AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in criminal homicide, further 2 providing for the offense of causing or aiding suicide. 3 4 This act may be referred to as Shawn's Law. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 7 Section 1. Section 2505 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read: 9 § 2505. Causing or aiding suicide. 10 (c) Sentencing. --11 (1) The Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing, in 12 13 accordance with 42 Pa.C.S. § 2154 (relating to adoption of 14 guidelines for sentencing), shall provide for a sentence 15 enhancement within its guidelines for an offense under this 16 section when at the time of the offense the person who committed suicide or was aided or solicited to commit suicide 17

(2) As used in this subsection, the following words and 2 3 phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this paragraph unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 4 "Autism spectrum disorder." As defined under 42 Pa.C.S. 5 6 § 5992 (relating to definitions), regardless of the age of the individual. 7 "Intellectual disability." Regardless of the age of the 8 9 individual, significantly subaverage general intellectual functioning that is accompanied by significant limitations in 10 adaptive functioning in at least two of the following skill 11 12 areas: (i) Communication. 13 14 (ii) Self-care. 15 (iii) Home living. 16 (iv) Social and interpersonal skills. 17 (v) Use of community resources. (vi) Self-direction. 18 19 (vii) Functional academic skills. 20 (viii) Work. 21 (ix) Health. 22 (x) Safety. Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 23
