12	Section 1. Section 103 of the act of November 24, 1998
13	(P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, is amended by
14	adding a definition to read:
15	Section 103. Definitions.
16	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
17	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
18	context clearly indicates otherwise:

20	"Hospital." An institution with an organized medical staff

1	established for the purpose of providing to inpatients, by or
2	under the supervision of physicians, diagnostic and therapeutic
3	services for the care of individuals who are injured, disabled,
4	pregnant, diseased, sick or mentally ill or rehabilitation
5	services for the rehabilitation of individuals who are injured,
6	disabled, pregnant, diseased, sick or mentally ill. The term
7	includes facilities for the diagnosis and treatment of disorders
8	within the scope of specific medical specialties. The term
9	excludes facilities caring exclusively for the mentally ill.

11	Section 2. Section 902(2)(ii) of the act is amended to read:
12	Section 902. Establishment of basic services for victims of
13	crime.
14	The commission shall provide technical assistance to and make
15	grants to district attorneys, other criminal justice agencies or
16	victim service agencies which provide crime victims with the
17	following services:
18	* * *
19	(2) Protection services, including all of the following:
20	* * *
21	(ii) A secure waiting area during court proceedings
22	which does not require them to be in close proximity to
23	defendants and families and friends of defendants[.] <u>as</u>
24	follows:
25	(A) The secure waiting area shall be a locked
26	room within the judicial center or courthouse which
27	is exclusively used by victims, witnesses, attorneys
28	and family members of victims and witnesses. The
29	secure waiting area shall be designed to accommodate
30	such individuals.

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1	(B) The commission shall set standards of
2	construction for a secure waiting area and complete
3	annual inspections of each secure waiting area in
4	this Commonwealth to ensure compliance with the
5	standards set by the commission.
6	<u>(iii) A secure waiting area in a hospital which does</u>
7	not require them to be in close proximity to defendants
8	and families and friends of defendants as follows:
9	(A) The secure waiting area shall be a locked
10	room within a hospital which is exclusively used by
11	victims, witnesses, attorneys and family members of
12	victims. The secure waiting area shall be designed to
13	accommodate such individuals.
14	(B) The commission shall set standards of
15	construction for the secure waiting area and complete
16	annual inspections of each secure waiting area in
17	this Commonwealth to ensure compliance with the
18	standards set by the commission, in collaboration
19	with the Pennsylvania Department of Health.
