AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in school health services, providing
- for menstrual hygiene products.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1426. Menstrual Hygiene Products. -- (a) Each school
- 13 <u>serving any student in grades six through twelve shall make</u>
- 14 menstrual hygiene products available at no cost in each bathroom
- 15 <u>in the school building.</u>
- 16 (b) The following menstrual hygiene products shall be made
- 17 available under subsection (a):
- 18 (1) A choice of at least two sizes or absorbencies of

- 1 <u>sanitary pads that are capable of absorbing at least five</u>
- 2 <u>milliliters of liquid.</u>
- 3 (2) A choice of at least two sizes of tampons that are
- 4 <u>capable of absorbing at least four milliliters of liquid.</u>
- 5 (c) (1) In order to facilitate the prompt implementation of
- 6 this section, regulations promulgated by the department shall be
- 7 <u>deemed temporary regulations and shall expire no later than two</u>
- 8 years following the publication of temporary regulations. The
- 9 <u>department may promulgate temporary regulations not subject to:</u>
- 10 (i) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of July
- 11 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the Commonwealth
- 12 <u>Documents Law.</u>
- 13 (ii) Section 204(b) of the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950,
- 14 No.164), known as the "Commonwealth Attorneys Act."
- 15 (iii) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as
- 16 the "Regulatory Review Act."
- 17 (2) The authority provided to the department to adopt
- 18 temporary regulations under this subsection shall expire no
- 19 later than two years following the publication of temporary
- 20 regulations. Regulations adopted after this period shall be
- 21 promulgated as provided by law.
- 22 (d) As used in this section:
- 23 "Charter school" means a school established under Article
- 24 XVII-A.
- 25 "School" means a school within a school district, an
- 26 intermediate unit, an area career and technical school or a
- 27 charter school.
- 28 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 29 (1) This section and the addition of section 1426(c) of
- 30 the act shall take effect immediately.

- 1 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 120
- 2 days.
