II be amended to read:
- 29 § 17. Legislative Reapportionment Commission.
- 30 \* \* \*

- 1 (f) Any district which does not include the residence from
- 2 which a member of the Senate or House of Representatives was
- 3 elected whether or not scheduled for election at the next
- 4 general election shall elect a Senator or Representative at such
- 5 election.
- 6 \* \* \*
- 7 Section 2. The provisions of this resolution apply only to
- 8 terms served by members of the General Assembly after the first
- 9 election cycle following the ratification of this constitutional
- 10 amendment and thereafter.
- 11 Section 3. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 12 Assembly of these proposed constitutional amendments, the
- 13 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 14 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 15 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 16 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 17 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 18 passage of these proposed constitutional amendments.
- 19 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of these
- 20 proposed constitutional amendments, the Secretary of the
- 21 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 22 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 23 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 24 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 25 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 26 these proposed constitutional amendments. The Secretary of the
- 27 Commonwealth shall submit the proposed constitutional amendment
- 28 under section 1(1) to the qualified electors of this
- 29 Commonwealth as a ballot question and the proposed
- 30 constitutional amendment under section 1(2) to the electors of

- 1 this Commonwealth as a separate ballot question at the first
- 2 primary, general or municipal election which meets the
- 3 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article
- 4 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least
- 5 three months after the proposed constitutional amendments are
- 6 passed by the General Assembly.
