AN ACT

Amending Title 25 (Elections) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in voter registration, further providing for 2 methods of voter registration, providing for electronic voter 3 registration, for electronic submission of changes to 4 registration and for time for electronic voter registration 5 and further providing for preparation and distribution of 6 applications and for approval of registration applications; in records, further providing for general register, for 8 district registers and for reports; in changes in records, 9 further providing for removal notices and for change of 10 enrollment of political party; and, in penalties, further 11 providing for altering registration. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Section 1321 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 16 17 § 1321. Methods of voter registration. 18 An individual qualified to register to vote under section

1301(a) (relating to qualifications to register) may apply to

- 1 (5) Under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter 2 registration). Section 2. Title 25 is amended by adding sections to read: 3 § 1325.1. Electronic voter registration. 4 (a) General rule. -- An application to register to vote may be 5 submitted by an electronic voter registration application on the 6 publicly accessible Internet website maintained by the 7 department in the manner provided under this section. 8 9 (b) Establishment.--(1) The department shall develop an electronic voter 10 application on a secure computer system, maintained by the 11 department, that permits a qualified elector to 12 electronically submit a voter registration application or 13 14 changes to an existing registration. 15 (2) The department shall develop the application within 180 days of the effective date of this section. 16 17 (3) The electronic voter registration application shall 18 comply with the requirements under section 1327 (relating to 19 preparation and distribution of applications) and the 20 department shall implement methods for individuals with 21 disabilities, including individuals who are blind or visually 22 impaired, to submit registration forms through the computer 23 system. 24 (c) Submission.--25 (1) A qualified elector who applies to register to vote 26 under this section shall do all of the following: 27 (i) Enter the data required on the electronic voter registration application. 28

- (A) the last four digits of the applicant's 30

11	(iii) Affirmatively attest to the truth of the

13	(2) The department shall obtain an electronic copy of
14	the applicant's signature from the applicant's driver's
15	license or identification card issued by the Department of
16	Transportation under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510. The department may,
17	in the department's discretion, develop other means of
18	obtaining an electronic signature from an applicant,
19	including obtaining a copy of a signature on file with
20	another Commonwealth agency, so long as the signature is
21	capable of being transmitted to the department in a secure
22	<u>fashion.</u>
23	(3) (i) Notwithstanding the department's ability to
24	obtain an electronic copy of an applicant's signature
25	under paragraph (2), the department shall transfer the
26	application to the SURE system for examination and
27	processing by the appropriate commission in accordance
28	with section 1328 (relating to approval of registration
29	applications). If the department is not able to obtain an
30	electronic copy of the applicant's signature, the

department shall include a notation that the applicant

must provide a signature at the polling place or, if the

applicant votes by absentee ballot, on the absentee

ballot application, the first time the applicant votes

after submitting an electronic voter registration

application.

(ii) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to

(ii) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prevent an applicant from printing the completed electronic voter registration application, signing it and mailing it or delivering it in person to the appropriate commission in accordance with the voter registration application deadlines specified in section 1326.1 (relating to time for electronic voter registration). If an applicant satisfies the requirements of this subparagraph, no additional signature shall be required.

(4) Use of electronic voter registration application by

the applicant shall constitute the applicant's consent to the use of the applicant's signature on file with the Department of Transportation or any other Commonwealth agency or otherwise provided to the department under paragraph (2) for voter registration purposes.

(d) Duties of department. --

(1) Within 24 months following the effective date of this section, the department shall promulgate regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this section and section 1325.2 (relating to electronic submission of changes to registration). Prior to the promulgation, the department shall transmit notice of the implementation guidelines to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the next available issue of the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

