AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in certification of teachers, further 5 providing for continuing professional development; providing 6 for access to advanced placement courses for all students; 7 establishing the Advanced Placement Teacher Training Program; and imposing duties on the Department of Education and on 9 school entities. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 1205.1(c.1)(3) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, 14 15 is amended to read: Section 1205.1. Continuing Professional Development .-- * * * 16 17 The continuing professional education plan shall 18 specify the professional education needs that will be met by completion of each continuing professional education option and 19 how it relates to areas of assignment and certification or 20 potential administrative certification. The options may include, 21

- 3 (3) Other programs, activities or learning experiences taken
- 4 for credit or hourly, to include:
- 5 (i) curriculum development and other program design and
- 6 delivery activities at the school entity or grade level as
- 7 determined by the school entity and approved by the board of
- 8 directors:
- 9 (ii) participation in professional conferences and
- 10 workshops;
- 11 (iii) education in the workplace, where the work relates to
- 12 the professional educator's area of assignment and is approved
- 13 by the board of directors;
- 14 (iv) review, redesign and restructuring of school programs,
- 15 organizations and functions as determined by the school entity
- 16 and approved by the board of directors;
- 17 (v) in-service programs that comply with guidelines
- 18 established by the department;
- 19 (vi) early childhood and child development activities for
- 20 professional educators whose area of assignment includes
- 21 kindergarten through third grade;
- 22 (vii) special education activities for professional
- 23 educators whose area of assignment includes students with
- 24 special needs;
- 25 (viii) successful completion of department training for
- 26 service as a Distinguished Educator if the professional educator
- 27 participates in and completes at least one assignment in the
- 28 Distinguished Educators Program;
- 29 (ix) other continuing professional education courses,
- 30 programs, activities or learning experiences sponsored by the

- 1 department; [or]
- 2 (x) visits by educators to a manufacturing workplace for
- 3 orientation and demonstrations to give the professional educator
- 4 a greater understanding of job opportunities in manufacturing
- 5 for students[.]; or
- 6 (xi) access to the advanced placement courses for all
- 7 <u>students program.</u>
- 8 * * *
- 9 Section 2. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
- 10 ARTICLE XVII-E
- 11 ACCESS TO ADVANCED PLACEMENT
- 12 COURSES FOR ALL STUDENTS
- 13 <u>Section 1701-E. Scope of article.</u>
- 14 This article relates to access to advanced placement courses
- 15 for all students.
- 16 Section 1702-E. Definitions.
- 17 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 18 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 20 "Advanced placement course." A program authorized by the
- 21 college board that allows a student to study college-level
- 22 subjects while enrolled in high school and to receive advanced
- 23 placement and college credit for earning a qualified score on
- 24 the course-related advanced placement exam.
- 25 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 26 Commonwealth.
- 27 <u>"Eliqible school entity." A school entity that does not have</u>
- 28 at least one advanced placement course in the four core academic
- 29 areas or computer science, or will no longer have an advanced
- 30 placement course in one of the four core academic areas or

- 1 computer science due to the retirement or loss of a teacher who
- 2 <u>teaches an advanced placement course.</u>
- 3 "Eligible teacher." A professional employee who is certified
- 4 in the subject area of the advanced placement course that the
- 5 professional employee will be teaching. In the case of a
- 6 computer science course, the term means an individual who has
- 7 received professional development to teach computer science even
- 8 if the individual is certified in a different subject area.
- 9 <u>"Four core academic areas." Mathematics, English language</u>
- 10 arts, science and social science.
- 11 "Poverty level." The percentage of students in a school
- 12 <u>district eligible for free or reduced-price lunch.</u>
- 13 "Program." The Advanced Placement Teacher Training Program.
- 14 "School entity." A public school district, intermediate
- 15 unit, area career and technical school, charter school or cyber
- 16 charter school operating in this Commonwealth.
- 17 "Teacher training entity." An institution of higher
- 18 education, intermediate unit or organization endorsed by the
- 19 college board to train teachers to teach advanced placement
- 20 courses.
- 21 "Virtual learning instruction." The provision of academic
- 22 courses and instruction to students through the Internet or the
- 23 use of technology.
- 24 Section 1703-E. Advanced Placement Teacher Training Program.
- 25 (a) Purpose. -- The purpose of the program is to provide
- 26 access to advanced placement courses in the four core academic
- 27 <u>areas and computer science for students by eligible teachers at</u>
- 28 all high schools that do not currently provide the courses. The
- 29 Pennsylvania School Performance Profile, established in 2012,
- 30 includes advanced placement participation and performance in a

