AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled "An act relating to the finances of the State government; 2 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for ambulatory surgical center data collection and for the Joint Underwriting Association, providing for the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all 5 6 other accounts due the Commonwealth, the collection and 7 recovery of fees and other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, including 9 escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, the custody 10 and disbursement or other disposition of funds and securities 11 belonging to or in the possession of the Commonwealth, and 12 the settlement of claims against the Commonwealth, the 13 resettlement of accounts and appeals to the courts, refunds 14 of moneys erroneously paid to the Commonwealth, auditing the 15 accounts of the Commonwealth and all agencies thereof, of all 16 public officers collecting moneys payable to the 17 18 Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, authorizing the 19 Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes to defray 20 21 current expenses, implementing the provisions of section 7(a) 22 of Article VIII of the Constitution of Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of certain debt and 23 imposing penalties; affecting every department, board, 24 commission, and officer of the State government, every 25 political subdivision of the State, and certain officers of 26 such subdivisions, every person, association, and corporation 27 28 required to pay, assess, or collect taxes, or to make returns 29 or reports under the laws imposing taxes for State purposes, 30 or to pay license fees or other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, every State depository and every 31 debtor or creditor of the Commonwealth," in Treasury 32

- 1 Department, further providing for funds.
- 2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 3 hereby enacts as follows:
- 4 Section 1. Section 302 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343,
- 5 No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, is amended to read:
- 6 Section 302. Funds. -- (a) The moneys paid into the State
- 7 Treasury, and the moneys of which the State Treasurer is
- 8 custodian, shall be credited by the Treasury Department to the
- 9 following funds, as hereinafter provided:
- 10 Agricultural College Land Scrip Fund,
- 11 Banking [Department] Fund,
- 12 Federal Vocational Education Fund,
- 13 Fire Insurance Tax Fund,
- 14 Fish Fund,
- 15 Game Fund,
- 16 General Fund,
- 17 Liquid Fuels Tax Fund,
- 18 Manufacturing Fund,
- 19 Motor License Fund,
- 20 School Employes' Retirement Fund,
- 21 Sinking Fund,
- 22 State College Experimental Farm Fund,
- 23 State Employes' Retirement Fund,
- 24 State Farm Products Show Fund,
- 25 State Insurance Fund,
- 26 State School Fund,
- 27 State [Workmen's] Workers' Insurance Fund,
- 28 Surplus Commodities Stamp Fund,
- 29 Historical Preservation Fund,
- 30 Vocational Rehabilitation Fund,

- 1 Rehabilitation Center Fund.
- 2 1. Agricultural College Land Scrip Fund. -- The \$500,000
- 3 derived from the sale of lands and scrip, donated to the
- 4 Commonwealth for the establishment of a college for the benefit
- 5 of agriculture and the mechanical arts by the act of Congress,
- 6 approved July second, one thousand eight hundred sixty-two
- 7 (Chapter one hundred thirty, twelve Statutes, five hundred
- 8 three), entitled "An act donating public lands to the several
- 9 states and territories which may provide colleges for the
- 10 benefit of agriculture and the mechanic arts," or the
- 11 investments representing the same, shall be credited by the
- 12 Treasury Department to the Agricultural College Land Scrip Fund.
- 2. Banking [Department] Fund.--All moneys received by the
- 14 Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue, arising from
- 15 fees, assessments, charges, and penalties, collected or
- 16 recovered from persons, firms, corporations, or associations,
- 17 under the supervision of the Department of Banking and
- 18 <u>Securities</u>, and from the sale by the Department of [Property and
- 19 Supplies] General Services of unserviceable property originally
- 20 paid for out of the Banking [Department] Fund, shall be credited
- 21 to the Banking [Department] Fund.
- 4. Federal Vocational Education Fund. -- All moneys received
- 23 by the Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue
- 24 arising from annual appropriations from the Federal Government
- 25 to this Commonwealth for the advancement of vocational
- 26 education, shall be credited to the Federal Vocational Education
- 27 Fund.
- 28 5. Fire Insurance Tax Fund. -- All moneys received by the
- 29 Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue arising from
- 30 the two per centum tax paid upon premiums received by foreign

