AN ACT

1	Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled
2	"An act concerning elections, including general, municipal,
3	special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates,
4	primary and election expenses and election contests; creating
5	and defining membership of county boards of elections;
6	imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth,
7	courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners;
8	imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying,
9	revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and
10	repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to
11	elections," in voting by qualified absentee electors, further
12 13	providing for date of application for absentee ballot and for canvassing of official absentee ballots and mail-in ballots;
14	and, in voting by qualified mail-in electors, further
15	providing for date of application for mail-in ballot.
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16	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
17	hereby enacts as follows:
18	Section 1. Section 1302.1(a) and (a.3)(1) and (2) of the act
19	of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania
20	Election Code, are amended to read:
21	Section 1302.1. Date of Application for Absentee Ballot
22	(a) Except as provided in subsection (a.3), applications for
23	absentee ballots shall be received in the office of the county
24	board of elections not earlier than fifty (50) days before the

primary or election, except that if a county board of elections 1 2 determines that it would be appropriate to its operational needs, any applications for absentee ballots received more than 3 4 fifty (50) days before the primary or election may be processed before that time. Applications for absentee ballots shall be 5 processed if received not later than five o'clock P.M. of the 6 [first Tuesday] <u>fifteenth day</u> prior to the day of any primary or 7 election. 8

9 (a.3) (1) The following categories of electors may apply 10 for an absentee ballot under this subsection, if otherwise 11 qualified:

(i) An elector whose physical disability or illness
prevented the elector from applying for an absentee ballot
before five o'clock P.M. on the [first Tuesday] <u>fifteenth day</u>
prior to the day of the primary or election.

16 (ii) An elector who, because of the elector's business, 17 duties or occupation, was unable to apply for an absentee ballot 18 before five o'clock P.M. on the [first Tuesday] fifteenth day 19 prior to the day of the primary or election.

20 (iii) An elector who becomes so physically disabled or ill 21 after five o'clock P.M. on the [first Tuesday] <u>fifteenth day</u> 22 prior to the day of the primary or election that the elector is 23 unable to appear at the polling place on the day of the primary 24 or election.

(iv) An elector who, because of the conduct of the elector's business, duties or occupation, will necessarily be absent from the elector's municipality of residence on the day of the primary or election, which fact was not and could not reasonably be known to the elector on or before five o'clock P.M. on the [first Tuesday] fifteenth day prior to the day of the primary or

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1 election.

2 (2) An elector described in paragraph (1) may submit an 3 application for an absentee ballot at any time up until the time of the closing of the polls on the day of the primary or 4 election. The application shall include a declaration describing 5 the circumstances that prevented the elector from applying for 6 an absentee ballot before five o'clock P.M. on the [first 7 Tuesday] <u>fifteenth day</u> prior to the day of the primary or 8 9 election or that prevent the elector from appearing at the 10 polling place on the day of the primary or election, and the elector's qualifications under paragraph (1). The declaration 11 12 shall be made subject to the provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 13 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities).

15 Section 2. Section 1308(g)(1.1) of the act, amended March 16 27, 2020 (P.L.41, No.12), is amended to read:

Section 1308. Canvassing of Official Absentee Ballots and Mail-in Ballots.--* * *

19 (g) * * *

20 (1.1) The county board of elections shall meet no earlier 21 than [seven o'clock A.M. on] <u>twenty-one (21) days prior to</u> 22 election day to pre-canvass all ballots received prior to the 23 meeting. A county board of elections shall provide at least 24 forty-eight hours' notice of a pre-canvass meeting by publicly 25 posting a notice of a pre-canvass meeting on its publicly 26 accessible Internet website. One authorized representative of 27 each candidate in an election and one representative from each political party shall be permitted to remain in the room in 28 29 which the absentee ballots and mail-in ballots are precanvassed. No person observing, attending or participating in a 30

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1 pre-canvass meeting may disclose the results of any portion of 2 any pre-canvass meeting prior to the close of the polls. 3 * * *

4 Section 3. Section 1302.1-D(a) of the act is amended to 5 read:

6 Section 1302.1-D. Date of application for mail-in ballot.

7 (a) General rule.--Applications for mail-in ballots shall be 8 received in the office of the county board of elections not earlier than 50 days before the primary or election, except that 9 10 if a county board of elections determines that it would be appropriate to the county board of elections' operational needs, 11 any applications for mail-in ballots received more than 50 days 12 13 before the primary or election may be processed before that 14 time. Applications for mail-in ballots shall be processed if received not later than five o'clock P.M. of the [first Tuesday] 15 16 fifteenth day prior to the day of any primary or election. * * * 17

18 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
