7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Short title.
9	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Professional
10	and Occupational Licensing Information Disclosure Act.
11	Section 2. Definitions.
12	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
13	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
14	context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	"Licensing board or commission." An administrative board or
16	commission under the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
17	Affairs in the Department of State.
18	Section 3. Disclosure of information.
19	(a) General ruleExcept if required or requested by a

criminal justice agency, or if disclosure to a noncriminal 1 2 justice agency is authorized or required by law, an individual 3 who has a license, registration, certification or permit from a licensing board or commission to practice in this Commonwealth 4 may not be required or requested to disclose information to any 5 entity or person relating to a complaint filed with, or 6 investigation or inquiry by, the Department of State or Bureau 7 8 of Professional and Occupational Affairs on behalf of any licensing board or commission, when the complaint, investigation 9 10 or inquiry was closed without the filing of disciplinary charges 11 or the imposition of any type of civil penalty against the 12 individual or the individual's license, registration, 13 certification or permit. This prohibition includes the closing 14 of the complaint, investigation or inquiry without further 15 action, regardless of whether the licensing board or commission 16 reserves the right to re-open the complaint, investigation or inquiry. 17

(b) Response to information request.--An individual required or requested to provide information in violation of this section may respond as if the complaint, investigation or inquiry did not occur.

(c) Nonapplicability.--This section shall not apply if 22 23 Federal or State law or regulations require the consideration of 24 a complaint, investigation or inquiry provided for in subsection 25 (a) for purposes of employment to practice a profession under a 26 license, registration, certification or permit issued by a licensing board or commission. If a Federal or State law or 27 28 regulation exists, the entity requiring or requesting the 29 information shall provide a citation and summary of the law or regulation to the individual. 30