- 2 <u>measures to ensure the security and integrity of voter</u>

- 6 § 1325.2. Electronic submission of changes to registration.
- 7 (a) Transfer through SURE system. -- If an electronic voter
- 8 registration application is submitted within 15 days before an
- 9 <u>election</u>, the application shall be transferred through the SURE
- 10 system to the appropriate commission. The appropriate commission
- 11 shall ensure that the registrant is not included in the book of
- 12 qualified electors until the election at which that voter would,
- 13 but for the date of the registration, be eligible.
- 14 (a.1) Changing information. -- A registered elector may change
- 15 <u>information in the registered elector's voter registration</u>
- 16 records by using the electronic voter registration application
- 17 developed by the department under section 1325.1 (relating to
- 18 electronic voter registration) or a form developed by the
- 19 department for changes, as determined by the department.
- 20 (b) Submission. -- The provisions of section 1325.1 regarding
- 21 the validity of the information, the requirement for and consent
- 22 to the use of the elector's signature on file with another
- 23 Commonwealth agency or otherwise provided to the department
- 24 under section 1325.1(c)(2) and other verification by the elector
- 25 of the elector's identity shall apply to a submission for a
- 26 change to the elector's registration records under this section.
- 27 <u>(c) Effectiveness of changes.--Changes to information in an</u>
- 28 elector's voter registration records under this section shall be
- 29 effective if:
- 30 (1) the department is able to obtain an electronic copy

- of the elector's signature. The department shall inform the
- 2 applicant if the electronic signature cannot be verified; or
- 3 (2) the elector prints the form on which the changes
- 4 <u>have been made, signs the form and mails it or delivers it in</u>
- 5 person to the appropriate commission, and the commission
- 6 receives the changes in accordance with the voter
- 7 <u>registration application deadlines specified in section</u>
- 8 <u>1326.1 (relating to time for electronic voter registration).</u>
- 9 § 1326.1. Time for electronic voter registration.
- In the case of electronic voter registration under section
- 11 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter registration), each
- 12 <u>commission shall ensure that an applicant who is a qualified</u>
- 13 <u>elector is registered to vote in an election if the voter</u>
- 14 transmits the electronic voter registration application through
- 15 the Internet system maintained by the department no later than
- 16 11:59 p.m. on the 15th day prior to the election.

- 21 § 1327. Preparation and distribution of applications.
- 22 (a) Form.--
- 23 * * *
- 24 (3) Any person who assists in the completion of the
- registration application shall sign or, in the case of
- registration under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic
- 27 <u>voter registration</u>), shall electronically sign the
- application and indicate the person's address. In the case of
- 29 those registering under sections 1323 (relating to
- application with driver's license application) and 1325

(relating to government agencies), the person providing assistance shall insert the person's initials or employee or agent identification number on a separate or detachable portion of the application or computer data file.

- electronic voter registration application, except an
 electronic voter registration application under section

 1325.1, shall be printed on stock of good quality and shall
 be of suitable uniform size. [Nothing in this part shall
 prohibit the design and use of an electronic voter

 registration application which includes the applicant's
 digitized or electronic signature.] The registration
 application, including a registration application under
 section 1325.1, shall contain the following information;
 however, the information may be provided on a separate form
 for voter registration made under section 1323 or 1325:
 - (i) Notice that a registered elector does not need to reregister unless the registered elector has moved.
 - (ii) Instructions on how to fill out and submit the application and notification of when the application must be submitted to a voter registration office or, for electronic voter registration under section 1325.1, electronically, in order to be registered for the ensuing election.
 - (iii) Notice that the applicant must be a citizen of the United States for at least one month prior to the next election and a resident of this Commonwealth and the election district for at least 30 days and must be at least 18 years of age by the day of the next ensuing election and has not been confined in a penal institution for a conviction of a felony within the last five years.

The notice required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration under subsection (b).

- (iv) Notice that political party enrollment is mandatory to vote in a primary election of a political party.
- nonforwardable mail to the applicant a voter's identification card upon acceptance of the application and that the applicant should contact the commission if the identification card is not received within 14 days from the date the application is sent to the registration office[.] or submitted electronically to the department under section 1325.1. In the event that the applicant's electronic registration application did not contain a signature, the registration card shall contain a notice that the registered elector must provide a signature the first time the registered elector votes after submission of the electronic voter registration application.
- (vi) Notice that registration is not complete until the application is processed and accepted by the commission or, if submitted electronically under section 1325.1, processed and accepted by the department.
- (vii) A warning to the applicant that making a false registration or furnishing false information is perjury. The notice required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration under subsection (b).
- (viii) Instructions to Federal or State employees who wish to retain voting residence in county of last residence to so indicate on the application.
 - (ix) Notice that, if an individual declines to

register to vote, the fact that the individual has

declined to register will remain confidential and will be

used only for voter registration purposes. The notice

required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical

to the declaration under subsection (b).

