AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), entitled "An act relating to the right to practice medicine and surgery and the right to practice medically related acts; reestablishing the State Board of Medical Education and 4 Licensure as the State Board of Medicine and providing for its composition, powers and duties; providing for the 7 issuance of licenses and certificates and the suspension and revocation of licenses and certificates; provided penalties; 8 and making repeals," further providing for State Board of 9 Medicine and providing for behavior analyst. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 3(a) and (b) of the act of December 20,
- 14 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical Practice Act of
- 15 1985, are amended to read:
- 16 Section 3. State Board of Medicine.
- 17 (a) Establishment. -- The State Board of Medicine shall
- 18 consist of the commissioner or his designee, the Secretary of
- 19 Health or his designee, two members appointed by the Governor
- 20 who shall be persons representing the public at large and seven

- 1 members appointed by the Governor, six of whom shall be medical
- 2 doctors with unrestricted licenses to practice medicine and
- 3 surgery in this Commonwealth for five years immediately
- 4 preceding their appointment and one who shall be a nurse
- 5 midwife, physician assistant, certified registered nurse
- 6 practitioner, respiratory therapist, licensed athletic trainer
- 7 [or], perfusionist or <u>behavior analyst</u> licensed or certified
- 8 under the laws of this Commonwealth. All professional and public
- 9 members of the board shall be appointed by the Governor, with
- 10 the advice and consent of a majority of the members elected to
- 11 the Senate.
- 12 (b) Terms of office. -- The term of each professional and
- 13 public member of the board shall be four years or until his or
- 14 her successor has been appointed and qualified, but not longer
- 15 than six months beyond the four-year period. In the event that
- 16 any of said members shall die or resign or otherwise become
- 17 disqualified during his or her term, a successor shall be
- 18 appointed in the same way and with the same qualifications and
- 19 shall hold office for the unexpired term. No member shall be
- 20 eligible for appointment to serve more than two consecutive
- 21 terms. The Governor shall assure that nurse midwives, physician
- 22 assistants, certified registered nurse practitioners,
- 23 perfusionists [and], respiratory therapists and behavior
- 24 <u>analysts</u> are appointed to four-year terms on a rotating basis so
- 25 that, of every four appointments to a four-year term, one is a
- 26 nurse midwife, one is a physician assistant, one is a certified
- 27 registered nurse practitioner [and] one is a respiratory
- 28 therapist and one is a behavior analyst.

- 30 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

- 1 Section 13.7. Behavior analyst.
- 2 (a) Behavior analyst licensure. -- An applicant for licensure
- 3 as a behavior analyst under this section shall meet all of the
- 4 <u>following requirements:</u>
- 5 (1) The applicant shall hold, as verified by the board,
- 6 <u>a current certification from a certifying entity as a board-</u>
- 7 <u>certified behavior analyst or board-certified behavior</u>
- 8 analyst-doctoral.
- 9 (2) The applicant shall have completed the education,
- 10 supervised fieldwork and examination requirements as
- 11 <u>specified by a certifying entity and adopted by the board.</u>
- 12 (3) The applicant shall have completed the academic
- requirements of an accredited graduate degree program.
- 14 (4) The applicant shall have completed, as part of, or
- in addition to, the educational requirements specified under
- this subsection, a minimum number of hours of verified
- 17 behavior analytic graduate coursework as determined by a
- 18 <u>certifying entity.</u>
- 19 (5) The applicant shall have passed the examination
- developed by a certifying entity that represents a
- 21 <u>psychometrically and legally validated professional</u>
- 22 <u>examination in applied behavior analysis.</u>
- 23 (b) Assistant behavior analyst licensure. -- An applicant for
- 24 licensure as an assistant behavior analyst under this section
- 25 shall meet all of the following requirements:
- 26 (1) The applicant shall hold, as verified by the board,
- 27 <u>a current certification from a certifying entity as a board-</u>
- 28 certified assistant behavior analyst.
- 29 <u>(2) The applicant shall have completed the education,</u>
- 30 supervised fieldwork and examination requirements as

