## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in general powers and duties of Department of Human Services, providing for unlicensed residential habilitation waiver services and reimbursement.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

  hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 10 as the Public Welfare Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 11 read:
- 12 <u>Section 211.1. Unlicensed Residential Habilitation Waiver</u>
- 13 <u>Services.--Subject to Federal approval of such amendments as may</u>
- 14 be necessary to the Commonwealth's approved Title XIX State
- 15 Plan, the department shall do all of the following:
- 16 (1) Permit a relative or legal quardian of an individual
- 17 with an intellectual disability to provide unlicensed
- 18 residential habilitation waiver services to the individual in a
- 19 residential setting approved by the department. A residential
- 20 setting may include the private home of an individual with an

- 1 <u>intellectual disability and the private home of a relative or</u>
- 2 <u>legal guardian of an individual with an intellectual disability.</u>
- 3 (2) Promulgate regulations that establish the process and
- 4 <u>criteria to be used to determine eligibility for a relative or</u>
- 5 <u>legal guardian of an individual with an intellectual disability</u>
- 6 to provide unlicensed residential habilitation waiver services
- 7 to the individual in residential settings approved by the
- 8 <u>department. The relative or legal guardian must meet the</u>
- 9 qualifications criteria for providers of residential
- 10 habilitation waiver services set forth by the department as of
- 11 the effective date of this section.
- 12 (3) Establish reimbursement rates for eliqible relatives or
- 13 legal guardians providing unlicensed residential habilitation
- 14 waiver services.
- 15 Section 2. Within 90 days of the effective date of this
- 16 section, the Department of Human Services shall submit to the
- 17 appropriate Federal agency a request for necessary waivers of
- 18 Federal law and regulations and for any other approvals by the
- 19 Federal Government necessary for the implementation of the
- 20 changes and additions made by the addition of section 211.1 of
- 21 the act. It is the obligation of the department to enter into
- 22 good faith negotiations with the appropriate Federal authorities
- 23 and to make every effort to obtain the necessary Federal waivers
- 24 and approvals.
- 25 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