- (x) Notice that, if an individual does register to vote, the office at which the individual submits a voter registration application will remain confidential and will be used for voter registration purposes only. The notices required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration in subsection (b).
- (5) In jurisdictions where there is a single language minority, the [secretary] department may print a bilingual application and develop a bilingual electronic voter registration application.
- (6) In jurisdictions where a single language minority exceeds 5% of the population, <u>in accordance with applicable law</u>, the [secretary] <u>department</u> shall:
 - (i) print a bilingual application and develop a bilingual electronic voter registration application; and
 - (ii) conduct a public educational program among that language group alerting both organizations and individuals of that group of the availability of the bilingual application and encouraging individuals to register.

- 28 * * *
- 29 (3) The registration declaration shall contain the 30 printed name [and signature of the applicant and the date of

- 1 signing.], date of signing and, except for an applicant
- 2 <u>submitting a registration under section 1325.1, the signature</u>
- 3 of the applicant. An applicant unable to sign the voter
- 4 registration application shall make a mark before a person of
- 5 the applicant's choice other than the applicant's employer or
- 6 an agent of the applicant's union. The person shall insert
- 7 the person's name, address and telephone number. If the
- 8 person is an employee or agent of the Department of
- 9 Transportation or another agency as provided under section
- 10 1325 and is assisting the applicant in an official capacity,
- 11 the employee or agent shall insert the initials and
- identification number of the employee or agent. In the case
- of applicants registering under section 1323 or 1325, the
- 14 person providing assistance shall insert initials or employee
- or agent identification number on a separate or detachable
- portion of the application or computer data file.
- 17 (4) The official registration application shall contain
- 18 a notice entitled "PENALTY FOR FALSIFYING DECLARATION." The
- notice shall advise the applicant that if a person signs an
- 20 official registration application or submits an electronic
- 21 registration application or a change to registration form
- 22 under section 1325.1 or 1325.2 (relating to electronic
- 23 submission of changes to registration), knowing a statement
- declared in the application to be false, the person commits
- 25 perjury. The notice shall specify the penalty for perjury.

- 27 § 1328. Approval of registration applications.
- 28 (a) Examination. -- Upon receiving a voter registration
- 29 application, a commissioner, clerk or registrar of a commission
- 30 shall do all of the following:

2 (2) Examine the application to determine all of the following:

- (i) Whether the application is complete. The lack of

 an applicant's signature on an application submitted

 under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter

 registration) shall not be grounds for rejecting an

 otherwise valid application.
 - (ii) Whether the applicant is a qualified elector.
- 10 (iii) Whether the applicant has an existing
 11 registration record. After the commission is connected to
 12 the SURE system, the commissioner, clerk or registrar
 13 shall search the SURE system on a Statewide basis to
 14 determine if the applicant has an existing registration
 15 record.
- 16 (iv) Whether the applicant is entitled or qualified
 17 to receive the requested transfer or change, if
 18 applicable.

- 20 § 1401. General register.
- 21 (a) General rule. -- The general register shall contain all of 22 the following for each registered elector of the county:

- 24 (5) The digitized or electronic signature of the
 25 registered elector. In the case of an elector permitted to
 26 submit a signature the first time the elector votes after
 27 submitting an electronic voter registration application under
 28 section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter registration),
 29 the commission shall enter the elector's signature on the

elector's registration record as soon as practicable after

- 1 <u>the election. The elector shall not be subject to the</u>
- 2 provisions of section 1210(a.3)(2) of the act of June 3, 1937
- 3 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,

