1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13	Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs of the Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," further providing for eligibility requirements for examination, for limited licenses and for duration and renewal of licenses.
14	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
15	hereby enacts as follows:
16	Section 1. Sections 4, 5 and 19 of the act of May 3, 1933
17	(P.L.242, No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology Law, are
18	amended to read:
19	Section 4. Eligibility Requirements for Examination(a)
20	No person shall be permitted by the board to receive a license
21	as a cosmetologist unless such person (1) shall be at least
22	sixteen years of age and of good moral character at the time of
23	making application, and (2) shall have <u>(i)</u> completed a tenth

1 grade education or the equivalent thereof, or in lieu of such 2 education or the equivalent thereof shall have received training 3 from or under the auspices of the Bureau of Rehabilitation in the Department of Labor and Industry, and (ii) completed one 4 hour of domestic violence and sexual assault awareness training 5 as approved by the board, and (3) shall have either (i) 6 7 completed not less than one thousand two hundred fifty hours as 8 a student in a duly registered school of cosmetology as hereinafter provided in this act, or (ii) shall have been 9 10 registered and served as an apprentice at least two thousand 11 hours in a licensed cosmetology salon as hereinafter provided in 12 this act. The application shall be accompanied by a notarized 13 statement from either the licensed cosmetology school the 14 applicant attended or the licensed cosmetology teacher in the 15 licensed cosmetology salon where the applicant studied and 16 trained, stating that the applicant has completed the study and 17 training period required under this act.

18 (b) An applicant wishing to obtain licensure in the practice 19 of cosmetology may be permitted to apply to take the written 20 examination upon completion of at least nine hundred hours of 21 instruction in a duly licensed school of cosmetology. The examination shall include both theoretical and procedural skill 22 23 questions as prescribed by the board. Any applicant may apply 24 and is eligible for licensure upon (1) passing the written 25 examination, (2) completion of the required one thousand two 26 hundred fifty hours of instruction, [and] (3) certification by a duly licensed school of satisfactory completion of all program 27 28 requirements, and (4) completion of one hour of domestic 29 violence and sexual assault awareness training as approved by the board. 30

1 No person shall be permitted to receive a license to (C) 2 teach cosmetology or natural hair braiding, nail technology or 3 esthetics unless such person shall have a license to practice cosmetology or a limited license, be at least eighteen years of 4 5 age, shall have completed a twelfth grade education or the equivalent thereof, has completed one hour of domestic violence_ 6 7 and sexual assault awareness training as approved by the board 8 and have had five hundred hours of specialized training as set forth in section 6 of this act which hours shall be in addition 9 10 to the hours necessary to qualify for a license to practice cosmetology or a limited license. 11

12 An applicant for a license to teach cosmetology, natural (d) hair braiding, nail technology or esthetics shall be permitted 13 to take a written examination upon completion of at least four 14 15 hundred hours of the specialized training required. The 16 examination shall include both theoretical and procedural skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any applicant may apply 17 18 and is eligible for licensure upon (1) passing the written 19 examination, (2) completion of the required five hundred hours 20 of instruction, [and] (3) certification by a duly licensed school of satisfactory completion of all program requirements, 21 and (4) completion of one hour of domestic violence and sexual 22 23 assault awareness training as approved by the board.

Section 5. Limited Licenses.--(a) An applicant for a limited license shall be at least sixteen years of age, be of good moral character, have completed a tenth grade education or the equivalent thereof and pay the applicable fee to the board. (b) The board shall issue the following limited licenses to qualified applicants:

engage in the practice of esthetics only. An applicant for an 1 2 esthetician license shall have completed three hundred hours of 3 instruction in esthetics in a licensed school of cosmetology and passed an examination limited to that practice. Licensed 4 estheticians may operate a salon limited to that license. An 5 6 applicant may be permitted to apply to take a written 7 examination upon completion of at least two hundred fifty hours 8 of instruction in esthetics in a licensed school of cosmetology. The examination shall include both theoretical and procedural 9 10 skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any applicant may apply and is eligible for licensure upon (i) passing the written 11 12 examination, (ii) completion of the required three hundred hours 13 of instruction, [and] (iii) certification by a duly licensed 14 school of satisfactory completion of all program requirements, and (iv) completion of one hour of domestic violence and sexual 15 16 assault awareness training as approved by the board.