- 1 specified by a certifying entity and adopted by the board.
- 2 (3) The applicant shall have completed the academic
- 3 requirements of an accredited undergraduate degree program.
- 4 (4) The applicant shall have completed, as part of, or
- 5 <u>in addition to, the educational requirements specified under</u>
- 6 this subsection, a minimum number of hours of verified
- 7 <u>behavior analytic undergraduate coursework as determined by a</u>
- 8 <u>certifying entity.</u>
- 9 <u>(5) The applicant shall have passed the examination</u>
- developed by a certifying entity that represents a
- 11 <u>psychometrically and legally validated professional</u>
- 12 <u>examination in applied behavior analysis.</u>
- (c) Use of title. -- Except as provided under subsection (d),
- 14 <u>an individual may not practice or hold oneself out as being</u>
- 15 qualified to practice applied behavior analysis in this
- 16 Commonwealth unless the individual holds a current, unsuspended,
- 17 unrevoked license issued by the board.
- 18 (d) Exceptions. -- Nothing in this section shall be construed
- 19 as prohibiting or restricting the practice of any of the
- 20 following:
- 21 (1) An individual who is licensed to practice psychology
- in this Commonwealth if the applied behavior analysis
- 23 services provided by the licensed psychologist are practiced
- 24 within the psychologist's code of ethics as determined by
- 25 the State Board of Psychology and the licensed psychologist
- does not represent himself or herself as a licensed behavior
- 27 <u>analyst unless licensed under this section.</u>
- 28 (2) An individual who is licensed to practice a
- 29 profession other than applied behavior analysis in this
- 30 Commonwealth and an individual supervised by an individual

1	who is licensed to practice a profession other than applied
2	behavior analysis in this Commonwealth, if applied behavior
3	analysis is in the individual's statutory or regulated scope
4	of practice and the individual's scope of training and
5	competence. An individual who is licensed to practice a
6	profession other than applied behavior analysis in this
7	Commonwealth may not represent himself or herself as a
8	licensed behavior analyst unless licensed under this section.
9	(3) A behavior technician who delivers applied behavior
10	analysis services under the authority and direction of a
11	licensed behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior
12	analyst or other professional licensed in this Commonwealth
13	who is approved by a certifying entity to supervise
14	credentialed behavior technicians in accordance with the
15	certifying entity's current supervision requirements. A
16	behavior technician under this paragraph may not represent
17	himself or herself as a licensed behavior analyst and shall
18	use a title that indicates the behavior technician's
19	nonlicensed status.
20	(4) A family member who delivers applied behavior
21	analysis services under the authority and direction of a
22	licensed behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior
23	analyst. A family member under this paragraph may not
24	represent himself or herself as a licensed behavior analyst
25	and shall use a title that indicates the family member's
26	nonlicensed status.
27	(5) A behavior analyst who practices with nonhumans,
28	including applied animal behaviorists and animal trainers. A
29	behavior analyst under this paragraph may use the title

"behavior analyst," but may not represent himself or herself

1 as a licensed behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior
2 analyst unless licensed under this section.

(6) An individual who provides general applied behavior analysis services to an organization if the services are for the benefit of the organization and do not involve direct services to individuals. An individual under this paragraph may use the title "behavior analyst," but may not represent himself or herself as a licensed behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior analyst unless licensed under this section.

(7) A matriculated college or university student or postdoctoral fellow whose applied behavior analysis activities are part of a defined program of study, course, practicum, internship or fellowship and are directly supervised by a licensed behavior analyst in this

Commonwealth or a qualified faculty member. A matriculated college or university student or postdoctoral fellow under this paragraph may not represent himself or herself as a licensed behavior analyst and shall use a title that clearly indicates a trainee status.

experiential training in applied behavior analysis consistent with a certifying entity's requirements if the training is supervised by a licensed behavior analyst or licensed psychologist in this Commonwealth who is approved by the certifying entity to provide the supervision. An unlicensed individual under this paragraph may not represent himself or herself as a licensed behavior analyst and shall use a title that clearly indicates a trainee status.