- 8 * * *
- 9 (b) Computer lists.--
- 10 * * *
- 11 (2) After a commission is connected to the SURE system,
- 12 each commission shall create from its general register a
- computer list to be used as the district register. For each
- 14 election district, the list shall contain the names of the
- 15 registered electors of the election district, alphabetically
- by last name of each registered elector. Each page of the
- 17 list shall contain the name of the county, the election
- 18 district, the date of the election and the date and time the
- 19 list was prepared. The computer list shall be in a form
- 20 prescribed by the secretary and must contain necessary
- information that would otherwise be available in the general
- register, including, except for an elector permitted to
- 23 submit a signature at the polling place the first time the
- 24 elector votes after submitting an electronic voter
- 25 <u>registration application under section 1325.1 (relating to</u>
- 26 electronic voter registration), a legible digitized or
- 27 electronic signature, the street address and political party
- of each registered elector, and suitable space for insertion
- of the signature of the registered elector and for insertion
- 30 by the proper election official of the number and letter of

- 1 the stub of the ballot issued to the registered elector or

- 5 whether the elector needs assistance to vote and, if so, the

- 12 (a) Commission. -- By March 1, a commission shall submit to
- 13 the secretary an annual report setting forth the number of
- 14 electors registered under sections 1322 (relating to in-person
- 15 voter registration), 1323 (relating to application with driver's
- 16 license application), 1324 (relating to application by mail)
- 17 [and], 1325 (relating to government agencies) and 1325.1
- 18 <u>(relating to electronic voter registration)</u>. The report shall
- 19 specify the number of electors whose registration has been
- 20 canceled under Chapter 15 (relating to changes in records) and
- 21 any other information required by the secretary.

- 24 * * *
- 25 (b) Use.--A registered elector who removes residence from
- 26 one place to another within the same county must notify the
- 27 commission by filing a removal notice under subsection (a) or a
- 28 signed request for [renewal] removal that contains the
- 29 information required in subsection (a) with the commission not
- 30 later than the registration deadline before an election. If

- 1 mailed, the notice or request must be postmarked not later than
- 2 the deadline for registration or, in the case of an illegible or
- 3 missing postmark, received within five days of the close of
- 4 registration. The following apply:
- 5 (1) An official registration application of an elector
- 6 who has registered by mail or electronic voter registration
- 7 <u>application</u> qualifies as a removal notice.

- 9 § 1503. Change of enrollment of political party.
- 10 By the deadline for registration, a registered elector who
- 11 desires to change the enrollment of political designation or
- 12 who, although registered, has not previously enrolled as a
- 13 member of a party may appear before a commissioner, registrar or
- 14 clerk or may submit an application by mail under section 1324
- 15 (relating to application by mail) [and state in a signed] or
- 16 electronically under section 1325.2 (relating to electronic
- 17 <u>submission of changes to registration</u>). In a case other than
- 18 <u>submission under section 1325.2</u>, the registered elector shall
- 19 <u>state in a signed</u> writing the political party in which the
- 20 registered elector desires to be enrolled. If the signature of
- 21 the elector is verified by comparison with the registered
- 22 elector's signature as it appears on file with the commission,
- 23 the commissioner, registrar or clerk shall make the change in
- 24 its registration records. [If] In a case other than submission
- 25 <u>under section 1325.2, if</u> supported by other evidence of
- 26 identity, a mark may be made in lieu of a signature by a
- 27 registered elector who is unable to write. The mark must be made
- 28 in the presence of a witness who must sign the registration
- 29 application. For submissions under section 1325.2, the
- 30 registered elector shall follow the procedure for verification

- 1 of the registered elector's identity specified in section 1325.1
- 2 <u>(relating to electronic voter registration).</u>
- 3 § 1704. Altering registration.
- 4 (a) Prohibition. -- No registrar, commissioner, clerk or
- 5 assistant [or]_ commission employee or other individual may do
- 6 any of the following:
- 7 (1) Intentionally insert or permit to be inserted an
- 8 entry in a registration record without a proper application
- 9 under this part or without requiring the proper evidence of
- 10 the right of the applicant to be registered.
- 11 (2) Intentionally materially alter a registration record
- 12 after the entries have been made unless the alteration is in
- accordance with this part. This paragraph does not apply to
- an alteration pursuant to an order of a court of common pleas
- or of a commission.
- 16 (3) Intentionally submit false information regarding a
- change of party enrollment or name or address on a
- 18 registration record of another individual.

- 20 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
