5	IS NOT COMPLIANT WITH THE REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED UPON

13	AN INDIVIDUAL BEING DEEMED INELIGIBLE FOR ASSISTANCE BY THIS
14	SECTION.

15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
