- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 11 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 13 "System." The Pennsylvania Amber Alert System, the Missing
- 14 Endangered Person Advisory System (MEPAS) and the Green Alert
- 15 System.
- 16 "Veteran-at-risk." A veteran, as defined in 51 Pa.C.S. §
- 17 7202 (relating to definitions), who is known to have a physical
- 18 or mental health condition that is related to the veteran's
- 19 service and is at special risk of harm or injury.
- 20 § 5602. Pennsylvania Amber Alert System.
- The Pennsylvania State Police shall establish and maintain
- 22 the Pennsylvania Amber Alert System to assist in the recovery of
- 23 abducted children through prompt notification to the general
- 24 public, appropriate law enforcement authorities and other public
- 25 agencies.
- 26 § 5603. Missing Endangered Person Advisory System (MEPAS).
- 27 <u>The Pennsylvania State Police shall establish and maintain</u>
- 28 the Missing Endangered Person Advisory System to assist in the
- 29 recovery of missing persons who are at special risk of harm or
- 30 injury, through prompt notification to the general public,

- 1 appropriate law enforcement authorities and other agencies.
- 2 § 5604. Green Alert System.
- 3 The Pennsylvania State Police shall establish and maintain
- 4 the Green Alert System to assist in the recovery of missing
- 5 veterans-at-risk through prompt notification to the general
- 6 <u>public</u>, appropriate law enforcement authorities and other
- 7 <u>agencies.</u>
- 8 § 5605. Duties of Pennsylvania State Police.
- 9 <u>The Pennsylvania State Police shall establish such protocols</u>
- 10 and procedures as are necessary for the effective operation of
- 11 each system and shall educate and inform local law enforcement
- 12 <u>agencies and the public with regard to the availability of each</u>
- 13 <u>system.</u>
- 14 § 5606. Prohibited use of alert systems.
- The transmission, broadcast or other communication of a
- 16 public alert, other than through the Pennsylvania Amber Alert
- 17 System, the Missing Endangered Person Advisory System or the
- 18 Green Alert System, intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or
- 19 negligently purporting to be made by, with or through the
- 20 authority of the Pennsylvania Amber Alert System, the Missing
- 21 Endangered Person Advisory System or the Green Alert System, is
- 22 prohibited and shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more
- 23 than \$5,000.
- 24 § 5607. Use of Missing Endangered Person Advisory System and
- 25 <u>Green Alert System.</u>
- The Pennsylvania Missing Endangered Person Advisory System
- 27 and the Green Alert System shall be operated by the Pennsylvania
- 28 State Police. Activation may be requested by law enforcement
- 29 <u>agencies when public assistance is considered expedient to the</u>
- 30 recovery of a missing individual believed to be at special risk

- 1 of harm or injury. The ability of law enforcement agencies to
- 2 independently notify or request assistance from the public shall
- 3 <u>not be impaired nor restricted in any way.</u>
- 4 § 5608. Coordination with other jurisdictions.
- 5 (a) Pennsylvania Amber Alert System. -- The Pennsylvania State
- 6 Police shall coordinate with the authorities of the various
- 7 states and the Federal Government that are responsible within
- 8 their respective jurisdictions for the recovery of abducted
- 9 <u>children to establish and execute the procedures appropriate to</u>
- 10 the effective fulfillment of its responsibilities relating to
- 11 <u>the Pennsylvania Amber Alert System.</u>
- 12 (b) Pennsylvania Missing Endangered Person Advisory System
- 13 <u>and Green Alert System. -- The Pennsylvania State Police shall</u>
- 14 coordinate with the authorities of the various states and the
- 15 Federal Government that are responsible within their respective
- 16 jurisdictions for the recovery of missing individuals believed
- 17 to be at special risk of harm or injury to establish and execute
- 18 the procedures appropriate to the effective fulfillment of its
- 19 responsibilities relating to the Pennsylvania Missing Endangered
- 20 Person Advisory System and the Green Alert System.
- 21 § 5609. Assessment of cost.
- 22 Unless the court finds that undue hardship would result, in
- 23 addition to any other cost imposed by law, a cost of \$25 shall
- 24 automatically be assessed on each person convicted, adjudicated
- 25 delinguent or granted Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition
- 26 (ARD) of the offenses named in this section. The cost shall be
- 27 <u>forwarded to the Commonwealth and used by the Pennsylvania State</u>
- 28 Police to establish and maintain the Pennsylvania Amber Alert
- 29 System and apply to the following offenses:

- 12 18 Pa.C.S. § 2910 (relating to luring a child into a
- 13 <u>motor vehicle or structure</u>).
- 14 <u>§ 5610. Immunity.</u>
- 15 (a) Media immunity. -- Owners, licensees, operators and
- 16 employees of any communication medium, including, but not
- 17 limited to, telephone, radio, television, newspaper, digital
- 18 communications networks or global communications networks, shall
- 19 be immune from civil liability for their good faith conduct
- 20 while participating in accordance with this chapter.
- 21 (b) Good Samaritan immunity. -- Any person who provides,
- 22 obtains or attempts to provide or obtain assistance for a child
- 23 who is the subject of a Pennsylvania Amber Alert System notice,
- 24 a person who is the subject of a Missing Endangered Person
- 25 Advisory or a veteran-at-risk who is the subject of a Green
- 26 Alert shall be immune from civil liability for acts or omissions
- 27 in providing or obtaining or attempting to provide or obtain
- 28 assistance except for acts or omissions intended to cause harm
- 29 and for which the law does not recognize justification or that
- 30 constitute gross negligence or willful, wanton or reckless

- 1 conduct.
- 2 Section 2. Repeals are as follows:
- 3 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
- 4 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 35
- 5 Pa.C.S. Ch. 56.
- 6 (2) The act of November 24, 2004 (P.L.1270, No.153),
- 7 referred to as the Pennsylvania Amber Alert System Law, is
- 8 repealed.
- 9 Section 3. The addition of 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 56 is a
- 10 continuation of the act of November 24, 2004 (P.L.1270, No.153),
- 11 referred to as the Pennsylvania Amber Alert System Law. The
- 12 following apply:
- 13 (1) Except as otherwise provided in 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 56,
- 14 all activities initiated under the Pennsylvania Amber Alert
- 15 System Law shall continue and remain in full force and effect
- and may be completed under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 56. Orders,
- 17 regulations, rules and decisions which were made under the
- 18 Pennsylvania Amber Alert System Law and which are in effect
- 19 on the effective date of this section shall remain in full
- force and effect until revoked, vacated or modified under 35
- 21 Pa.C.S. Ch. 56. Contracts, obligations and collective
- 22 bargaining agreements entered into under the Pennsylvania
- 23 Amber Alert System Law are not affected nor impaired by the
- repeal of the Pennsylvania Amber Alert System Law.
- 25 (2) Except as set forth in paragraph (3), any difference
- in language between 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 56 and the Pennsylvania
- 27 Amber Alert System Law is intended only to conform to the
- 28 style of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes and is not
- intended to change or affect the legislative intent, judicial
- 30 construction or administration and implementation of the

- 1 Pennsylvania Amber Alert System Law.
- 2 (3) Paragraph (2) does not apply to the addition of the
- 3 following provisions:
- 4 (i) 35 Pa.C.S. § 5601.
- 5 (ii) 35 Pa.C.S. § 5604.
- 6 (iii) 35 Pa.C.S. § 5606.
- 7 (iv) 35 Pa.C.S. § 5607.

- 10 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