(9) An individual who teaches behavior analysis or

Τ	conducts behavior-analytic research at an accredited college
2	or university in this Commonwealth if the activities do not
3	involve the direct delivery of applied behavior analysis
4	services beyond the typical parameters of applied research.
5	An individual under this paragraph may use the title
6	"behavior analyst," but may not represent himself or herself
7	as a licensed behavior analyst or a licensed assistant
8	behavior analyst unless licensed under this section.
9	(10) An individual employed or contracted by an entity
0	regulated by the Department of Education who delivers applied
1	behavior analysis services to an individual served by the
2	same entity. An individual under this paragraph may not:
13	(i) represent himself or herself as a licensed
_4	behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior analyst
.5	unless licensed under this section;
_6	(ii) offer applied behavior analysis services for an
_7	entity other than the entity regulated by the Department
8	of Education; or
9	(iii) accept remuneration for providing applied
20	behavior analysis services other than the remuneration
21	the individual receives from the entity regulated by the
22	Department of Education unless licensed under this
23	section.
24	(11) An individual licensed to practice occupational
25	therapy. Nothing in this section shall be construed to
26	prohibit, limit, include or affect the practice of
27	occupational therapy.
28	(12) A nonresident of this Commonwealth who is licensed
29	to practice applied behavior analysis independently under the
30	laws of another state, the District of Columbia or a

Τ.	territory or the united states that has ricensure
2	requirements substantially equal to the requirements under
3	this section as determined by the board and practices in this
4	Commonwealth for no more than 15 days in a calendar year.
5	(13) A nonresident of this Commonwealth who is certified
6	by a certifying entity to practice applied behavior analysis
7	independently under the laws of another state, the District
8	of Columbia or a territory of the United States and practices
9	in this Commonwealth for no more than 15 days in a calendar
10	<u>year.</u>
11	(e) Application requirements An applicant for licensure as
12	a behavior analyst or an assistant behavior analyst under this
13	section shall submit an application and requisite fees as
14	provided by the board. The application shall include evidence of
15	all of the following for verification by the board:
16	(1) A criminal background check conducted by the
17	Pennsylvania State Police, a State-approved child abuse
18	clearance and a Federal Bureau of Investigation
19	fingerprint-based record check in accordance with applicable
20	Federal law and 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to child
21	protective services) conducted through the Department of
22	Education or Department of Human Services.
23	(2) Professional liability insurance that meets all of
24	the following criteria:
25	(i) The professional liability insurance is
26	effective by the next biennial period for license renewal
27	after the effective date of this paragraph. The board
28	shall accept any of the following from an applicant as
29	satisfactory evidence of professional insurance coverage
30	under this paragraph:

Τ	(A) Self-insurance.
2	(B) Individually purchased professional
3	<pre>liability insurance.</pre>
4	(C) Professional liability insurance coverage
5	provided by the applicant's employer or any similar
6	type of coverage acceptable to the board.
7	(ii) The level of professional liability insurance
8	coverage is the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per
9	occurrence or claim made.
10	(3) For a licensed behavior analyst applicant, current
11	certification as a board-certified behavior analyst or board-
12	certified behavior analyst-doctoral with a certifying entity.
13	(4) For a licensed assistant behavior analyst applicant,
14	current certification as a board-certified assistant behavior
15	analyst with a certifying entity and a letter from a licensed
16	behavior analyst in this Commonwealth who is approved by a
17	certifying entity to supervise board-certified assistant
18	behavior analysts stating that the licensed behavior analyst
19	is supervising the applicant in accordance with the
20	certifying entity's current requirements. The board shall
21	verify with the certifying entity that the licensed behavior
22	analyst has the necessary approval to supervise the applicant
23	under this paragraph.
24	(5) Good moral character as determined by the board and
25	as defined by the profession's code of ethics and other
26	conduct standards.
27	(6) If applicable, completion of the child abuse
28	recognition and continuing education required under
29	subsection (k).
30	(f) Licensure restrictions The board may not grant a

Τ	<u>license to an applicant as a benavior analyst or an assistant</u>
2	behavior analyst under this section if the applicant has been:
3	(1) convicted of a felony offense under section
4	635.2(g)(3) of the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284),
5	known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, unless:
6	(i) at least ten years has elapsed from the date of
7	<pre>conviction;</pre>
8	(ii) the applicant has satisfactorily demonstrated
9	to the board that the applicant has made significant
10	progress in personal rehabilitation since the conviction;
11	<u>and</u>
12	(iii) the applicant has satisfactorily demonstrated
13	to the board that licensure of the applicant will not
14	create a substantial risk of harm to the health and
15	safety of the applicant's patients, the public or
16	additional criminal violations;
17	(2) has been convicted of, entered a plea of nolo
18	contendere to or has been adjudicated delinquent of a crime
19	for which the applicant has been required to register under
20	42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 97 Subch. H (relating to registration of
21	sexual offenders) without regard to the time elapsed since
22	the date of the conviction, plea or adjudication or the
23	length of the registration required; or
24	(3) has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct as
25	defined by rules established by the board or violating the
26	<pre>profession's code of ethics or other conduct standards</pre>
27	established by a certifying entity.
28	(g) Temporary licenses
29	(1) The board may grant a temporary license under this
30	subsection to a nonresident who engages in the practice of