- 1 fire insurance companies from business done within this
- 2 Commonwealth, shall be credited to the Fire Insurance Tax Fund.
- 3 6. Fish Fund. -- All moneys received by the Treasury
- 4 Department from the Department of Revenue arising from license
- 5 fees, fines, penalties, and other moneys paid, received,
- 6 recovered, and collected, under the fish laws, and from the sale
- 7 by the Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services of
- 8 unserviceable property originally paid for out of the Fish Fund,
- 9 shall be credited to the Fish Fund.
- 7. Game Fund. -- All moneys received by the Treasury
- 11 Department from the Department of Revenue arising from license
- 12 fees, fines, penalties, and other moneys paid, received,
- 13 recovered, and collected, under the game laws, and from the sale
- 14 by the Department of [Property and Supplies] General Services of
- 15 unserviceable property originally paid for out of the Game Fund,
- 16 shall be credited to the Game Fund.
- 17 8. General Fund. -- All moneys received by the Treasury
- 18 Department from the Department of Revenue, or from any other
- 19 source, which are not by this act required to be credited to any
- 20 other fund, shall be credited to the General Fund.
- 21 9. Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. -- That portion of the liquid fuels
- 22 tax received by the Treasury Department from the Department of
- 23 Revenue, which is directed by law to be returned to the
- 24 counties, shall be credited to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.
- 25 10. Manufacturing Fund. -- All moneys received by the Treasury
- 26 Department from the Department of Revenue arising from the
- 27 industries established and maintained by the Department of
- 28 [Justice] <u>Corrections</u> in State institutions, and from the
- 29 employment of inmates in maintenance activities, and from the
- 30 sale by the Department of [Property and Supplies] General_

- 1 <u>Services</u> of unserviceable property originally paid for out of
- 2 the Manufacturing Fund, shall be credited to the Manufacturing
- 3 Fund.
- 4 11. Motor License Fund. -- All moneys received by the Treasury
- 5 Department from the Department of Revenue arising from title
- 6 registration and license fees, fines, penalties, bail forfeited,
- 7 and other miscellaneous receipts, collected or recovered under
- 8 the motor laws; from the collection of any portion of the Liquid
- 9 Fuels Tax, not directed by law to be returned to the counties;
- 10 from contributions by the Federal Government and political
- 11 subdivisions of this Commonwealth for the improvement,
- 12 maintenance, and rebuilding of highways within this
- 13 Commonwealth; from the sale of highway bulletins and maps; from
- 14 the sale by the Department of [Property and Supplies] General
- 15 <u>Services</u> of unserviceable State property originally paid for out
- 16 of the Motor License Fund; from fees for permits authorizing
- 17 work on State or township highways and restoration charges,
- 18 license fees for occupancy of bridges, restoration charges and
- 19 payments on agreements to which the Commonwealth has succeeded
- 20 upon taking over county bridges; from amounts received from
- 21 utility companies covering the cost of constructing facilities
- 22 over or rentals for the use of bridges; from forfeited checks,
- 23 fees for certifying records of the Department of [Highways]
- 24 Transportation, amounts recovered for damage to or loss of
- 25 equipment of said department, rentals for equipment of said
- 26 department, liquidated damages on highway contracts; and from
- 27 tolls collected on intrastate toll bridges, acquired by the
- 28 Commonwealth, and paid for out of the Motor License Fund, -- shall
- 29 be credited to the Motor License Fund.
- 30 12. School Employes' Retirement Fund. -- All moneys in the

