## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Designating a portion of State Route 100 from the intersection of Main Street and Tilghman Street in Upper Macungie Township, Lehigh County, to the intersection of Claussville Road and Kernsville Road in Lowhill Township, Lehigh County, as the Captain Mark T. Resh Memorial Highway.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Captain Mark T. Resh Memorial Highway.
9	(a) Findings The General Assembly finds and declares as
10	follows:
11	(1) Captain Mark T. Resh, of Killen, Texas, was a native
12	of Fogelsville, Lehigh County, and a 1996 graduate of
13	Northwestern Lehigh High School, where he was a member of the
14	National Honor Society, math club and student council and was
15	captain of the varsity soccer team in his senior year.
16	(2) In 2001, Captain Resh graduated from the University
17	of Pittsburgh with a degree in engineering.
18	(3) Captain Resh served as an Apache helicopter pilot

with the United States Army, 4th Battalion, 227th Aviation
 Regiment, 1st Air Cavalry Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division in
 support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

(4) On January 28, 2007, near An Najaf, Iraq, Captain
Resh placed the helicopter he was piloting in the direct line
of enemy fire so that another air crew that was under attack
could maneuver out of danger. Over the next 15 minutes, he
bravely flew in the face of intense enemy fire to support the
coalition ground forces until his aircraft was struck by
enemy fire and crashed, killing Captain Resh.

11 (5) Captain Resh was awarded the Purple Heart and the 12 Silver Star for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in 13 action.

(b) Designation.--The section of State Route 100 from the
intersection of Main Street and Tilghman Street in Upper
Macungie Township, Lehigh County, to the intersection of
Claussville Road and Kernsville Road in Lowhill Township, Lehigh
County, is hereby designated as the Captain Mark T. Resh
Memorial Highway.

20 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and 21 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to 22 traffic in both directions on the highway.

23 Section 2. Effective date.

24 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
