AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for capital investment needs.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
11	article to read:
12	<u>ARTICLE XXVI-L</u>
13	CAPITAL INVESTMENT NEEDS
14	Section 2601-L. Definitions.
15	The following words and phrases when used in this article
16	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
17	context clearly indicates otherwise:
18	"COVID-19." The novel coronavirus as identified in the

1	<u>March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and</u>
2	any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.
3	"Department." The Department of Education of the
4	Commonwealth.
5	"School entity." A public school, including a charter school
6	or cyber charter school, private school, nonpublic school,
7	intermediate unit or area career and technical school operating
8	within this Commonwealth.
9	Section 2602-L. Reporting requirements.
10	(a) AuthorizationThe department shall conduct a one-time
11	survey of each school entity to determine the amount of current
12	capital investment needs of the school entity. The survey shall:
13	(1) Include all needs related to physical, digital,
14	sanitary and curricular infrastructure of the school entity.
15	(2) Include an inventory of all delayed or deferred
16	capital projects of the school entity.
17	(3) Be based on the best available information provided
18	by the school entity.
19	(b) ReportA report by a school entity in response to a
20	survey described in subsection (a) shall be provided to the
21	department and shall include:
22	(1) A full inventory of all infrastructure costs
23	currently delayed, deferred or predicted through the 2025-
24	2026 school year.
25	(2) The age and model of any current physical
26	infrastructure replaced since January 2020 or needing to be
27	replaced, in addition to other physical infrastructure
28	details, including the full price of purchase or lease of the
29	infrastructure and the cost of installation of the
30	infrastructure.

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1	(3) The full cost or best estimation of the full cost of
2	other educational infrastructure required for the purposes of
3	continuing education since January 2020, including laptops,
4	webcams, additional servers, curriculum adaptation or fees
5	for services for curriculum adaptation as a result of the
6	<u>COVID-19 pandemic.</u>
7	(4) The full cost or best estimation of the full cost of
8	sanitation equipment, sanitation measures and sanitation
9	services purchased by the school entity, including personal
10	protective equipment, classroom and office sanitizers or
11	other sanitation needs.
12	(5) Major required equipment costing more than \$1,000
13	since January 2020, which has already been purchased or
14	leased, including the costs paid to purchase or lease the
15	<u>equipment.</u>
16	(6) Equipment or infrastructure that has not yet been
17	purchased but that the school entity believes will be needed
18	to provide a safe, effective and sanitary school environment
19	through the end of the 2025-2026 school year.
20	Section 2603-L. Report to General Assembly.
21	The department shall consolidate the survey results under
22	this article and issue to the General Assembly a detailed report
23	of all current and predicted capital investment and
24	infrastructure needs of school entities throughout this
25	Commonwealth, including all capital costs resulting from the
26	COVID-19 pandemic. The report shall:
27	(1) Specify the full actual cost or best estimation of
28	the full costs of the capital investment needs required for
29	all the school entities in this Commonwealth.
30	(2) Delineate between actual incurred costs that school

1	entities have already paid, in addition to predicted capital	
2	costs for school entities, through the 2025-2026 school year.	
3	Section 2604-L. Temporary regulations.	
4	(a) PromulgationNotwithstanding any other provision of	
5	law, to facilitate the prompt implementation of this article,	
6	the department shall promulgate temporary regulations that shall	
7	expire not later than two years after the publication of the	
8	temporary regulations in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The	
9	promulgated temporary regulations shall not be subject to any of	
10	the following:	
11	(1) Section 612 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,	
12	No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.	
13	(2) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of	
14	July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the	
15	Commonwealth Documents Law.	
16	(3) Sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the act of October	
17	15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth	
18	<u>Attorneys Act.</u>	
19	(4) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as	
20	the Regulatory Review Act.	
21	(b) ExpirationThe authority of the department to	
22	promulgate temporary regulations under subsection (a) shall	
23	expire six months after the effective date of this section.	
24	Regulations adopted after this period shall be promulgated as	
25	provided by law.	
26	(c) PublicationThe department shall transmit notice of	
27	the temporary regulations under this section to the Legislative	
28	Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin no	
29	later than 90 days after the effective date of this section.	
30	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.	
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