17 Nail technician license, which shall authorize the (2) 18 holder to engage in the practice of nail technology only. An 19 applicant for a nail technician license shall have completed two 20 hundred hours of instruction in nail technology in a licensed school of cosmetology and passed an examination limited to that 21 practice. Licensed nail technicians may operate a salon limited 22 23 to that license. An applicant may be permitted to take a written 24 examination upon completion of at least one hundred fifty hours 25 of instruction in nail technology in a licensed school of 26 cosmetology. The examination shall include both theoretical and 27 procedural skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any 28 applicant may apply and is eligible for licensure upon (i) 29 passing the written examination, (ii) completion of the required two hundred hours of instruction, [and] (iii) certification by a 30

duly licensed school of satisfactory completion of all program
 requirements, and (iv) completion of one hour of domestic
 <u>violence and sexual assault awareness training as approved by</u>
 <u>the board</u>.

5 (i) Natural hair braiding license, which shall (3) 6 authorize the holder to engage in the practice of natural hair braiding only. An applicant for a natural hair braiding license 7 8 shall have completed three hundred hours of board-approved subjects relating to sanitation, scalp care, anatomy and natural 9 10 hair braiding in a cosmetology school and passed an examination 11 limited to that practice. Licensed natural hair braiders may operate a salon limited to that license. An applicant may be 12 13 permitted to take a written examination upon completion of at 14 least two hundred fifty hours of instruction in natural hair 15 braiding in a licensed school of cosmetology. The examination 16 shall include both theoretical and procedural skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any applicant may apply and is eligible 17 18 for licensure upon (A) passing the written examination, (B) 19 completion of the required three hundred hours of board-approved 20 subjects, [and] (C) certification by a duly licensed school of 21 satisfactory completion of all program requirements, and (D) 22 completion of one hour of domestic violence and sexual assault 23 awareness training as approved by the board.

(ii) The requirements of paragraph (3)(i) shall not apply and a license to practice natural hair braiding shall be issued to an applicant who:

(A) has submitted an application, along with the required
fee, within one year of the board's promulgation of final
regulations required under this section; and

30 (B) can demonstrate proof of practice of natural hair

braiding for three consecutive years immediately prior to the 1 2 date of application for licensure. Proof of practice shall 3 require tax records of employment and an affidavit from the applicant and the applicant's immediate supervisor where 4 applicable. The board shall accept the information provided 5 without penalty to the applicant for failure to comply with 6 7 licensing provisions prior to the effective date of this 8 subsection.

9 (c) Within two years of the initial issuance of a license 10 under subsection (b)(3)(ii), the licensee shall provide the board with proof that the licensee completed one hundred fifty 11 hours of education from a school of cosmetology and one hour of 12 13 domestic violence and sexual assault awareness training as approved by the board as a condition of renewal of the license. 14 The courses shall include, at a minimum, scalp care, hygiene and 15 16 occupational safety.

17 Section 19. Duration and Renewal of Licenses. -- (a) With the 18 period ending January 31, 1986, the Bureau of Professional and 19 Occupational Affairs shall designate approximately one-half of 20 the renewals to expire in twelve months and the remainder of the renewals to expire in twenty-four months. Thereafter, licenses 21 shall expire on the thirty-first day of January of each 22 23 succeeding biennium unless renewed for the next biennium. 24 Licenses may be renewed by application made prior to the thirty-25 first day of January of each succeeding biennium, and the payment of the renewal fees provided in this act. 26

(b) An individual holding a license to practice cosmetology or an individual holding a limited license who is not engaged in practice shall request the board, in writing, to place his license in escrow and thus protect his right to obtain a license

at any such time within a five-year period if he desires to 1 again become engaged in the practice of cosmetology or the 2 3 practice of nail technology, natural hair braiding or esthetics. Any person who fails to renew his license or has 4 (C) escrowed his license for a period of five years without renewing 5 his license shall, prior to receiving a license, submit to and 6 7 pass an examination appropriate to the license being sought. 8 (d) Any person who fails to meet the one hour of domestic 9 violence and sexual assault awareness training requirement provided in this act shall not be eligible for renewal until the 10 training has been completed. Proof of completion of the training 11 12 shall be submitted with the appropriate application to the board 13 at the time of renewal for any person who has not completed the 14 training requirement prior to the issuance of their initial 15 license. 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