1	<u>applied behavior analysis in this Commonwealth for no more</u>
2	than three months in a calendar year if the individual meets
3	any of the following requirements:
4	(i) The individual is licensed to practice applied
5	behavior analysis independently under the laws of
6	another state, the District of Columbia or a territory of
7	the United States that has licensure requirements
8	substantially equal to the requirements under this
9	section.
10	(ii) The individual is certified by a certifying
11	entity to practice applied behavior analysis
12	independently, as verified by the board with the
13	licensing entity in the out-of-State jurisdiction or the
14	certifying entity.
15	(2) An applicant for a temporary license under this
16	subsection shall submit an application and a fee as
17	determined by the board and evidence that the applicant's
18	practice in this Commonwealth is time-limited and the
19	individual holds valid liability insurance.
20	(h) Licensure by endorsement The board may issue a license
21	under this subsection by endorsement to an individual who is
22	currently licensed as a behavior analyst or an assistant
23	behavior analyst in good standing under the laws of another
24	state, the District of Columbia or a territory of the United
25	States that has licensure requirements substantially equal to
26	the requirements under this section. An applicant for licensure
27	under this subsection shall have the applicant's current license
28	verified by the board and comply with other requirements under
29	this section.
30	(i) Supervision An individual who is currently licensed as

- 1 a behavior analyst or an assistant behavior analyst in good
- 2 standing under the laws of another state, the District of
- 3 Columbia or a territory of the United States who has applied for
- 4 <u>a temporary license or a license by endorsement under subsection</u>
- 5 (g) or (h) may practice applied behavior analysis in this
- 6 Commonwealth under the supervision of an individual fully
- 7 <u>licensed in this Commonwealth while awaiting approval of an</u>
- 8 application submitted to the board under subsection (e).
- 9 (j) Renewal or expiration. -- A license issued under this
- 10 section shall be subject to biennial renewal. Before the
- 11 expiration of a license under this section, the board may issue
- 12 <u>a license renewal upon the submission of all of the following:</u>
- 13 <u>(1) An application for renewal as provided by the board.</u>
- 14 (2) A board verification of current certification in
- 15 good standing by a certifying entity, which signifies that
- the applicant for renewal has met all requirements for
- 17 maintaining certification at the appropriate level.
- 18 (3) Payment of the renewal fee imposed by the board.
- 19 <u>(4) Evidence of having active professional liability</u>
- insurance as specified under subsection (e) (2).
- 21 (5) A record of completion of a State-approved criminal
- 22 background check, a State-approved child abuse clearance and
- 23 <u>a Federal Bureau of Investigation fingerprint-based record</u>
- 24 check as specified under subsection (e) (1).
- 25 (6) If applicable, updated records of the completion of
- the child abuse recognition and continuing education required
- 27 under subsection (k).
- 28 (7) Evidence of having completed the continuing
- 29 education required by a certifying entity and maintained
- national certification by completing recertifying mechanisms

- 1 <u>available to the practice of applied behavior analysis.</u>
- 2 (k) Child abuse recognition. --
- 3 (1) An applicant for a license under this section shall
- 4 <u>report suspected child abuse as specified under 23 Pa.C.S.</u>
- 5 <u>Ch. 63 and shall complete at least three hours of approved</u>
- 6 <u>child abuse recognition and continuing education as specified</u>
- 7 under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3).
- 8 (2) A license holder subject to paragraph (2) who
- 9 <u>applies for the renewal of the license under subsection (j)</u>
- 10 shall complete at least two hours of approved child abuse
- 11 recognition and reporting continuing education as provided
- 12 under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3).
- (1) Liability insurance. -- An individual licensed under this
- 14 <u>section shall obtain and maintain professional liability</u>
- 15 <u>insurance as specified under subsection (e)(2). A license holder</u>
- 16 shall notify the board within 30 days of the license holder's
- 17 failure to maintain professional liability insurance as
- 18 specified under subsection (e) (2). A license holder who fails to
- 19 notify the board under this subsection shall be subject to a
- 20 disciplinary action under subsection (n) and the license
- 21 holder's license shall automatically be suspended upon failure
- 22 to maintain professional liability insurance as specified under
- 23 <u>subsection (e)(2). An individual's license shall not be restored</u>
- 24 until the individual submits satisfactory evidence to the board
- 25 that the individual has obtained professional liability
- 26 <u>insurance as specified under subsection (e)(2).</u>
- 27 (m) Violations. -- Any of the following shall constitute a
- 28 violation under this section:
- 29 <u>(1) Except as provided under subsection (d), the</u>
- 30 unlicensed practice of applied behavior analysis in this

