AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inchoate crimes, further providing for prohibited offensive weapons. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 5 Section 1. Section 908(c) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended and subsection (b) is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 9 § 908. Prohibited offensive weapons. 10 11 (b) Exceptions. --* * * 12 13 (4) This section shall not apply to possession of an 14 accelerated trigger activator purchased or otherwise obtained 15 by the defendant prior to the effective date of this 16 paragraph.

- 1 (c) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 2 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 3 subsection:
- 4 <u>"Accelerated trigger activator." A part or combination of</u>
- 5 parts designed and intended to accelerate the rate of fire of a
- 6 <u>semi-automatic firearm to simulate the rate of fire of a</u>
- 7 machinegun.
- 8 "Firearm." Any weapon which is designed to or may readily be
- 9 converted to expel any projectile by the action of an explosive
- 10 or the frame or receiver of any such weapon.
- "Machinegun." As defined in section 201 of the Internal
- 12 <u>Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 5845).</u>
- "Offensive weapons." Any bomb, grenade, [machine gun,]
- 14 <u>machinequn</u>, <u>accelerated trigger activator</u>, sawed-off shotgun
- 15 with a barrel less than 18 inches, firearm specially made or
- 16 specially adapted for concealment or silent discharge, any
- 17 blackjack, sandbag, metal knuckles, dagger, knife, razor or
- 18 cutting instrument, the blade of which is exposed in an
- 19 automatic way by switch, push-button, spring mechanism, or
- 20 otherwise, any stun gun, stun baton, taser or other electronic
- 21 or electric weapon or other implement for the infliction of
- 22 serious bodily injury which serves no common lawful purpose.

- 24 Section 2. Within 10 days of the effective date of this
- 25 section, the Attorney General shall provide notice describing in
- 26 detail the contents of this act to the Legislative Reference
- 27 Bureau, which shall publish the notice in the Pennsylvania
- 28 Bulletin.
- 29 Section 3. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 30 (1) Section 2 of this act shall take effect immediately.

- 1 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect 30 days
- 2 after publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of the notice
- 3 under section 2.
