AN ACT

Amending the act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), 1 entitled "An act providing for prescription drug monitoring; 2 creating the ABC-MAP Board; establishing the Achieving Better 3 Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program; and providing for unlawful acts and penalties," providing for licensing 5 boards to require addiction education. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), 10 known as the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, is amended by adding a 11 12 section to read: 13 Section 15. Licensing Boards to Require Addiction Education. 14 (a) General rule. -- Each licensing board in the Department of 15 State jurisdiction over professional licensees who are 16 dispensers or prescribers shall require: 17 (1) Individuals applying for an initial license or 18 certification issued by the licensing board, which license or certification authorizes the licensee to be a dispenser or 19

- 1 prescriber, shall submit documentation acceptable to the
- 2 licensing board of the completion of at least three hours of
- 3 <u>addiction education. The addiction education may occur as</u>
- 4 part of the applicants' professional degree educational
- 5 <u>program.</u>
- 6 (2) Dispensers and prescribers applying for the renewal
- 7 <u>of a license or certification issued by the licensing board</u>
- 8 <u>to complete at least two hours of addiction education as a</u>
- 9 portion of the total continuing education required for
- 10 biennial renewal.
- 11 (b) Consultation with department. -- Each licensing board
- 12 shall, in consultation with the department, approve the
- 13 curricula for the addiction education.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