<u>Commonwealth.</u>
(2) Holding oneself out to be a licensed behavior
analyst or licensed assistant behavior analyst without
holding a license under this section.
(3) Except as provided under subsection (d), holding
oneself out as a licensed behavior analyst or a substantially
similar profession without holding a license under this
section.
(n) Disciplinary actions
(1) The board may refuse to issue or renew and may
suspend or revoke a license under this section of an
applicant or license holder by a vote of at least a majority
of the members of the board for any of the following reasons:
(i) Ineligibility for licensure, including,
ineligibility due to a failure to maintain active
certification by a certifying entity or falsification of
documentation submitted for licensure.
(ii) Aiding and abetting an unlicensed individual to
directly or indirectly perform activities requiring a
license for the practice of behavior analysis.
(iii) Engaging in professional misconduct,
incompetence, gross negligence or manifest incapacity in
the practice of behavior analysis.
(iv) Engaging in the practice of behavior analysis
while impaired by alcohol or drugs.
(v) Engaging in conduct or practice contrary to a
certifying entity's current professional and ethical
standards.
(vi) Failing to comply with, observe or adhere to a
Federal or State law in a manner that causes the board to

1	determine that the applicant or license holder is unfit
2	to hold a license.
3	(vii) Having a license revoked or suspended or other
4	subject to disciplinary action by a Federal or State
5	agency for any reason that is provided by applicable
6	Federal or State law or under this section.
7	(viii) Having been convicted of a crime directly
8	related to the qualifications, functions or duties of the
9	practice of behavior analysis.
10	(ix) Failing to report in writing to the board a
11	disciplinary decision issued against the applicant or
12	license holder in an out-of-State jurisdiction within 30
13	days of the disciplinary decision.
14	(x) Failing to report in writing to the board
15	revocation or disciplinary action by a certifying entity
16	within 15 days of the action.
17	(xi) Employing, whether gratuitously or for pay, an
18	individual not licensed under this section to perform the
19	functions or duties of the practice of behavior analysis.
20	(2) When the board, after notice of a violation under
21	paragraph (1) and an opportunity for a hearing, finds that an
22	applicant or a license holder under this section has
23	committed a violation under paragraph (2), the board may take
24	any of the following actions:
25	(i) Administer a public reprimand.
26	(ii) Mandate specific continuing education.
27	(iii) Deny, revoke, suspend, limit or otherwise
28	restrict a license as determined by the board.
29	(iv) Suspend enforcement of the board's finding and
30	place a license holder on probation with the right to

Τ	vacate the propationary order for noncompliance.
2	(v) Restore or reissue, at the board's discretion, a
3	suspended license to practice applied behavior analysis
4	and impose an alternative disciplinary or corrective
5	measure.
6	(vi) Issue a notice to a certifying entity.
7	(vii) Impose a fine of not more than \$2,500.
8	(3) An individual aggrieved by a final order of the
9	board under paragraph (2) may appeal to the Bureau of
10	Professional and Occupational Affairs.
11	(o) Reinstatement of license
12	(1) Within three years, the board may reinstate a
13	license under this section that has lapsed upon the
14	completion of the license renewal requirements under
15	subsection (j), including payment of the required renewal fee
16	under subsection (j)(3) and a reinstatement fee established
17	by the board.
18	(2) The board may reinstate a license under this section
19	that has been revoked or suspended if the board determines
20	that the license holder is currently certified in good
21	standing at the appropriate level by a certifying entity. As
22	a condition of reinstatement, the board may impose reasonable
23	restrictions under which the license holder may engage in the
24	practice of applied behavior analysis.
25	(p) Committee
26	(1) The Behavior Analyst Advisory Committee is
27	established to assist the board in promulgating regulations
28	for the practice of applied behavior analysis and assist the
29	board regarding the licensure standards under this section
30	when a behavior analyst is not serving on the board. The

