AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in professional and occupational
- licenses, providing for military medical personnel pilot
- 4 program.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 7504. Military medical personnel pilot program.
- 10 (a) Establishment. -- The Department of Health and the
- 11 Department of State, in consultation with the department, shall
- 12 establish a pilot program in which military medical personnel
- 13 may practice and perform certain delegated duties that
- 14 constitute the practice of medicine under the supervision of a
- 15 physician or podiatrist who holds an active, unrestricted
- 16 license issued by the Commonwealth. The duties shall reflect the
- 17 level of training and experience of the military medical
- 18 personnel. The supervising physician or podiatrist shall retain

- 1 <u>responsibility for the care of the patient.</u>
- 2 (b) Participation. -- A licensed physician, podiatrist,
- 3 hospital or medical facility that is supervised by one or more
- 4 physicians or podiatrists may participate in the pilot program.
- 5 (c) Participation requirements. -- The Department of Health
- 6 and the Department of State, in consultation with the
- 7 <u>department</u>, shall establish general requirements for
- 8 participating military medical personnel, licensees and
- 9 <u>employers.</u>
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
