## AN ACT

| 7                | Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated   |
| 8                | Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:   |
| 9                | <u>§ 6322. Access of minors to dextromethorphan.</u>   |
| 10               | (a) Offenses defined   |
| 11               | (1) A person commits a summary offense if he knowingly   |
| 12               | sells or purchases with the intent to sell a finished drug   |
| 13               | product containing any quantity of dextromethorphan to a   |
| 14               | person who is less than 18 years of age.   |
| 15               | (2) A person commits a summary offense if he falsely   |
| 16               | represents himself to be 18 years of age or older to another   |
| 17               | for the purpose of procuring a finished drug product   |
| 18               | containing any quantity of dextromethorphan.   |

| 1  | (b) Proof of age requirementsA person making a retail                  |
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| 2  | sale of a finished drug product containing any quantity of             |
| 3  | dextromethorphan shall obtain proof of age from the purchaser          |
| 4  | before completing the sale, unless the purchaser's outward             |
| 5  | appearance is such that a person would reasonably presume the          |
| 6  | purchaser to be at least 25 years of age.                              |
| 7  | (c) PenaltyA person who is convicted of violating                      |
| 8  | subsection (a) shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than       |
| 9  | <u>\$250 nor more than \$500 for the first violation and a fine of</u> |
| 10 | <u>\$500 for each subsequent violation.</u>                            |
| 11 | (d) ExceptionThis section does not apply to a medication               |
| 12 | containing dextromethorphan that is sold pursuant to a valid           |
| 13 | prescription.  |
| 14 | (e) PreemptionThis section shall be construed to preempt               |
| 15 | any ordinance regulating the sale, distribution, receipt or            |
| 16 | possession of dextromethorphan enacted by any political                |
| 17 | subdivision, and dextromethorphan is not subject to further            |
| 18 | regulation by political subdivisions.                                  |
| 19 | (f) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following                  |
| 20 | words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this        |
| 21 | subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:             |
| 22 | "Finished drug product." A drug legally marketed under the             |
| 23 | Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (52 Stat. 1040, 21 U.S.C. §       |
| 24 | 321 et seq.) that is in finished dosage form.                          |
| 25 | "Proof of age." A document issued by a governmental agency             |
| 26 | that contains a description or photograph of a person and gives        |
| 27 | the person's date of birth, including a passport, military             |
| 28 | identification card or driver's license.                               |
| 29 | Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.                      |

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
