AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending the act of July 10, 1986 (P.L.1396, No.121), entitled "An act authorizing the use of State funds to expand a special supplemental food program for women, infants and children," further providing for definitions; and providing for Remote eWIC Reloading Pilot Program.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Section 3 of the act of July 10, 1986 (P.L.1396,
9	No.121), known as the Women's, Infants' and Children's Nutrition
10	Improvement Act, is amended by adding definitions to read:
11	Section 3. Definitions.
12	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
13	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
14	context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	* * *
16	"eWIC card." The card issued to WIC eligibles for the
17	purpose of purchasing allowed items through the WIC Program.
18	"eWIC program." The Remote eWIC Reloading Pilot Program

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3	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
4	Section 5.1. Remote eWIC Reloading Pilot Program.
5	(a) EstablishmentThe Remote eWIC Reloading Pilot Program
6	is established as a pilot program within the department.
7	(b) FundingThe department shall seek funding from the
8	General Fund to implement the eWIC program.
9	(c) NoticeUpon the initial appropriation of sufficient
10	money to implement the eWIC program, the department shall
11	transmit notice of the appropriation to the Legislative
12	Reference Bureau for publication in the next available
13	<u>Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
14	(d) EligibilityIndividuals who are deemed to be WIC
15	eligibles and who live in a county of the first class or a
16	county of the second class shall be eligible to participate in
17	the eWIC program.
18	(e) AdministrationThe department shall administer the
19	<u>eWIC program to empower WIC Program administrators in a county</u>
20	of the first class or a county of the second class to
21	collaboratively develop a system that allows WIC funds to be
22	remotely reloaded onto eWIC cards administered to WIC eligibles.
23	The following apply:
24	(1) The department shall develop a remote eWIC system to
25	allow the virtual reloading of WIC funds onto eWIC cards for
26	the purpose of granting WIC eligibles the option of not
27	reporting in person to have money reloaded onto issued eWIC
28	cards.
29	(2) The department shall:
30	(i) Promulgate regulations necessary to implement

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1	the eWIC program.
2	(ii) Seek any necessary waivers from the Federal
3	Government to implement the eWIC program.
4	(3) The eWIC program shall be operated for one year
5	following the effective date of this section.
6	(f) ReportWithin one year of the conclusion of the eWIC
7	program, the department shall publish and transmit a report to
8	the General Assembly on the eWIC program, which shall include,
9	at a minimum, the following information:
10	(1) The overall participation rate of WIC services in
11	each county that participated in the eWIC program.
12	(2) The participation and nonparticipation rates among
13	WIC eligibles in the eWIC program.
14	(3) The participation rates of other services available
15	to WIC eligibles that are offered to individuals who report
16	in person to have their eWIC cards reloaded.
17	(4) The estimated funding necessary to implement a
18	remote eWIC reloading system for all WIC eligibles residing
19	in this Commonwealth.
20	(5) Any limitations or logistical barriers that could
21	prevent WIC eligibles from participating in a remote eWIC
22	reloading system in this Commonwealth, including broadband
23	connectivity and program and technological infrastructure.
24	(6) Suggestions to address any limitations or logistical
25	barriers specified in paragraph (5), following input sought
26	by the department from public and private organizations using
27	best practices that relate to the improvement of WIC
28	services.
29	(g) ConstructionNothing in this section shall prevent WIC
30	eligibles from continuing to report in person to have WIC funds
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1 reloaded onto an issued eWIC card.

2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
