## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for regulations and for violation and penalty.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Section 1021(a) of the act of June 13, 1967
9	(P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended by
10	adding a paragraph to read:
11	Section 1021. Regulations(a) * * *
12	(3) Regulations for state institutions, as defined in
13	section 901, shall include the following provisions:
14	(i) Except as provided under subparagraph (iii), the use of
15	seclusion for any child may not exceed four hours in any twenty-
16	four-hour period without a written court order.
17	(ii) A person operating a facility that fails to obtain a
18	court order under this paragraph prior to seclusion shall be
19	subject to the violations under section 1031.

1	(iii) A seclusion that exceeds four hours shall be supported
2	by facility documentation that describes the child's conduct
3	requiring seclusion and efforts made by staff to end seclusion.
4	(iv) If a child is secluded, the facility shall make a
5	mental health counselor or social worker available to the child
6	as part of the facility's efforts to end seclusion prior to the
7	lapse of the four-hour period.
8	Section 2. Section 1031(a) introductory paragraph of the act
9	is amended to read:
10	Section 1031. Violation; Penalty(a) Any person operating
11	a facility within this Commonwealth without a license required
12	by this act or who violates section 1021(a)(3), shall upon
13	conviction be sentenced as follows:
14	* * *
15	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
