- 1 Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania
- Consolidated Statutes, in COVID-19 disaster emergency,
- establishing the COVID-19 Antibody Testing Pilot Program.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Chapter 57 of Title 35 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subchapter to read:

- 14 § 5751. Definitions.
- 15 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 18 "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious

- 1 <u>disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus</u>
- 2 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,
- 3 China.
- 4 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 5 <u>"Program." The COVID-19 Antibody Testing Pilot Program</u>
- 6 <u>established under section 5752(a) (relating to establishment</u>
- 7 <u>and administration of program).</u>
- 8 § 5752. Establishment and administration of program.
- 9 (a) Establishment. -- The COVID-19 Antibody Testing Pilot
- 10 Program is established within the department.
- 11 (b) Eligibility. -- An employer in this Commonwealth that
- 12 submits a COVID-19 antibody testing plan and receives an
- 13 approval of the plan from the department under section 5753
- 14 (relating to COVID-19 antibody testing plan) shall be eliqible
- 15 to participate in the program.
- 16 <u>(c) Reimbursement.--An eligible employer under subsection</u>
- 17 (b) may submit documentation detailing the expenses incurred by
- 18 the employer for COVID-19 antibody testing to the department for
- 19 a reimbursement under the program. Upon receipt of the
- 20 documentation, the department shall reimburse the employer for
- 21 the expenses incurred by the employer for COVID-19 antibody
- 22 testing from Federal funds allocated to mitigate the spread of
- 23 COVID-19 in this Commonwealth.
- 24 § 5753. COVID-19 antibody testing plan.
- 25 (a) Submission of plan. -- No later than seven days after the
- 26 effective date of this section, an employer in this Commonwealth
- 27 seeking to participate in the program shall submit a COVID-19
- 28 antibody testing plan for employees of the employer to the
- 29 Department of Health if the employer has been subject to closure
- 30 <u>as a result of the COVID-19 disaster emergency.</u>

- 1 (b) Contents. -- The plan under subsection (a) shall include
- 2 all of the following:
- 3 (1) A review of the type and quantity of COVID-19
- 4 antibody testing kits and equipment that will be procured.
- 5 (2) A proposed timeline for the procurement of the
- 6 <u>COVID-19 antibody testing kits and equipment.</u>
- 7 (3) A proposed plan for employees to opt out of the
- 8 <u>COVID-19 antibody testing.</u>
- 9 <u>(4) A list of health care practitioners who will conduct</u>
- the COVID-19 antibody testing.
- 11 (5) A description of how the plan assists the
- 12 <u>Commonwealth's efforts to mitigate the community spread of</u>
- 13 <u>COVID-19 or provides for a calculation of community spread of</u>
- 14 <u>COVID-19</u> and herd immunity to COVID-19.
- 15 <u>(6) A description of how the plan assists the</u>
- 16 <u>Commonwealth's efforts to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 to</u>
- other employers throughout this Commonwealth.
- 18 (c) Approval. -- A plan submitted under subsection (a) shall
- 19 be deemed approved within 72 hours of receipt by the Department
- 20 of Health unless the employer submitting the plan receives a
- 21 request for additional information from the Department of
- 22 Health.
- 23 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