- 1 School Employes' Contingent Reserve Fund, the School Employes'
- 2 Annuity Reserve Fund, the School Employes' State Annuity Reserve
- 3 Fund, and the School Employes; State Annuity Reserve Fund Number
- 4 Two, shall, upon the effective date of this act, be consolidated
- 5 into one fund, to be known as the School Employes' Retirement
- 6 Fund, and thereafter the Treasury Department shall credit to the
- 7 School Employes' Retirement Fund all moneys received by it from
- 8 the Department of Revenue, arising from (a) payments by the
- 9 Commonwealth of such amounts, certified by the School Employes'
- 10 Retirement Board as necessary to pay the State annuity to each
- 11 new entrant in the School Employes' Retirement System, (b)
- 12 deductions from the salaries of contributors in the School
- 13 Employes' Retirement System, and (c) payments by the
- 14 Commonwealth of amounts necessary to accumulate a reserve to pay
- 15 all State annuity payments to present employes when due.
- 16 13. Sinking Fund. -- All moneys received by the Treasury
- 17 Department from the Department of Revenue arising from State
- 18 appropriations to meet State road bond sinking fund
- 19 requirements, shall be credited to the Sinking Fund. The sum of
- 20 one hundred forty-one thousand three hundred twenty dollars and
- 21 twenty-six cents (\$141,320.26), which is necessary for the
- 22 payment of bonds and obligations of the Commonwealth which have
- 23 never been presented for redemption, shall continue to be
- 24 credited to the Sinking Fund.
- 25 14. State College Experimental Farm Fund.--All moneys
- 26 derived from the sale of eastern and western experimental farms
- 27 of State College, which were originally purchased from Federal
- 28 moneys appropriated by the act of Congress, approved July
- 29 second, one thousand eight hundred sixty-two (Chapter one
- 30 hundred thirty, twelve Statutes, five hundred three), entitled

- 1 "An act donating lands to the several states and territories
- 2 which may provide colleges for the benefit of agriculture and
- 3 the mechanic arts," or the investments representing the same,
- 4 shall be credited to the State College Experimental Farm Fund.
- 5 15. State Employes' Retirement Fund.--All moneys in the
- 6 State Employes' Contingent Reverse Fund, the State Employes'
- 7 Annuity Reserve Fund, the State Employes' Annuity Savings Fund,
- 8 the State Employes' State Annuity Reserve Fund, and the State
- 9 Employes' State Annuity Reserve Fund Number Two, shall, upon the
- 10 effective date of this act, be consolidated into one fund to be
- 11 known as the State Employes' Retirement Fund, and thereafter the
- 12 Treasury Department shall credit to the State Employes'
- 13 Retirement Fund all moneys received by it from the Department of
- 14 Revenue, arising from (a) payments by the Commonwealth of such
- 15 amounts, certified by the retirement board as necessary to
- 16 provide a proper reserve to pay the State annuity to all new
- 17 members in the State Employes' Retirement System, (b) deductions
- 18 from the salaries of contributors in the State Employes'
- 19 Retirement System, and (c) payments by the Commonwealth of
- 20 amounts necessary to accumulate a reserve to meet the annuity
- 21 values of all retiring original members in the State Employes'
- 22 Retirement System.
- 23 16. State Farm Products Show Fund. -- All moneys received by
- 24 the Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue, arising
- 25 from the leasing or sub-leasing, by the State Farm Products Show
- 26 Commission, of space to exhibitors, including the departments,
- 27 boards, and commissions of the State Government, the leasing of
- 28 the State Farm Show Building for exhibitions, conventions, or
- 29 other proper purposes, admission and entry fees, and any other
- 30 moneys received or collected by the Department of Revenue as

- 1 agent for the State Farm Products Show Commission, shall be
- 2 credited to the State Farm Products Show Fund.
- 3 17. State Insurance Fund. -- All moneys appropriated from the
- 4 General Fund, or any other fund, to the State Insurance Fund,
- 5 shall be credited to the State Insurance Fund.
- 6 18. State School Fund. -- All moneys received by the Treasury
- 7 Department from all real estate owned by this Commonwealth which
- 8 is not used for State or other public purposes, from all
- 9 escheated estates in this Commonwealth, and from all other
- 10 property or money which shall in any way accrue to such fund,
- 11 whether by devise, gift, or otherwise, shall be credited to the
- 12 State School Fund.
- 13 19. State [Workmen's] Workers' Insurance Fund.--All moneys
- 14 received by the Treasury Department from the Department of
- 15 Revenue arising from the collection of premiums on policies
- 16 issued by the State [Workmen's] Workers' Insurance Board, and
- 17 from the sale by the Department of [Property and Supplies]
- 18 <u>General Services</u> of unserviceable property originally paid for
- 19 out of the State [Workmen's] Workers' Insurance Fund, shall be
- 20 credited to the State [Workmen's] Workers' Insurance Fund.
- 21 21. Surplus Commodities Stamp Fund. -- All moneys received by
- 22 the Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue arising
- 23 from appropriations by the several counties, cities, boroughs,
- 24 incorporated towns and townships for participation in the
- 25 Federal Surplus Commodities Stamp plans, all receipts and
- 26 proceeds resulting from the sale of Federal Surplus Commodities
- 27 Stamps, and all moneys received from insurance covering losses
- 28 of such stamps or the proceeds from the sale of such stamps
- 29 shall be credited to the Surplus Commodities Stamp Fund.
- 30 22. Historical Preservation Fund. -- All moneys received by