1	board shall appoint the following members to committee:
2	(i) A board-certified behavior analyst-doctoral who
3	is eligible for licensure under this section and has a
4	minimum of five years' post-doctoral experience
5	designing, overseeing or delivering applied behavior
6	analysis services.
7	(ii) One or more board-certified behavior analysts
8	who are eligible for licensure under this section and
9	have a minimum of five years' experience designing,
10	overseeing or delivering applied behavior analysis
11	services.
12	(iii) A board-certified behavior analyst or
13	assistant behavior analyst who is eligible for licensure
14	under this section and has a minimum of five years'
15	experience in or experience assisting with the design,
16	oversight or delivery of applied behavior analysis
17	services.
18	(2) A member of the committee may not be a Federal or
19	State employee, hold a Federal or State contract or hold an
20	appointed position.
21	(3) A member of the committee shall be a resident of
22	this Commonwealth and be a member of a national or State
23	nonprofit organization representing behavior analysts as
24	defined under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
25	of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)).
26	(q) Regulations The board shall promulgate regulations
27	necessary to implement this section.
28	(r) Definitions As used in this section, the following
29	words and phrases shall have the meaning given to them in this
30	<pre>subsection:</pre>

- 1 <u>"Assistant behavior analyst." An individual who is certified</u>
- 2 by a certifying entity as a board-certified assistant behavior
- 3 analyst and licensed under this section to assist in the
- 4 practice of behavior analysis under the supervision of a
- 5 <u>licensed behavior analyst who is approved by a certifying entity</u>
- 6 to supervise assistant behavior analysts. An individual who
- 7 meets the criteria specified in this definition may be employed
- 8 or supervised by another professional licensed in this
- 9 <u>Commonwealth whose statutory or regulated scope of practice</u>
- 10 includes applied behavior analysis if the licensed professional
- 11 practices within the boundaries of the profession's code of
- 12 ethics and the licensed professional is approved by a certifying
- 13 <u>entity to supervise assistant behavior analysts.</u>
- 14 <u>"Behavior analyst." An individual who is certified by a</u>
- 15 certifying entity as a board-certified behavior analyst or
- 16 board-certified behavior analyst-doctoral and is licensed under
- 17 this section to engage in the independent practice of applied
- 18 behavior analysis.
- 19 "Behavior technician." A paraprofessional who practices
- 20 under the close, ongoing supervision and direction of a licensed
- 21 professional, delivers services as assigned by the supervisor
- 22 responsible for the individual's work and does not design
- 23 assessment or intervention plans or procedures. A
- 24 paraprofessional who meets the criteria specified in this
- 25 definition may be employed or supervised by another professional
- 26 licensed in this Commonwealth if the applied behavior analysis
- 27 <u>services delivered by the individual are supervised by a</u>
- 28 licensed behavior analyst, licensed assistant behavior analyst
- 29 <u>or other professional licensed in this Commonwealth whose</u>
- 30 legislated or statutory scope of practice includes applied

- 1 behavior analysis and who is practicing within the boundaries of
- 2 the profession's code of ethics.
- 3 "Certifying entity." A nonprofit organization approved by
- 4 the board that provides programs to credential professional
- 5 practitioners of applied behavior analysis that are accredited
- 6 by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies or the
- 7 American National Standards Institute.
- 8 "Committee." The Behavior Analyst Advisory Committee
- 9 <u>established under subsection (p)(1).</u>
- 10 "Practice of applied behavior analysis." As follows:
- 11 (1) The design, implementation and evaluation of
- 12 <u>instructional and environmental modifications with an</u>
- individual to produce socially significant improvements in
- human behavior or prevent the loss of an attained skill or
- 15 function.
- 16 (2) The term includes all of the following:
- 17 (i) The empirical identification of functional
- 18 relations between behavior and environmental factors,
- 19 known as functional assessment and analysis.
- 20 (ii) Interventions based on scientific research and
- 21 <u>direct and indirect observation and measurement of</u>
- behavior and environment.
- 23 (iii) The utilization of contextual factors,
- 24 motivating operations, antecedent stimuli, positive
- 25 reinforcement and other procedures to help individuals
- develop new behaviors, increase or decrease existing
- 27 <u>behaviors and emit behaviors under specific environmental</u>
- conditions.
- 29 (3) The term does not include the diagnosis of
- disorders, psychological testing, psychotherapy, cognitive

- 1 therapy, psychoanalysis and counseling.
- 2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
