1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in size, weight and load, further providing for permit for movement during course of manufacture; and, in powers of department and local authorities, further providing for power of Governor during emergency.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Section 4968(a.2)(4) and (b) of Title 75 of the
9	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
10	§ 4968. Permit for movement during course of manufacture.

12	(a.2) Specifications
13	* * *
14	(4) A combination [of vehicles] which is hauling milk to
15	or from a [manufacturer] <u>milk plant or to or from a dairy</u>
16	farm, or is traveling to a dairy farm to pick up milk, may be

permitted by the department and local authorities to move upon highways within their respective jurisdictions 24 hours a day, seven days a week, [except during inclement weather as defined in department regulations,] if [the] <u>all of the</u> <u>following apply:</u>

6 (i) The combination is identified as a licensed milk
7 hauler by a decal issued by the Pennsylvania Milk
8 Marketing Board, at a fee set by the Pennsylvania Milk
9 Marketing Board.

10 <u>(ii) The</u> gross weight does not exceed 95,000 pounds 11 and the weight of any nonsteering axle does not exceed 12 21,000 pounds. A permit may be issued for this type of 13 movement upon an interstate highway. An application to 14 the department for the movement of milk, except for raw 15 milk, shall designate the route the applicant requests to 16 use.

18 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following 19 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this 20 subsection:

"Bulk milk." The term shall mean milk, as defined in section 21 1 of the act of July 2, 1935 (P.L.589, No.210), referred to as 22 23 the Milk Sanitation Law, which is not transported in packages. 24 "Condensed milk" and "evaporated milk." The term shall mean 25 manufactured dairy products as defined in section 1 of the act of July 2, 1935 (P.L.589, No.210), referred to as the Milk 26 27 Sanitation Law, which is not transported in packages. "Dairy farm." As defined in section 1 of the act of July 2, 28 29 1935 (P.L.589, No.210), referred to as the Milk Sanitation Law.

30 "Hot box." Consists of an enclosure consisting of welded

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steel plate chained to a semitrailer with a removable lid lined 1 2 with refraction for purposes of insulation and retention of 3 heat. "Milk." 4 The term shall mean any of the following: (1)Bulk milk. 5 6 (2) Evaporated milk. 7 (3) Raw milk. 8 (4) Condensed milk. "Milk plant." As defined in section 1 of the act of July 2, 9 1935 (P.L.589, No.210), referred to as the Milk Sanitation Law. 10 11 "Raw milk." [Has the meaning given to it in] As defined in 12 section 8(a) of the act of July 2, 1935 (P.L.589, No.210), 13 referred to as the Milk Sanitation Law. 14 "Sugar." The term shall refer to granulated raw, semi-15 refined or refined sugar derived from the processing of sugar 16 cane or sugar beets, requiring further processing and not 17 intended for direct consumption or retail sale. 18 Section 2. Section 6108(a) of Title 75 is amended and the 19 section is amended by adding a subsection to read: 20 § 6108. Power of Governor during emergency. 21 (a) General rule.--[In] Except as provided under subsection_ (a.1) and section 4968(a.2)(4) (relating to permit for movement_ 22 during course of manufacture), in the event of a declared 23 24 National, State or local emergency when the Governor of this 25 Commonwealth, under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301 (relating to general <u>authority of Governor)</u>, has made a specific determination that 26 27 modification of any of the provisions of this title will aid in the alleviation of the stated emergency conditions, the Governor 28 29 shall have the power to so modify the provisions on any or all 30 highways in this Commonwealth to be effective at any or all

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1	hours of the day or night with respect to any or all types or
2	classes of vehicles. Such modifications shall be specifically
3	stated in a proclamation or executive order as provided under 35
4	Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) and shall expire at the end of the emergency
5	period. No person, unless specifically exempted by the terms of
6	the declaration of emergency or by other provisions of the
7	statute or other laws, shall violate any of the terms,
8	conditions, provisions and modifications set forth by the
9	Governor.
10	(a.1) ExceptionA vehicle or combination which is hauling
11	milk to or from a milk plant or to or from a dairy farm, or is
12	traveling to a dairy farm to pick up milk, may move upon
13	highways 24 hours a day, seven days a week, if all of the
14	following apply:
15	(1) The vehicle or combination is identified as a
16	licensed milk hauler by a decal issued by the Pennsylvania
17	Milk Marketing Board, at a fee set by the Pennsylvania Milk
18	Marketing Board.
19	(2) The gross weight does not exceed 80,000 pounds.

21	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
