AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of aggravated assault. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2702(b) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended, subsection (a) is amended by adding a paragraph and subsection (d) is amended by adding definitions to read: § 2702. Aggravated assault. 10 11 Offense defined. -- A person is quilty of aggravated assault if he: 12 13 14 (3.1) attempts to cause or intentionally or knowingly causes bodily injury to an individual with WHOM HE KNOWS OR <--15 SHOULD KNOW HAS a physical disability, an intellectual 16

- disability or an autism spectrum disorder;

- 3 (b) Grading. -- Aggravated assault under subsection (a) (1),
- 4 (2) and (9) is a felony of the first degree. Aggravated assault
- 5 under subsection (a) (3), (3.1), (4), (5), (6), (7) and (8) is a
- 6 felony of the second degree.

- 8 (d) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 9 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 10 subsection:
- 11 <u>"Autism spectrum disorder." As defined in 42 Pa.C.S. § 5992</u>
- 12 (relating to definitions), regardless of the age of the
- 13 individual.

- "Intellectual disability." Regardless of the age of the
- 16 <u>individual</u>, <u>significantly subaverage general intellectual</u>
- 17 functioning of an individual that is accompanied by significant
- 18 limitations in adaptive functioning in at least two of the
- 19 following skill areas:
- 20 (1) Communication.
- 21 (2) Self-care.
- 22 (3) Home living.
- 23 (4) Social and interpersonal.
- 24 (5) Use of community resources.
- 25 (6) Self-direction.
- 26 (7) Functional academic.
- 27 <u>(8) Work.</u>
- 28 (9) Health and safety.
- 29 "Physical disability." As follows:
- 30 (1) A permanent or irreversible physical impairment,

- 1 whether congenital or acquired by accident, injury or
- disease, that substantially limits one or more major life
- 3 <u>activities of the individual.</u>
- 4 (2) For purposes of paragraph (1), major life activities
- 5 <u>include</u>, but are not limited to, caring for oneself,
- 6 performing manual tasks, seeing, hearing, eating, sleeping,
- 7 <u>walking, standing, lifting, bending, speaking, breathing and</u>
- 8 <u>working.</u>

- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
