AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Senior Citizen Retirement Investment Protection Commission.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Senior
- 7 Citizen Retirement Investment Protection Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Commission." The Senior Citizen Retirement Investment
- 13 Protection Commission established under section 3.
- 14 Section 3. Senior Citizen Retirement Investment Protection
- 15 Commission.
- 16 (a) Establishment. -- The Senior Citizen Retirement Investment
- 17 Protection Commission is established.

- 1 (b) Duties. -- The commission shall meet twice annually to
- 2 develop public policies, procedures and educational tools to
- 3 help senior citizens in this Commonwealth manage their personal
- 4 retirement investments as well as protect them from unscrupulous
- 5 practitioners who may prey on senior citizens and their
- 6 retirement investments.
- 7 Section 4. Members of commission.
- 8 The commission shall be comprised of all of the following
- 9 members:
- 10 (1) The secretaries, or their designated
- 11 representatives, of the following:
- 12 (i) Department of Aging.
- 13 (ii) Department of Revenue.
- 14 (iii) Department of Banking and Securities.
- 15 (iv) Attorney General.
- 16 (2) A representative of the following:
- 17 (i) The President of the Senate.
- 18 (ii) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 19 (iii) The Majority Leader from each caucus.
- 20 (iv) The Minority Leader from each caucus.
- 21 Section 5. Reporting.
- 22 The commission shall issue a report to the General Assembly
- 23 within six months of the formation of the commission. This
- 24 report shall include potential actions that can be taken to
- 25 carry out the duties of the commission under section 3(b).
- 26 Section 6. Effective date.
- 27 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
