## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in school directors, further
- 6 providing for school director training programs.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 328(a) of the act of March 10, 1949
- 10 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
- 11 amended to read:
- 12 Section 328. School Director Training Programs. -- (a)
- 13 Beginning in the 2018-2019 school year and in each school year
- 14 thereafter, the following shall apply:
- 15 (1) Each newly elected or appointed school director shall
- 16 complete, during the first year of the school director's first
- 17 term, a training program [made available by the Department of
- 18 Education, in consultation with a Statewide organization

- 1 representing school directors and a Statewide organization
- 2 representing school business officials, ], AS OUTLINED IN
- 3 PARAGRAPH (3) AND THAT HAS BEEN REVIEWED AND APPROVED BY THE
- 4 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR LEGAL COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE

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- 5 FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS AND REGULATIONS, pertaining to the skills
- 6 and knowledge necessary to serve as a school director. The
- 7 training program shall consist of a minimum of five (5) hours of
- 8 instruction, including, at a minimum, information regarding the
- 9 following:
- 10 (i) Instruction and academic programs.
- 11 (i.1) Best practices related to trauma-informed approaches,
- 12 which shall comprise a minimum of one (1) hour of instruction.
- 13 (ii) Personnel.
- 14 (iii) Fiscal management.
- 15 (iv) Operations.
- 16 (v) Governance.
- 17 (vi) Ethics and open meetings, to include the requirements
- 18 under 65 Pa.C.S. Pt. II (relating to accountability).
- 19 (2) Within one (1) year after each reelection or
- 20 reappointment to the board of school directors, each school
- 21 director shall complete an advanced training program [made
- 22 available by the Department of Education in consultation with a
- 23 Statewide organization representing school directors and a
- 24 Statewide organization representing school business officials.
- 25 The advanced training program], AS OUTLINED IN PARAGRAPH (3) AND <--
- 26 THAT HAS BEEN REVIEWED AND APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 27 EDUCATION FOR LEGAL COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE FEDERAL AND
- 28 STATE LAWS AND REGULATIONS, which shall consist of a minimum of
- 29 three (3) hours of instruction, including information on
- 30 relevant changes to Federal and State [public school] law and

- 1 regulations, fiscal management, trauma-informed approaches and
- 2 other information deemed appropriate by the Department of
- 3 Education to enable the school director to serve effectively.
- 4 (3) The training programs required under this subsection
- 5 shall be made available by the Department of Education [at no
- 6 cost to school districts or school directors. The Department of
- 7 Education shall approve alternative training programs that
- 8 fulfill the requirements of this subsection which may be
- 9 provided by school districts, intermediate units, postsecondary
- 10 institutions or Statewide education organizations. The
- 11 department shall post on its publicly accessible Internet
- 12 website all alternative training programs approved under this
- 13 paragraph.] which shall contract with AUTHORIZE a Statewide
- 14 <u>education organization that represents school directors to</u> <--

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- 15 <u>administer the training programs.</u> AT LEAST SEVENTY-FIVE (75) PER\_<--
- 16 CENTUM OF SCHOOL BOARDS, HAS EXPERIENCE PROVIDING TRAINING THAT
- 17 MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AND HAS ACTED AS A
- 18 STATEWIDE PROVIDER FOR AT LEAST THREE (3) YEARS. The Statewide
- 19 education organization which represents school directors shall
- 20 have the following duties:
- 21 (i) Prepare and offer the APPROVED training programs at no <--
- 22 cost to school districts or school directors.
- 23 (ii) Recommend quality alternative training programs to the
- 24 Department of Education that fulfill the requirements of this
- 25 subsection and that are consistent with the training programs
- 26 offered by the Statewide education organization which represents
- 27 <u>school directors</u>, which may be provided by school districts,
- 28 intermediate units, postsecondary institutions or other
- 29 Statewide education organizations. Training programs provided
- 30 under this subparagraph MUST BE REVIEWED AND APPROVED BY THE

- 1 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR LEGAL COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE
- 2 FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS AND REGULATIONS AND shall be offered at
- 3 no cost to a school district or school director.
- 4 (3.1) The Department of Education shall post the
- 5 requirements of this subsection and information on where to
- 6 access the training programs provided for under paragraph (3)(i)
- 7 on the Department of Education's publicly accessible Internet
- 8 website.
- 9 (3.2) The Department of Education shall approve only
- 10 alternative training programs recommended by the Statewide
- 11 <u>education organization under paragraph (3)(ii) and post</u>
- 12 information on alternative training programs on the Department
- 13 of Education's publicly accessible Internet website. Approval of
- 14 alternative training programs shall expire two (2) years
- 15 <u>following the date of approval and may be renewed in accordance</u>
- 16 with this section.
- 17 (4) This subsection shall apply to members of a school
- 18 reform commission established under section 696, provided that
- 19 the training programs provided to members of a school reform
- 20 commission shall include information regarding sections 693 and
- 21 696 and other information deemed appropriate to enable a member
- 22 of a school reform commission to serve effectively.
- 23 (5) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to
- 24 prohibit a Statewide education organization representing school
- 25 directors from offering different training programs or other
- 26 learning activities in addition to the training programs
- 27 required under this subsection at an additional cost to a school
- 28 district or school director.
- 29 <u>(6) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL DEEM THE STATEWIDE</u>
- 30 <u>EDUCATION ORGANIZATION AS A STATE-AFFILIATED ENTITY.</u>

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- 1 (7) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE
- 2 DUTY AND AUTHORITY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ADMINISTER
- 3 ALL LAWS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT,
- 4 MAINTENANCE AND CONDUCT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 5 FEDERAL AND STATE LAW, INCLUDING SECTION 1302 OF THE ACT OF
- 6 APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177, NO.175), KNOWN AS "THE ADMINISTRATIVE
- 7 <u>CODE OF 1929."</u>

- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
