AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in powers and duties of the Department of Drug 21 22 and Alcohol Programs, providing for xylazine awareness education. 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 25 hereby enacts as follows:
- 26 Section 1. Article XXIII-A of the act of April 9, 1929
- 27 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is

2	SUBARTICLE C
3	EDUCATION PROGRAMS
4	Section 2331-A. Xylazine awareness education.
5	(A) POWERS AND DUTIES The Department of Drug and Alcohol <-
6	Programs, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE <
7	DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, shall have the power and its duty
8	shall be to:
9	(1) Enter into partnerships with health care providers,
10	including physicians and veterinarians, and community-based
11	health centers and hospitals to educate Pennsylvanians on the
12	dangers of human use of xylazine.
13	(2) Create informational materials in electronic and
14	physical form, in coordination with the partners described in
15	paragraph (1), which may be distributed to or accessed by
16	Pennsylvanians. The informational materials must include:
17	(i) The effects on the human body of the use of
18	xylazine.
19	(ii) How to talk to family and friends about the
20	dangers of human use of xylazine.
21	(iii) The legitimate uses of xylazine for animal
22	use.
23	(iv) Any other information that the Department of
24	Drug and Alcohol Programs deems necessary to prepare and
25	educate residents of this Commonwealth on the dangers of
26	human use of xylazine.
27	(B) EXPIRATION UPON A DETERMINATION BY THE SECRETARY OF <-
28	HEALTH THAT THE HUMAN USE OF XYLAZINE NO LONGER POSES A
29	SIGNIFICANT THREAT TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY OF THE
30	COMMONWEALTH, THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH SHALL SUBMIT A NOTICE TO

- 1 THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU IN THE NEXT AVAILABLE ISSUE OF
- 2 THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN. THIS SECTION SHALL EXPIRE UPON
- 3 PUBLICATION OF THE NOTICE UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