- 1 the Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue arising
- 2 from the sale by the Department of [Property and Supplies]
- 3 <u>General Services</u> of publications of the Pennsylvania Historical
- 4 and Museum Commission, and all moneys received from admission
- 5 fees to historical buildings, shall be credited to the
- 6 Historical Preservation Fund.
- 7 23. Vocational Rehabilitation Fund. -- All moneys received by
- 8 the Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue, arising
- 9 from moneys received from the Federal Government and from moneys
- 10 contributed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for vocational
- 11 rehabilitation services and from all other moneys received as a
- 12 result of vocational rehabilitation services or for the
- 13 promotion of vocational rehabilitation services, shall be
- 14 credited to the Vocational Rehabilitation Fund.
- 15 24. Rehabilitation Center Fund.--All moneys received by the
- 16 Treasury Department from the Department of Revenue, arising from
- 17 fees for services rendered by the Rehabilitation Center at
- 18 Johnstown, or from other income received by the Center, shall be
- 19 credited to the Rehabilitation Center Fund.
- 20 <u>(b)</u> All moneys in the State Treasury, and in the possession
- 21 of the State Treasurer as custodian, upon the effective date of
- 22 this act, shall be credited to the funds to which they would be
- 23 credited if thereafter received, and the Treasury Department
- 24 shall notify the Department of Revenue and the Department of the
- 25 Auditor General of the balances in each fund as of such date.
- 26 (c) (1) All fees charged and collected by the Department of
- 27 Environmental Protection, and all administrative fines and
- 28 penalties assessed and collected by the Department of
- 29 Environmental Protection for violations and acts subject to the
- 30 <u>enforcement authority of the Department of Environmental</u>

- 1 Protection regarding activities of the regulated entity that
- 2 require regulatory approval, shall, upon receipt, be immediately
- 3 deposited into the General Fund.
- 4 (2) A fee, administrative fine or penalty collected under
- 5 this section shall only be used for expenditures as authorized
- 6 by an act of the General Assembly enacted after the effective
- 7 date of this subsection.
- 8 (3) As used in this subsection,
- 9 <u>"Application" shall mean a submission to a the Department of</u>
- 10 Environmental Protection by an applicant for:
- 11 <u>(1) A new permit.</u>
- 12 (2) A permit renewal.
- 13 (3) A permit amendment.
- 14 (4) A permit modification.
- 15 <u>(5) A permit transfer.</u>
- 16 (6) A change of ownership of a permit.
- 17 <u>"Fee" shall mean money payable to the Department of</u>
- 18 Environmental Protection for the purchase of a good or service,
- 19 the issuance of a registration, certification, permit or
- 20 license, the performance of an inspection or the filing of any
- 21 legal paper, except for money paid for the purchase of surplus
- 22 property.
- 23 "Permit" shall mean an authorization issued by the Department
- 24 of Environmental Protection that approves the performance of an
- 25 <u>activity under the Department of Environmental Protection's</u>
- 26 jurisdiction. The term includes an authorization permit, a plan
- 27 approval and a registration under a general permit.
- 28 "Regulated entity" shall mean an individual, person,
- 29 organization or corporation that engages in an activity in this
- 30 Commonwealth that requires regulatory approval by the Department

- 1 <u>of Environmental Protection.</u>
- 2 "Regulatory approval" shall mean the approval, clearance or
- 3 other authorization of or recognition by the Department of
- 4 Environmental Protection for:
- 5 <u>(1) A permit.</u>
- 6 (2) An application.
- 7 (3) A license.
- 8 (4) A certificate, excluding any certificate which is issued
- 9 <u>solely for personal use.</u>
- 10 (5) The payment of taxes.
- 11 Section 2. All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar
- 12 as they are inconsistent with the addition of section 302(c) of
- 13 the act.
- 14 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.