- 1 <u>high school as an indicator of academic achievement that</u>
- 2 <u>determines a high school's academic performance score.</u>
- 3 (b) Establishment. -- The Advanced Placement Teacher Training
- 4 Program is established in the department to train teachers in an
- 5 <u>eligible school entity to teach advanced placement courses in</u>
- 6 the four core academic areas and computer science.
- 7 (c) Teacher training. -- A school entity that has an advanced
- 8 placement course in one or more of the four core academic areas
- 9 <u>or computer science but not in all five areas shall be eligible</u>
- 10 only to have a teacher trained in those academic areas in which
- 11 the school entity does not currently have an advanced placement
- 12 <u>course.</u>
- 13 <u>(d) Limitation.--No more than one teacher in an academic</u>
- 14 <u>area of an eligible school entity shall be trained under the</u>
- 15 program.
- 16 (e) Joint application. -- More than one eligible school entity
- 17 may apply jointly to the program to train a teacher in an
- 18 advanced placement course instruction if the teacher will
- 19 provide instruction in more than one school entity through
- 20 classroom instruction, virtual learning instruction or a blended
- 21 learning model.
- 22 (f) Publication. -- A school entity that offers advanced
- 23 placement courses to students because of the program shall
- 24 publish on the school's publicly accessible Internet website the
- 25 <u>advanced placement courses offered and notify parents of the</u>
- 26 availability and quidelines.
- 27 <u>Section 1704-E. Application.</u>
- The application for an eligible school entity seeking funding
- 29 for the program must include the following:
- 30 (1) The subject areas that currently have advanced

Τ	placement courses in the school entity.
2	(2) The four core academic areas or computer science
3	that do not have advanced placement courses in the school
4	entity.
5	(3) The following information:
6	(i) The names of the eligible teachers.
7	(ii) The high school where the teachers are
8	teaching.
9	(iii) The advanced placement academic subject area
10	the teacher would provide instruction.
11	(iv) Whether the instruction will be in a classroom,
12	virtual learning or through a blended learning model.
13	(4) The names of the eligible teacher training entities
14	that would provide training to teach advanced placement
15	courses.
16	(5) An agreement to offer the advanced placement courses
17	for high school students for at least three years.
18	(6) Guidelines the school entity will use to determine
19	which students may be eligible to enroll in an advanced
20	placement course, subject to the following:
21	(i) In developing the guidelines, the school entity
22	shall utilize data and information on the academic
23	performance of students, which may include the academic
24	performance of students on the Pre-Scholastic Aptitude
25	Test and the Scholastic Aptitude Test in consultation
26	with the college board, shall eliminate barriers that
27	restrict access to advanced placement courses for student
28	populations that have been traditionally underserved and
29	shall make every effort to ensure that advanced placement
30	classes reflect the diversity of the student population.

- 1 (ii) The school entity may not unlawfully
- 2 discriminate on any basis in enrollment of students.
- 3 (7) A statement agreeing to comply with the reporting
- 4 <u>requirement under section 1705-E.</u>
- 5 <u>Section 1705-E. Report to department.</u>
- 6 For each of the five academic areas where an eligible
- 7 teacher's training was funded by the program a school entity
- 8 shall annually report to the department the following:
- 9 (1) Number of students who took advanced placement
- 10 courses.
- 11 (2) Grade levels where advanced placement courses are
- 12 <u>taught</u>.
- 13 (3) Number of students who took advanced placement
- 14 examinations.
- 15 (4) Number of students who scored a three or higher on
- 16 advanced placement examinations.
- 17 (5) Number of teachers who taught advanced placement
- 18 courses within the school entity.
- 19 Section 1706-E. Powers and duties of department.
- 20 (a) General rule. -- The department shall promulgate rules,
- 21 regulations and procedures necessary for the implementation of
- 22 this article, including the following:
- 23 (1) Certify teacher training entities, that are endorsed
- by the college board, that may provide training to teachers
- 25 to teach advanced placement courses in the four core academic
- areas or computer science. In certifying teacher training
- 27 <u>entities, the department shall ensure that the training</u>
- 28 locations and times are geographically accessible for
- 29 teachers from eligible school entities to attend or are
- 30 administered in a manner that is not in person.

(2) The department shall ensure that training provided
by teacher training entities provides eligible teachers with
the necessary content knowledge and instructional skills to
prepare students for success in advanced placement courses
and examinations.
(b) Report Starting at the end of the first year of the
program and then annually thereafter, the department shall issue
a report to the General Assembly on the program that includes:
(1) The number of teachers who received training in
advanced placement instruction in school entities in each of
the four core areas and computer science.
(2) The number and percentage of high schools that offer
advanced placement programs in all five academic areas.
(3) The number and percentage of high schools that offer
advanced placement courses in each of the five academic
areas.
(4) The number and percentage of students who took
advanced placement courses at school entities in each of the
five academic areas.
(5) The number and percentage of students who scored a
three or higher on an advanced placement examination at
school entities in each of the five academic areas.
(6) The names of the school entities and high schools
that do not offer advanced placement courses.
(7) The number of teachers who were trained outside the
four core academic areas or computer science teaching other
advanced placement courses.
Section 1707-E. Funding to teacher training entities.
To the extent funds are available for the program, the

- 1 <u>entities based on teacher attendance upon completion of the</u>
- 2 training program.
- 3 Section 1708-E. Program funding.
- 4 (a) Funding. -- Funding for the program shall be made from
- 5 <u>available Federal funds and annual appropriations made by the</u>
- 6 General Assembly to the department for that purpose or private
- 7 sources.
- 8 (b) Priorities. -- In the event of insufficient funds in any
- 9 <u>fiscal year, the department shall prioritize funding of eligible</u>
- 10 school entities based on the poverty level of the school entity.
- 11 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
